# DX INFORMATION

**3A** - Paul, F6EXV and Florian, PB8DX will be active from Monaco on 7-17 July. They will be signing 3A6M on 6 metres, as well as 3A/F6EXV and 3A/PB8DX on the HF bands. QSLs for all callsigns via Club Log's OQRS (direct and bureau), and LoTW after six months.

**3D2** - 3D2AJT is the special callsign that Dom, 3D2USU (3Z9DX) will be using for one month from Nadi, Fiji Islands in memory of the late Yasuo "Zorro" Miyazawa, JH1AJT. Activity will end on 27 July, which would have marked Zorro's 73rd birthday. QSL via Club Log's OQRS.

**4J** - Alex, 4J3DJ is active again as 4JF1EU until 19 June. The special callsign celebrates the Formula 1 Grand Prix that for the sixth time will take place in Baku, Azerbaijan on 10-12 June. QSL via home call (see qrz.com for information).

**5R** - Bernard, F9VO has relocated to Madagascar since 26 December 2021. Starting on 17 June he will be QRV as 5R8BM from Nosy Be (AF-057).

**6O** - Ali, EP3CQ expects to be back to Mogadishu, Somalia on 16 June and be active again as 6O100 for about one month. In his spare time he will operate FT8, FT4 and some CW on 80-15 metres. QSL direct to Ali Solhjo, Freienwalderstr. 35, 13359 Berlin, Germany.

**7O** - David, DL7ZM (OE6NZM) has been active as 7O/DL7ZM from Socotra Island (AF-028), Yemen since 23 June. He expects to remain there until around 3 July. He operates CW and FT8 on 6 and 10 metres only. «David is there just for radio operation and has a 100w radio, 6 element beam for 50Mhz and a smaller Yagi for 10m», DX World reports. «He didn't announce this activity beforehand as it was not clear if he would get the official permission to operate from the island». **7P** - Mark, KW4XJ (previously QRV as 9L1YXJ from Sierra Leone) is now active as 7P8AB from Maseru, Lesotho. His wife Arina, KO4PZT holds the callsign 7P8NB. Mark operates digital

modes, SSB and CW. QSL to Mark A. Brewer, 2340 Maseru Pl, Dulles VA 20189-2340, USA.



**7X** - Special event callsigns 7R19MG (QSL via IK2DUW), 7U19MG (QSL via operator's instructions) and 7Y19MG (QSL via 7X2VFK) will be active on from 25 June to 5 July for the 19th edition of the Mediterranean Games to be held in Oran, Algeria. The Mediterranean Games are an international multi-sport event held every four years among athletes from countries bordering the Mediterranean Sea in Africa, Asia and Europe.

**7X** - Celebrating the 60th anniversary of Algeria's independence from France (5 July 1962), special callsign 7T60A will be active on 1-30 July. QSL via 7X2VFK.

**A3** - Masa, JA0RQV (<https://blog.goo.ne.jp/rqv>) will be QRV again from Tonga, including activity from a couple of rare IOTA groups. Current plans (which might change «due to unstable situation in Tonga») are as follows:

«Since there is no commercial power available» on the first two islands, he says, operations could be «quite limited in terms of output power as well as time» spent on the air. Established in 2002, the United Nations Public Service Day (23 June) celebrates the value and virtue of public service to the community; highlights the contribution of public service in the development process; recognizes the work of public servants, and encourages young people to pursue careers in the public sector.



**C5** - The C5C team plans to be active as C5B from the Bijol Islands (AF-060) on 7 June between 9 and 16 UTC. QSL via LoTW, eQSL, or direct to F5RAV.

**CT9** - Joe, HA2EAV and Csaba, HA2KMR will be active holiday style as CT9/ HA2EAV and CT9/HA2KMR from Madeira Island (AF-014) on 24-28 June. They will participate in the King of Spain SSB Contest (25-26 June) as CR3DX.

**DL** - Sebastian, DL1AXX will be active as DL1AXX/p from Helgoland Dune (EU-127) on 1-7 July. He will operate QRP CW on 40-15 metres. QSL via the bureau.

**F** - Members of the Radio-Club de Caen will operate special station TM6J from the historic site of the Merville Gun Battery on the eastern flank of "Sword", one of the beaches where the Normandy landings took place on D-Day (6 June 1944). **G** - Special event station GB22HQ will be activated from the National Exhibition Centre in Birmingham, England for the duration of the XXII Commonwealth Games, from 28 July to 8 August. In addition, seven special callsigns will be activated from the United Kingdom's Home Nations and Crown Dependencies from 25 July until 21 August: GB22GD (Isle of Man), GB22GE (England), GB22GI (Northern Ireland), GB22GJ (Jersey), GB22GM (Scotland), GB22GU (Guernsey) and GB22GW (Wales). **GM** - Paul, G4PVM will be active holiday style as GM4PVM from the Isle of Arran (EU-123) on 25-30 June. He will operate CW and some SSB on 40-10m. QSL via LoTW and eQSL; paper cards will not be available, but he will upload the QSOs to Club Log for IOTA matching. [TNX JN6RZM]

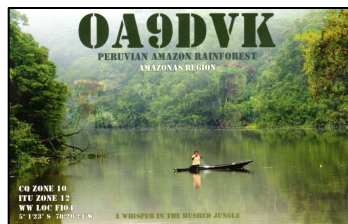

**SP** - 3Z4PAR was a special station that Poland's Radiocommunication Agency (Panstwowa Agencja Radiokomunikacyjna, PAR) authorized to operate on 50 MHz as an experiment.



