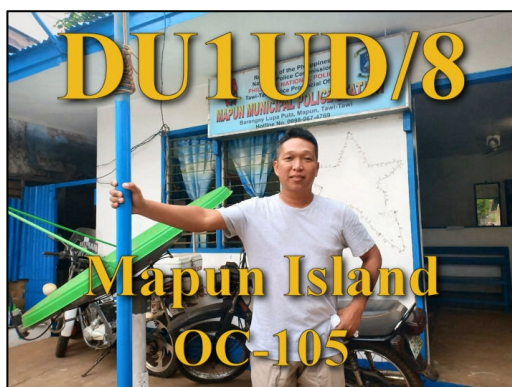

# DX INFORMATION

**3D2** - Oleh, KD7WPJ will be active as 3D2AZ from Viti Levu (OC-016), Fiji on 11-16 May. He will operate CW and SSB on 40-12 metres. QSL via KD7WPJ or LoTW. [TNX NG3K]

**3W** - Tom, DL7BO will be active again as XV9BO from Mui Ne, Vietnam on 13-19 May. He will operate sporadically on the HF bands SSB, CW, RTTY and FT8. QSL via LoTW or DL7BO. [TNX The Daily DX]

**3W** - Sven, HB9DXB expects to be active as XV9DXB from Nha Trang, Vietnam starting around 2 June. Plans are to operate SSB and CW on 80, 40, 20 and 10 metres. QSL via EB7DX.

**4L** - Jun, JH4RHF expects to be QRV as 4L9S from Tbilisi, Georgia from 25 May to 2 June. He plans to operate mostly CW on the HF bands in his spare time. QSL via OE1ZKC. [TNX The Daily DX]

**5W** - 5W0H is the callsign issued to the Uruguay DX Group's DXpedition to Upolu, Samoa (OC-097) [425DXN 1457]. Two additional operators have joined the team, which now includes CX2AM, CX3AN, CX3DDB, CX4CR and CX8FB. They will operate mainly CW and SSB on 80-6 metres with two stations on 1-10 June. **CZECH POHOTOVOSTNI TEST** • Agenda Item 1.1 for the 2019 World Radio Communications Conference (WRC) invites the WRC to consider an allocation of the frequency band 50-54 MHz to the amateur service in Region 1. The Czech regulator CTO is investigating if theoretical study results match real life situations. An initial trial took place under flat propagation conditions on 28 February 2019 in the Czech Republic. One of the objectives of the test was to verify that military and amateur radio stations could co-exist in the 50 MHz band. A second test when enhanced propagation conditions are more likely to occur will take place in the Sporadic E season on 13 June 2019. The worldwide amateur community is invited to participate in this second 50 MHz activity day, called Pohotovostni test or P-test. **EUCW** • The European CW Association (<https://www.eucw.org/>) celebrates its 40th anniversary in 2019. **CQ AMATEUR RADIO HALL OF FAME**

The CQ Amateur Radio Hall of Fame was established in January 2001 to recognize individuals - radio amateurs or not - who significantly affected the course of Amateur Radio, as well as radio amateurs who have made significant contributions either to amateur radio, to their professional careers or to some other aspect of life on our planet. This year’s inductees are:

- **John Attaway, Sr., K4IIF (SK)**, served for more than 20 years as CQ’s DX Editor, proposing the establishment of the CQ DX Hall of Fame in 1967. Professionally, John was a chemist who spent 26 years as Director of Scientific Research for the Florida Department of Citrus, where he worked to improve the quality of Florida orange juice. He served on several industry committees and was named to the Florida Citrus Hall of Fame in 2001.
- **Dave Bernstein, AA6YQ**, author of the DXLab software suite, which he has placed in the public domain, and provided behind-the-scenes help in integrating the ARRL’s Logbook of the World software with outside programs.
- **Doreen Bogdan-Martin, KD2JTX**, Director of the International Telecommunication Union (ITU) Telecommunication Development Bureau and the first woman ever to hold a senior elected position in the ITU.
- **Florin Cristian Predescu, YO9CNU**, founder of Europe’s Youngsters On The Air (YOTA) program to encourage young people to become hams and be active on the air.
- **Ellen White, W1YL**, the grand dame of DXing, served as the ARRL’s Deputy Communications Manager, was QST magazine’s DX editor, recorded QST on tape for the Library of Congress’s talking book program for the visually-impaired, and was instrumental in the founding of Murphy’s Marauders (the predecessor of today’s Yankee Clipper Contest Club) and the Florida Contest Group. She was also recently awarded Russia’s E.T. Krenkel Medal for outstanding global contributions to amateur radio.

