DX INFORMATION

3A - EA3NT, G4PVM, MM0NDX and RA9USU will participate in the CQ WW DX SSB Contest as 3A3A from the



Principality of Monaco. QSL via UA3DX. Also, look for 3A/homecalls before and after the contest. Club Log shows Monaco at #4 Most Wanted for NA West Coast (SSB), and #9 Most Wanted for NA

East Coast (SSB). «The reason for this is because most of North America is blocked by mountains to the north and west of Monaco. However, the 3A3A team are in a fortunate position of being permitted roof access to a 5-star waterfront hotel whereby they will erect an assortment of antennas with a view to working the world, and a special focus on NA. Other regions which greatly needs 3A on SSB include Far East AS (#26) and VK/ZL (#63)». [TNX DX World]

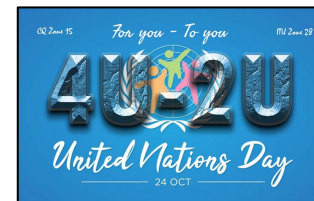

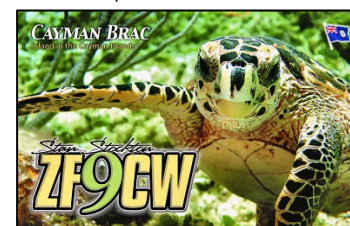

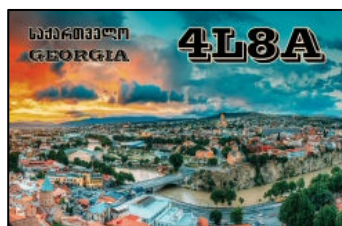

BOUVET 2022 • 3Y0J LATEST NEWS



On 27 October the following Press Release #6 was posted to the website (<https://www.3y0j.no/>) of the November 2022 3Y0J DXpedition to Bouvet Island:

We have reached our first payment milestone for the Marama vessel contract. Today we have paid the first deposit, and with this payment we confirm our plans of activating the #2 most wanted Entity Bouvet. We would like to thank each individual and club who has contributed to this payment with their upfront support, especially thanks to our Lead sponsor NCDXF. It is a huge task and undertaking to go to Bouvet and we still critically need additional upfront support to close the budget.

We are happy to announce two additional operators to the team to make it complete with 13 operators. Dave WD5COV will rejoin us on this adventure to Bouvet. Dave is a well-known and recognized DXer and DXpeditioner who has embarked on over ten major DXpeditions, including three in the top ten most wanted category.

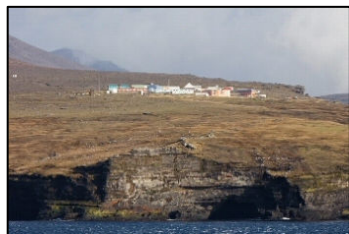
In addition, we have included Peter in the team as a combined crew and dedicated FTx operator. Peter is an experienced captain and expedition leader with huge experience from off-shore sailing, sailing in remote polar uncharted areas and specializes in supporting some of the most complex expeditions in the Arctic and Antarctica. He is experienced in safety evacuation procedures, MOB maneuver in cold water, beach landings in difficult locations and he is an experienced zodiac operator that will be based in Norway. He will be heading up the zodiac landing at Bouvet.

Our preparation for Bouvet includes planning, constructing, and testing a system for landing zodiacs safely, this will be tested in rough sea in Norway before and after Christmas. We plan for several systems and techniques to adapt to the onsite conditions. We plan for safely landing the zodiacs in different manners also with some swell, unmanned and with less risk for operators. And we prepare for the event that zodiacs are capsizing and we still can retrieve the equipment. We have done the first prelim sea trials of the zodiac equipment in Norway and will continue sea trials to further mature the concept. We plan for a gasoline powered winch system to lift equipment up the cliff, and this will be tested in Norway after Christmas. We plan to access the 25 ft cliff with professional means, and if needed prepare for climbing and bolting a short route to gain access. We refresh our climbing experience, and some team members will be certified climbers. In 2022 we will practice safe rope access training and evacuation down the cliff with instructor also including emergency evacuation with injured operator. We will have IRATA educated instructors training with us.

We also have an extended off-island team of 5 Norwegian professionals and experts from the maritime industry assisting us. These are former captains and chief engineers with huge experience within RIB SAR vessels, maritime risk assessment and safety training. Some of them have stayed several seasons at Bouvet, stayed anchored at Cape Fie, have passed Bouvet more than 60 times and have done zodiac landing at the same spot. With all these upcoming events and the knowledge in the extended team - be rest assured this will be a well planned and executed project.