The successful outcome of this operation paved the way for general availability of the Magic Band to the Polish amateur radio community. Celebrating the 30<sup>th</sup> anniversary

of the very first 6m QSO in Poland (made on 5 June 1992 at 12.53 UTC between 3Z4PAR and IK1EGC), special callsign 3Z30PAR will be active from 5 June at 12.53 UTC until the end of the year. QSL via LoTW and SP4KM (direct or bureau).

**SP** - Special callsigns 3Z1922PS, HF1922PS, SN1922PS, SO1922PS, SP1922PS and SQ1922PS will be active on 2-17 July to mark the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary since the incorporation of part of Upper Silesian into Poland (16 July 1922). **3D2RRR** • According to Club Log, the 3D2RRR DXpedition to Rotuma made 64,206 contacts with 12,532 unique callsigns between 04:33 UTC on 24 May and 17:51 UTC on 2 June. **3Y0J: LATEST NEWS** • The 2023 Bouvet Island DXpedition team leaders posted their Press Release #10 on 3 June.

*In late April we successfully conducted a 4-day vessel inspection in Brazil that ended with a very good result. The inspection was carried out by a 3<sup>rd</sup> party vessel inspector and covered more than 105 checkpoints. The vessel inspection focused on safety equipment, instruments, navigation, engines/machinery, deck, tenders, fuel & fluids, interior, and exterior. Marama is in very good condition and hence the overall feedback is positive. The vessel went through significant upgrades with regards to machinery and engines in 2021 and has since been tested for years, most lately during the previous Antarctica season. The inspection file resulted in a punch list of only a few minor items to be followed up, no major findings during the 4-day inspection.*

*The team is currently working on the final preparations for packing the container scheduled to be shipped from Oslo in early September. Preparing the packing and shipping the container is extremely time consuming and requires a focus on details as our more than two years of work now is being materialized into packing lists and labelling the equipment. Today we have finally decided our container will be shipped to Port Stanley, Falkland Islands. In Port Stanley a local team of ham radio operators will assist us in receiving the container, conduct a container inspection and make sure all is OK before the team arrive in early January. To Bouvet the team will bring 6500 kg of equipment, which includes several tons of fuel and food. Our contract allows for 22 days on the island, but we have food for 30 days and a plan for rationing should we have to stay beyond 22 days.*

*At this stage all the operators have already paid their full deposit of their individual \$20,000 operator fee. This is your insurance that we will do whatever we can to make this DXpedition a success. In a few weeks we will pay our 2<sup>nd</sup> vessel deposit to Marama. Ultimately this represents a huge undertaking for us financially as well a commitment to go to Bouvet and activate the rare #2 DXCC Bouvet Island. With all the preparation and planning over the course of the last two years you can rely on our commitment and our determination to go onshore Bouvet in a zodiac seven months from now.*

*Going to Bouvet would simply not be possible without the support from the vendors, clubs, foundations, and individual sponsors. June 1<sup>st</sup>, we completed our budget update, and this shows we're still missing roughly \$100,000 out of our \$690,000 budget to be able to go to Bouvet. As we now prepare for the next vessel deposit, we need your support to close the gap. Please consider supporting us by donating upfront.*

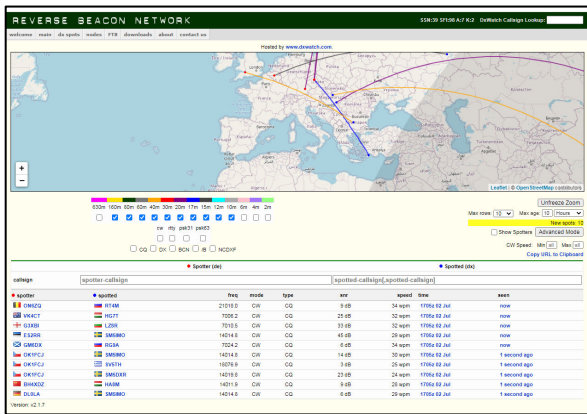

The Sable horses, which number over 500, have free run of the island, except for the area around the Sable Station, which is fenced in. The DXpedition team has a relatively small footprint to work with. Additionally, no antennas can be placed on or near the beach as Sable Island is home to tens of thousands of grey seals».

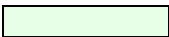

A full explanation of the new features is available under ABOUT > GUIDE TO THE NEW SITE. The Reverse Beacon Network a network of stations listening to the bands and reporting what stations they hear, when and how well. You can see band openings in near-real time on an animated map. The database of past spots allows you to instantly find out what stations, from a given country or zone, have been heard, at what times and on what frequencies. You can see when you have been spotted, who spotted you, and how loud you were. And now, for the first time, you can compare your signal with those of your friends and competitors, in near real time or historically. If you wonder how your signal stacked up during last weekend's contests, the Signal Comparison Tool will give you real, quantitative data. Tell it what stations you want to compare, based on signals heard by a given reverse beacon on a certain band at a certain time, and there you'll have it.