This year’s inductions bring the total number of members of the CQ Amateur Radio Hall of Fame to 326.

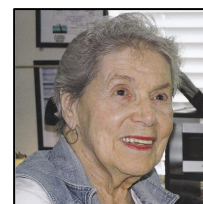

The CQ Contest Hall of Fame (established in 1986) and the CQ DX Hall of Fame (established in 1967) honour those amateurs who not only excel in personal performance in these major areas of amateur radio, but who also "give back" to the hobby in outstanding ways.

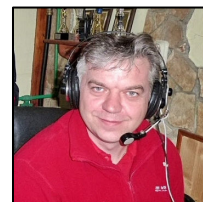
The 2019 inductees to the **CQ CONTEST HALL OF FAME** are:

- **Bruce Horn, WA7BNM**, provides a great service to the contesting community via web-based resources for many popular contests. He maintains the most comprehensive contest calendar on the web, and he developed the popular 3830Scores website (<https://3830scores.com/>) where contesters go to post raw scores after an event ends, to compare notes and search past contest logs. He is also manager of the



North American QSO Party and developed the current National Contest Journal website.

- **Dean Straw, N6BV**, is an outstanding contesteer, a talented writer, editor, presenter and educator, and has advanced the state of the art in antennas, computer modeling, propagation and contest planning and preparation. As an ARRL staff member for 15 years, he edited multiple editions of The ARRL Antenna Book and several other publications. He also developed the High Frequency Terrain Analysis (HFTA) software, which revolutionized antenna system planning by linking antenna design, installation height, tower location, surrounding terrain, and the expected angles of propagation to target regions. His work with the propagation prediction program VOACAP revolutionized the way we plan for contests, allowing specific band opening predictions dependent on solar conditions to indicate when band changes and operations should be planned.
- **Kresimir "Chris" Kovarik, 9A5K (SK)**, developed the DXLog and Klog programs, competed in the World Radiosport Team Championship (WRTC) and served the broader amateur radio community in Europe as past president of the Croatian Amateur Radio Association and as vice-chairman of the IARU Region 1 HF Committee. He became a Silent Key earlier this year.



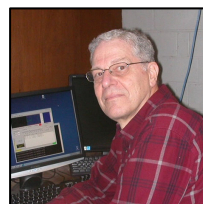
CQ Contesting Editor David Siddall, K3ZJ, presented Hall of Fame plaques at an induction ceremony held at the annual Dayton Contest Dinner on 18 May. This year's inductions bring the total number of members of the CQ Contest Hall of Fame to 74.

The 2019 inductees to the **CQ DX HALL OF FAME** are:

- **Joe Taylor, K1JT** - Nobel Prize winning-astrophysicist who has revolutionized the face of DXing with his suite of WSJT weak-signal digital modes, including FT8, which is capable of decoding signals well below the noise level. The modes pioneered by Joe have kept the HF bands busy and the DXers active even during the current solar minimum. Other WSJT modes have Also revolutionized VHF/UHF DXing via moonbounce and meteor scatter. Taylor shared the 1993 Nobel Prize in physics for the discovery of binary pulsars.



