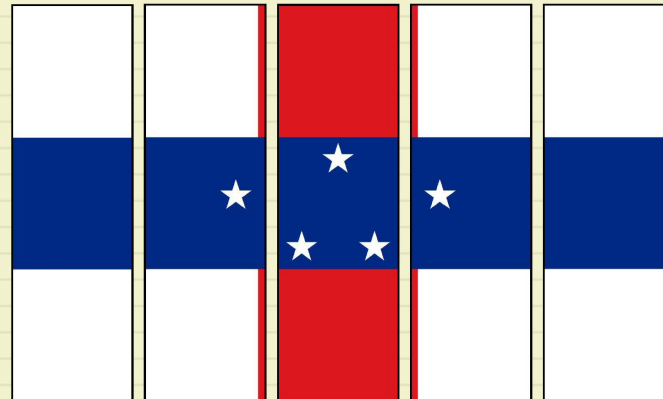

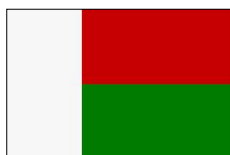
**3V** - 9A3A, I8LWL, IK7JWX, IK7UXW, IZ7ATN and local operators from 3V8ST, 3V8SA and 3V8SQ expect to be active on all bands and modes as TS7TI/p from Plane Island (AF-091) and Kuriat Island (AF-092) between 14 and 23 September. QSL via I8LWL ([www.i8lwl.it](http://www.i8lwl.it)) [TNX IK7JWX]

**4J** - 4J5T, 4J8VHF, 4K4K and YL7A will be active as 4K3FF from Turyanchay Nature Reserve between 20 September and 3 October. They plan to operate CW, SSB and RTTY on 20 and 40 metres. QSL via YL7A. [TNX 4J5T]

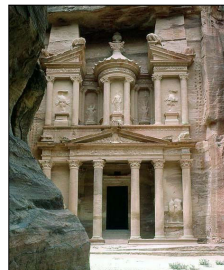

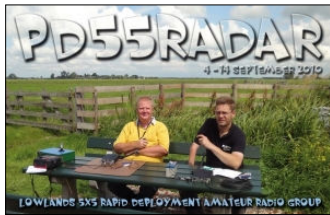

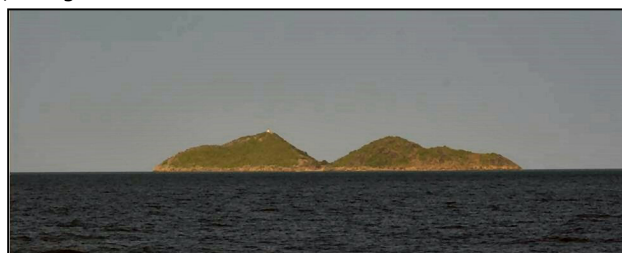

## 10-10-10 The Dissolution of the Netherlands Antilles

● On 9 September "delegations from the Netherlands Antilles signed a declaration in The Hague reforming the status of these five former Dutch island colonies in the Caribbean", Radio Netherlands Worldwide reports. "As of 10 October 2010, the Dutch Antilles will cease to exist as a country. Curacao and Sint Maarten will become separate countries within the Kingdom of the Netherlands, while Bonaire, Saba and Sint Eustatius will become special Dutch municipalities".

● On 23 September the ARRL Awards Committee issued the following statement on the dissolution of the Netherlands Antilles: "To clarify the administrative process by which the anticipated changes to the two existing Netherlands Antilles DXCC entities will be made, the ARRL Awards Committee has determined that at 0400Z (12:00 AM local time in the islands) on 10 October 2010, the two Netherland Antilles DXCC entities will be deleted. Commencing at 0400Z (12:00 AM local time) on 10 October, 2010, operation from the islands of Curacao, Bonaire, Sint Maarten, Saba, and St Eustatius will count for a yet-to-be-determined number of new entities under the DXCC List Criteria, and Political Entities, Rule 1 and/or Rule 2 Geographic Separation Entities. When the Awards Committee determines what Rule 1 or Rule 2 actions apply, it will announce the final disposition of the entities on the DXCC list. The DXCC desk will not accept confirmations for these new entities until after 1 January, 2011".

# 10-10-10 PJ OPERATIONS BAND PLAN

The following joint press release was issued on 30 September by DXpedition leaders/teams participating in DXpeditions to the soon-to-be-disbanded Netherlands Antilles: Bob K4UEE (Saba, PJ6A), Jeff K8ND (Curacao, PJ2T), Craig K9CT (St. Maarten, PJ7E), Kelly N0VD (Bonaire, various), Will AA4NC (St. Eustatius, TBD), Dave AH6HY (St. Eustatius, TBD), Paul K1XM (St. Eustatius, TBD) and Jim K1NA (St. Eustatius, PJ5NA).

Due to the unprecedented number of potential new DXCC entities and numerous planned DXpeditions commencing 10-10-10, we felt it was prudent to establish a Band Plan to try to minimize interference between DXpeditions and their pileups.

The following Band Plan is the result of discussions that have been ongoing for several weeks. It is a Plan.... however, without the cooperation of DXers, the plan will not work. It is extremely important that DXers call DXpeditions only within the specified frequency ranges. If you do not, you will not work the station you are calling and you will likely interfere with another DXpedition on another Island. This will require cooperation and discipline.

Success of this plan also requires that DXers help spread the information about the Band Plan to their fellow DXers and DX Clubs. WE NEED YOUR HELP! But if we work together, we will be able to get many, many DXers into our logs!

This document contains the rules and constraints for DXpeditions at Jarvis, and was made available on 21 June 2010 for public comments to arrive not later than 5 July. The FWS Honolulu office staff reviewed the comments, made a number of changes, and submitted a final draft for approval at their regional office in Portland, Oregon. The final version was released on 28 July and revised applications for a permit were accepted until 25 August. The constraints in the Compatibility Determination required a radical restructuring of Radio Expedition Inc's plans, reducing both the number of stations and the time on the air. Since more than one amateur radio group submitted an application which met the requirements of the compatibility determination, a lottery among the qualified groups was held at the FWS Honolulu office by the refuge manager on 30 August. Radio Expeditions Inc was fortunate to be selected. However, due to the time required to establish the rules for amateur radio operations from Jarvis, the late selection date, and the lead time required to schedule and prepare the MV Braveheart, the expedition has been postponed one year. November remains the best month to visit Jarvis Island from a propagation standpoint, with the largest combination of openings predicted to Europe on both 160/80 and 12/10 metres.

**KERMADEC ISLANDS 2010** ● Vicky, SV2KBS has joined the ZL8X DXpedition to Raoul Island, Kermadecs [425DXN 981].
