3B6 - The Polish expedition to Agalega [425DXN 823] is on hold: "we will decide on March 15 whether it is postponed only or rather cancelled", Witek, SP9MRO says. "The decision is due to enormous costs of the expedition that have much exceeded the estimated budget". All of the contributions received so far are being refunded. 3DA - A DXpedition to Swaziland from 16 to 25 March is being organized to celebrate the 75th Jubilee of the Irish Radio Transmitters Society. It is also hoped to have some activity on EME, 2m and 6m. The following announcement comes from Tom Harrell (N4XP) through Don Greenbaum (N1DG). "After three years of effort to obtain permission to land and operate from the most needed entity in the world, that needed authorization has been received. 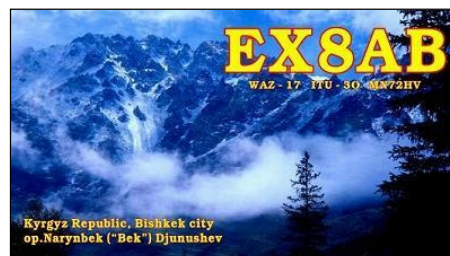
NEW UK POSTAL RATES I Effective 2 April, UK postal rates will rise across the board by slightly more than

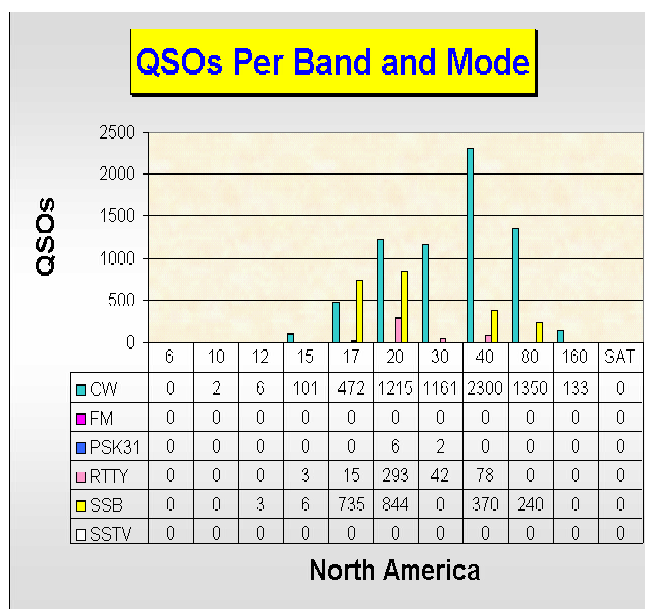
