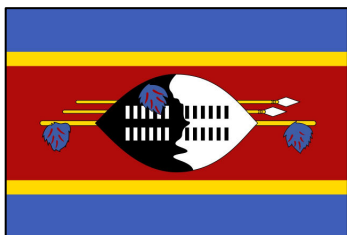

3DA - Pista HA5AO will be active as 3DA0AO (requested callsign) from eSwatini (aka Swaziland) during the second half of September. He will operate CW, RTTY, FT8 and some SSB on 80-10 metres. Log search and

OQRS will be available at <https://www.ha5ao.co>. As he did in Lesotho in previous years, Pista continues his humanitarian project work by supporting an orphanage. He will deliver school items and small gifts to the children. More details to follow at a later date. Swaziland was recently renamed "The Kingdom of eSwatini" by King Mswati III to mark the 50th anniversary of independence. The new name means "land of the Swazis". [TNX K5GS]

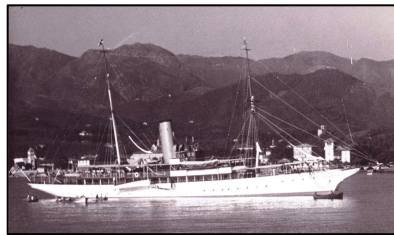

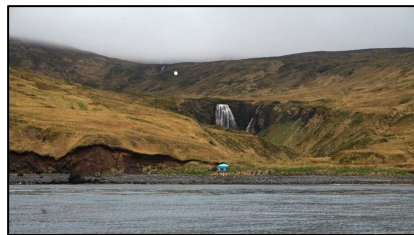
KH1 - Following a successful Visalia DX Convention, the KH1/KH7Z team met in Cupertino to assemble the stations and network in preparation of landing on Baker Island. The DXpedition is now in the final planning stages and this step was the last before packing and shipping the gear to Fiji.

There will be eight stations in three separate tents for CW, SSB and digital modes. "Although limited to 43 feet, our 80 and 160m antennas are newly designed AA7JV 'fat' verticals, which will sit just inside the high tide mark. The SteppiR verticals for 75 through 10m will also be mounted just inside of the high tide mark, while four 2-element vertical arrays will be mounted away from the water for 15, 17 and 20m. In this way, we can maintain a 24-hour presence on 20m to maximize the number of unique callsigns and enable the most ATNO contacts. We also intend to install a multi-vertical array for 6m at the digital radios".

Plans are for KH1/KH7Z to be QRV from 26 June through 6 July, depending on weather and seas, and to upload the logs to Club Log twice a day to minimize duplicate contacts.

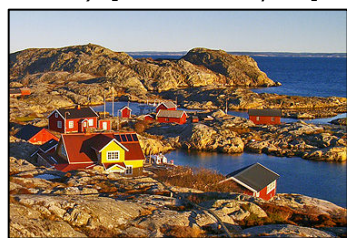

CQ AMATEUR RADIO HALL OF FAME • The CQ Amateur Radio Hall of Fame was established in January 2001 to recognize individuals - radio amateurs or not - who significantly affected the course of Amateur Radio, as well as radio amateurs who have made significant contributions either to amateur radio, to their professional careers or to some other aspect of life on our planet. This year's inductees are:

- **Marlon Brando, FO5GJ** (SK), iconic movie actor
- **David Brown, KC5ZTC** (SK), NASA astronaut killed in 2003 Columbia disaster
- **Kalpana Chawla, KD5ESI** (SK), NASA astronaut killed in 2003 Columbia disaster
- **Laurel Clark, KC5ZSU** (SK), NASA astronaut killed in 2003 Columbia disaster
- **Ashhar Farhan, VU2ESE**, pioneer in popularizing open-source Bit-X "semi- Kits" using Arduinos for affordable QRP transceivers
- **Grady Fox, W4FRM** (SK), SSB pioneer; worked on Manhattan Project during World War II and the camera for NASA's lunar landers
- **Wendell King, ex-2ADD** (SK), African-American pioneer of broadcasting and college radio
- **Fred Lloyd, AA7BQ**, founder of QRZ.com, the most widely-accessed amateur radio website
- **Mark Pecan, KC9X/VE3QAM**, wireless communication and networking pioneer, inventor, cybersecurity expert
- **Carole Perry, WB2MGP**, longtime advocate for youth in amateur radio; moderator of Dayton youth forum for more than 30 years
- **Ed Westcott, W4UVS**, photographer who chronicled the Manhattan Project during World War II and later helped the FBI with its investigation of the Jonestown massacre

This year's inductions bring the total number of members of the CQ Amateur Radio Hall of Fame to 321.