- **Silvano Borsa, I2YSB**, and the **Italian DXpedition Team** - The Italian DXpedition Team has made more than 20 major DXpeditions in the past 20 years, mostly to Africa, where its members have activated more than a dozen rare countries, making nearly 1.4 million QSOs along the way. In addition, the team has arranged for the donation and delivery of two ambulances from Italy to Somalia, one of the many countries it has activated. In addition to team leader Silvano Borsa (I2YSB), the Italian DXpedition Team members include Alfeo Caputo (I1HJT), Vincio Ravizza (IK2CIO), Angelo Selva (IK2CKR), Marcello Cassinelli (IK2DIA), Stefano Casari (IK2HKT), Angelo Gino Zambaiti (IK2RZP) and Mac Shimamoto (JA3USA).

## YASME EXCELLENCE AWARDS & SUPPORTING GRANTS



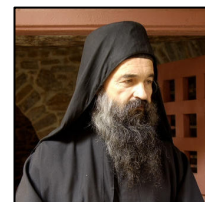
In 2008 The Yasme Foundation (<http://www.yasme.org/>) established the Yasme Excellence Award, to be presented to individuals and groups who, through their own service, creativity, effort and dedication, have made a significant contribution to amateur radio. The contribution may be in recognition of technical, operating or organizational achievement, as all three are necessary for amateur radio to grow and prosper. The Yasme Excellence Award is in the form of a cash grant and an individually-engraved crystal globe. The latest recipients, announced on 18 May, are:

- **Angel Vazquez, WP3R** - for his work in disaster relief, and as an outstanding ambassador for amateur radio.
- **Nikola Percin, 9A5W** - for his outstanding work in advancing amateur radio in Croatia and the surrounding region. He is a co-founder of 9A1A. Nikola started efforts to recruit young amateurs and established youth programs in coordination with local universities.

The Board of Directors of the Yasme Foundation has also made the following grants:

- \$5,000 each to the Foundation for Amateur Radio (FAR) and ARRL scholarship programs for 2019.
- \$5,000 to WRTC 2022 in Italy for general support, and a second grant to once again sponsor the Widow's Ball during WRTC 2022. [TNX K4ZW]

**+ SILENT KEYS + Elder Apollo, SV2ASP** passed away on 5 May. He was 64 years old, and had been fighting brain cancer for three years. A monk since 1973, he moved to the Docheiariou Monastery at Mount Athos in 1980. Nick Georgiades (SV2RE) and George Tsaliros (SV2UA) introduced him to amateur Radio essentially as means of emergency communication. He obtained his licence in 1988, and two years later the Holy Council permitted him to operate. "In spite of all the difficulties and of not being fond of DXing (which does not really fit my monastic way of life)", he wrote, "I have been sacrificing my very little spare time to make the voice of the Holy Mountain heard on the air and to give joy to a multitude of friends impatiently waiting for a contact. I have been doing so since 1990, trying to spread, through my presence on the radio waves, a message of hope and optimism - from the ascetic world of Mount Athos to the troubled world outside". In 2000 he celebrated his 10th anniversary on the air with the special call sign SY2A.



**Kathryn "Kat" Cheval, E51KC (KB7SCH)** passed away on 1 May in Victoria, BC, Canada at only 55 years of age. She had been married to Andrew "Andy" Duncan, E51AND (AB7FS) since 1992, and the couple lived on Rarotonga, South Cook Islands for the past six years.

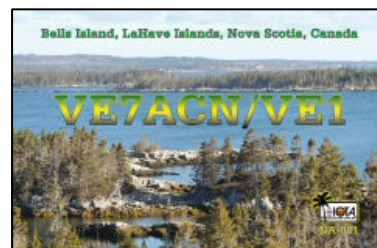
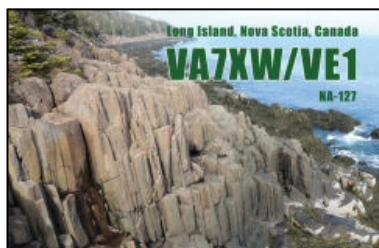