COMOROS 2022 • The Radio Club de Provins (F6KOP) will be active from the Comoro Islands (AF-007) during the second half of January 2022. Plans are for a multinational team of 12 people to operate CW, SSB, RTTY and FT8/FT4 on 160-10 metres and QO-100 satellite with five stations. Details will be known in due course. [TNX F1ULQ]

For the first time, this will not be a 'spare time' activity during a scientific mission. IARU NEWS: HF BAND PLAN REVIEW • The following was posted to the IARU Region 1 website by Tom Kamp, DF5JL (Chairman, IARU R1 HF Committee) on 25 September:

Over the past 18 months a proposal for an IARU HF Digital Mode reorganization has been undertaken by representatives of all three IARU Regions. The objectives were to review the data modes usage of the Amateur Radio HF spectrum and propose changes that:

- *reduce inter-mode conflict between dissimilar operating modes; and*
- *facilitate the expansion of new technologies.*

In conducting the review it was realized that it was necessary to update the manner in which the IARU creates its band plans. Accordingly, the IARU's band planning definition toolkit were redefined, and additional data mode definition characteristics has been added to help separate activities that are fundamentally incompatible within the data mode family. With the band planning process updated, the proposal then revised the band plans of all three IARU Regions, focusing on the data sub-bands and taking into consideration:

- *popularity and capacity requirements; and*
- *existing band users and inter-mode compatibility assessments.*

The team also took the opportunity to harmonize the band plans of all three IARU Regions to the greatest extent possible of course. The proposal is now being discussed in the relevant committees.

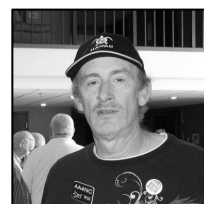

Dr. Thomas A. Clark, K3IO passed away on 28 September aged 82. A long time pioneer involved with amateur satellite development, he was Director Emeritus and President Emeritus of AMSAT. He was a leader in the development of the AX.25 packet radio network in the 1980s, and his pioneering work on Software Defined Radio led to the development of the Software Defined Transponder (SDX) for satellite work. In 2001 he was inducted into the CQ Hall of Fame, and in 2016 the ARRL honoured him with its President's Award to recognize his 60 years of advancing amateur radio technology.

Will Roberts, AA4NC lost his life in a plane crash on 21 October. An experienced pilot, he was taking off from a small airstrip near Holly Ridge (North Carolina) when his single-engine Mooney M20J crashed. «I have been interested in contesting and DXing my entire ham career», he would say, «and prefer being on the DX end of the pileup». Will operated from a large number of places, notably Navassa Island (AA4NC/KP1 1992), Sable Island (CY0XX 1996), St. Eustatius (PJ5/AA4NC 2010), St. Paul Island (CY9C 2016 and 2019) and San Andres (5K0N 2017). In 2018 and 2020 he went on two island-hopping tours in the Pacific, which included stops at Palau (T8NC), Saipan (KH0/AA4NC), Guam (KH2/AA4NC), Hawaii (KH6/AA4NC), Tahiti (TX4N), Norfolk Island (VK9NR), Papua New Guinea (P29NC), Solomon Islands (H44NC), Vanuatu (YJ0NC) and Fiji (3D2AA). He was already signed up for CY9C and CY0C in 2022.

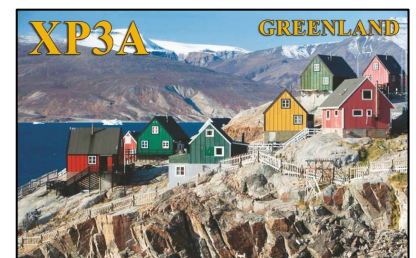
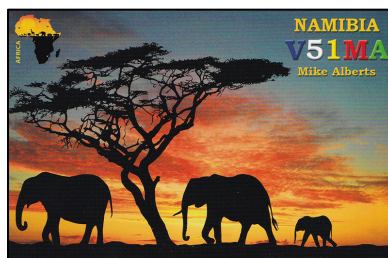
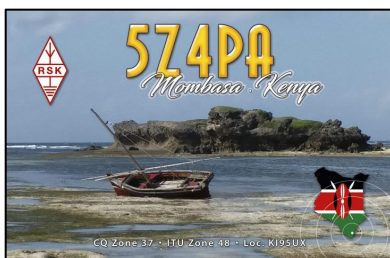