CQ CONTEST & CQ DX HALLS OF FAME • The CQ Contest Hall of Fame (established in 1986) and the CQ DX Hall of Fame (established in 1967) honour those amateurs who not only excel in personal performance in these major areas of amateur radio, but who also "give back" to the hobby in outstanding ways.

The 2018 inductees to the **CQ Contest Hall of Fame** are:

- **Andy Blank, N2NT** - Nominated by the Frankford Radio Club, Andy has been the director of the CQ World Wide 160-

Meter DX Contest for the past decade. A world-class contester with wins stretching back to 1979, Andy has also competed in five World Radiosport Team Championships (WRTC) competitions and was Director of Competition for WRTC-2014, held in Massachusetts. He is also a member of the advisory board of the World Wide Radio Operators' Foundation (WWROF).

- **Tom Wagner, N1MM** - Nominated by both the Yankee Clipper Contest Club and the Northern California Contest Club, Tom is best known for his development of and ongoing upgrades to the N1MM Logger, which has become the world's most popular contest logging software. The program supports more than 240 different contests, multiple operating modes and integration with any number of transceivers and station accessories. Tom now leads a team of developers who are developing further enhancements and were recognized with the YASME Excellence Award in 2015.

CQ Contesting Editor David Siddall, K3ZJ, presented Hall of Fame plaques at an induction ceremony held at the annual Dayton Contest Dinner on 19 May. This year's inductions bring the total number of members of the CQ Contest Hall of Fame to 71.

The 2018 inductees to the **CQ DX Hall of Fame** are:

- **Kimo Chun, KH7U** - Nominated by the Dateline DX Association, of which he is a founding member. He has operated on many major DXpeditions, including Kingman Reef, Christmas Island, Palmyra Atoll, Cambodia and Midway Island. In addition, he routinely provides logistical assistance to hams planning Pacific island DXpeditions; and provides electronic maintenance support for groups administering Pacific island nature preserves, including the Nature Conservancy and the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service. A longtime member of Hawaii's Department of Emergency Management RACES team, Kimo was recently featured on an NBC News story about last year's accidental nuclear attack alert message sent out in Hawaii, and emphasized the role played by amateurs as the first to alert the public that the message was sent in error.
- **Krassimir "Krassy" Petkov, K1LZ/LZ1SA** - Nominated by the Araucaria DX Group of Brazil, the Bulgarian Federation of Radio Amateurs and the Yankee Clipper Contest Club, Krassy has made many behind-the-scenes contributions to DXing and contesting over the years. A veteran of two dozen DXpeditions, Krassy has also provided or arranged financial and/or material support to many others. He also co-founded the Young Ham Contest Program in 2003, taking hams under age 21 to operate in major contests from Caribbean superstations; and served on the board of the 2006 World Radiosport Team Championship (WRTC) competition in Brazil. He has also worked with fellow DXers during DXpeditions to promote amateur radio and provide equipment for hams in the countries in which the groups operated.

CQ DX Editor Bob Schenck, N2OO, presented Hall of Fame plaques at an induction ceremony held at the annual Dayton DX Dinner on 18 May. This year's inductions bring the total number of members of the CQ DX Hall of Fame to 73.



CQ WW DX CONTEST: NEW DIRECTOR • Effective 14 May, John Dorr (K1AR) is the new Director of the CQ World Wide DX Contest. He succeeds Doug Zwiebel (KR2Q), who has been CQWW Director for the past two years and who has stepped down for personal reasons. K1AR has been a member of the CQWW Contest Committee since the mid-1970s, and served as CQ magazine's Contesting Editor from 1989 to 2011. A two-time medalist in the World Radiosport Team Championship (WRTC), he was inducted into the CQ Contest Hall of Fame in 1997.

CQ WW DX CW CONTEST 2017 • "A change in scoring methodology for duplicate contacts in the CW weekend of the 2017 CQ World Wide DX Contest led to an inconsistency with the standards by which logs submitted for the SSB weekend of the same contest were scored", the CQWW Management announced on 10 May. It was therefore decided to restore the original scoring methodology

and to rescore all CW logs for 2017. The updated scores have been posted online: <http://www.cqww.com/scorescw.htm?yr=2017&mode=CW>. "There was minimal impact to the final scores with no significant changes to the final standings and only 40% of the total pool of logs affected at all", K1AR (CQ WW DX Contest Director) says.



DXPEDITIONS DELAYED • The Rebel DX Group had announced they were going to Conway Reef around 20 May in addition to their planned reactivation of T31T from Kanton Island, Central Kiribati (OC-043) [425DXN 1403]. Both the DXpeditions have been delayed. "We want to do it as one trip", Dom (3Z9DX) said on eHam.net, but "there is a delay from Kiribati gov. with delivery new SAT

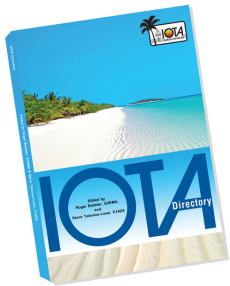

It contains the complete listing of IOTA islands as well as everything you need to know to participate in IOTA. Included in the colour section are fascinating reports on several rare IOTA operations (Ashmore Reef, Bhola Island & St Martin's Island, Pukapuka Atoll, Busuanga Island, Mokil Island). The rules have been restructured to make them easier to follow. The list of Most Wanted IOTAs has been recast to show the listing in three ways: based on contacts credited all-time, credited to those who updated in the last 10 years and to those who did so in the last 5 years. Regular features such as the Honour Roll and other performance listings, award winners and advice on making a first application are also included. This Directory will probably be the last paper edition to be printed.

KOSOVO & ALBANIA • Martti, OH2BH (Z68BH) and Pertti, OG2M (Z68MM) are in Kosovo "to close several open ends with the Kosovo Amateur Radio Society (SHARK) and their Telecom administrators (ARKEP). This includes potential 6m permits for the future". While in Kosovo, Z68BH will participate in the CQ WW WPX CW Contest. Then they will move to Albania with Z61DX and possibly others, and be active as ZA/OG2M "specifically on 6 metres". 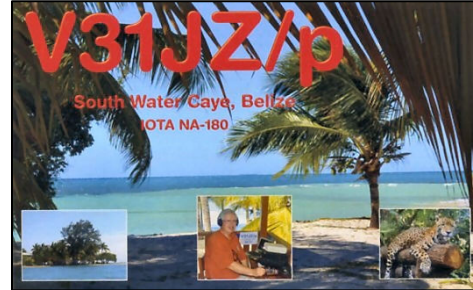


ROYAL WEDDING SPECIAL PREFIXES • Subject to prior authorisation, amateur radio operators in the United Kingdom may use special prefixes starting at 23 UTC on 18 May through 21 May to signify the marriage of H.R.H. Prince Henry of Wales to Ms Meghan Markle. The Regional Secondary Locator (D, I, J, M, U and W, plus E for Intermediate licences) in the existing call sign may be replaced by the letter 'R'; where no Secondary Locator exists, the letter 'R' may be inserted as a Secondary Locator. For instance, MD0ABC (Isle of Man), MIOABC (Northern Ireland), MJOABC (Jersey), MMOABC (Scotland), MU0ABC (Guernsey), MW0ABC (Wales) and MOABC (England) may all be amended to MR0ABC. Alan, 5B4AHJ is maintaining a Club Log Helpdesk article to help clarify which special calls are QRV from which DXCC Entity. The list does NOT include stations operating from England (Club Log does not need an exception for them): <https://clublog.freshdesk.com/support/solutions/folders/98233> and select "2R, GR & MR prefixes - Royal Wedding, 2018".

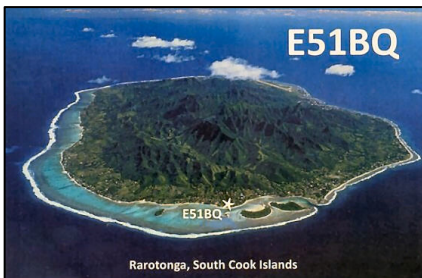
