DX INFORMATION

3B8 - Lubo, OM5ZW will be active holiday style as 3B8/OM5ZW from Mauritius (AF-049) from 29 April to 6 May. He will operate CW, SSB, RTTY and FT8 on 80-10 metres. QSL via LoTW and Club Log's OQRS. [TNX The Daily DX]

4K - Dirk, DK1DKE will be active again as 4K7DK from Baku, Azerbaijan on 2-6 May. He will operate SSB and FT8 on 80-10m. QSL via DK1DKE and LoTW. [TNX The Daily DX]



4X - Look for special prefixes 4X74 and 4Z74, followed by the station's individual suffix (e.g. 4X1OM and 4Z5OC will be signing 4X74OM and 4Z74OC, respectively) to be used to celebrate the State of Israel's 74th anniversary on 5-11 May. QSL via operator's instructions.

4X - The Land of Craters programme sees four special stations operate from the Makhteshim ("craters") in the Negev desert of Israel. The first three activities were conducted by 4X0ARF (November 2020), 4X0GDL (April-



May 2021) and 4X0KTN (November 2021). Look for 4X0RMN to be QRV from Makhtesh Ramon (Ramon Crater), Israel's largest national park, on 13-14

They expect to visit Bishkek, drive around Lake Issyk-Kul (Issyk-Kul State Nature Reserve) and climb Mount Komsomolets (Ala-Archa Nature Park). They will operate CW, FT8 and some SSB on 40-10m. QSL cards will be sent to everyone via the bureau. They also plan to upload to LoTW, eQSL, HamLog and Club Log.

F - Special callsign TM50IS will be activated on 9-18 April from the city of Abbeville and other locations in the Bay of Somme (TM50IS/p) during the 31st edition of the Bird and Nature Festival. QSL via F5KRH.

F - Franck, F4DTO and Patrick, F4GFE will be active as TM400MO for fifteen days between 2 May and 21 October. The special callsign memorializes the 400th anniversary since the birth of Moliere, the French playwright widely regarded as one of the greatest writers in world literature. QSL via F4DTO.

FK - Jean-Louis, F5NHJ will be visiting his son in Noumea, New Caledonia (OC-032) from 5 April to 11 June. He plans to be active holiday style as FK/F5NHJ and operate CW, SSB and digital modes. The log will be uploaded to LoTW, eQSL and LoTW. [TNX The Daily DX]

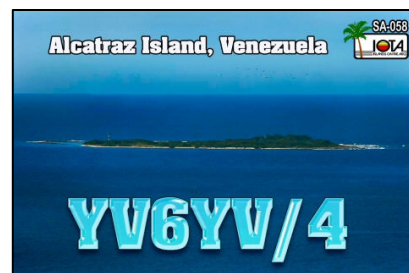
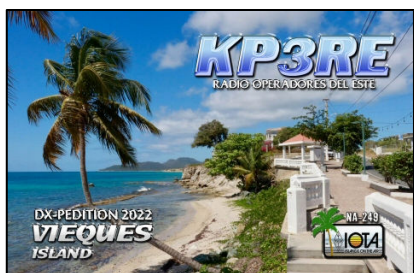

3Y0J: LATEST NEWS • Pete, N0FW has been added to the operating team, which is now complete. «Today it is 9 months until the operators travel to South America to board *Marama* and go to Bouvet», the 3Y0J team announced on 3 April. In a couple of week's time they will conduct a 4-day «detailed inspection» of the ship in Itajai (Brazil), and will also «complete the vessel loading plan».



All team members will then gather in Norway on 28 April, and for four days they will «perform a system integration test where we will do a thorough test of the radios, amplifiers and antennas in a real environment like what we can expect at Bouvet. During this event team members will practice on the installation and familiarize with it. A lot of equipment will undergo its final testing and packing, and be stored until the container leaves Oslo in September». A DXpedition to Bouvet Island is «a huge undertaking financially and it would simply not be possible without the support from the vendors, clubs, foundations and individual sponsors». The first DXcellence Award has been conferred on the **S9OK DXpedition to Sao Tome** (October 2021): «their team did a terrific job, and after contact with Zorro, JH1AJT, planned a visit to the local schools. Useful gifts were given to the children for the classrooms and the children's response was joy and happiness».

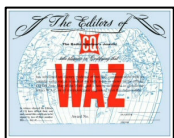


and under; partners with IARU to operate the NCDXF Beacon System worldwide; supports the World Radio Team Championship.

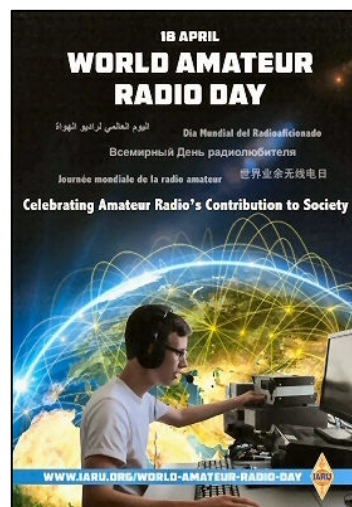

YASME EXCELLENCE AWARD • Established in 2008 by the Yasme Foundation (<https://www.yasme.org/>), the Excellence Award is presented to individuals and groups who, through their own service, creativity, effort and dedication have made a significant contribution to amateur radio. The contribution may be in recognition of technical, operating or organizational achievement, as all three are necessary for amateur radio to grow and prosper. The latest recipients, announced on 31 March, are:

- **Dan Marler, K7REX** - When the COVID pandemic led to cessation of in-person meetings, training sessions and gatherings, Dan converted a small limited-membership Zoom platform to the open presentation forum known as RATPAC [Radio Amateur Training Planning and Activities Committee, Ed.]. In the subsequent two years, RATPAC has hosted over two hundred online presentations that have been viewed by thousands of radio amateurs. Among the wide-ranging topics, half focus on public-service communications, while the rest address technical, operating, scientific and general-interest topics offered by a host of presenters. The recordings of these sessions are available for public viewing, and constitute a valuable resource for the amateur radio community: <https://www.youtube.com/c/RATPAC/playlists>.
- **Dr. Gordon Gibby, KX4Z** - Gordon is a retired emergency-room physician turned high school science teacher who demonstrates how amateur radio can benefit our communities in a wide variety of ways. As an ARES leader in Northern Florida, Gordon promotes and teaches all aspects of preparedness for disasters, from planning and exercises to building and repairing communication hardware to understanding official responders' needs, methods and organization. He advocates cognizance of the amateur's role and its limits, building trust and relationships, and constantly improving our individual skills. He is known around the country for his informative and carefully thought out responses to the many questions from other amateurs seeking to improve their local disaster-response capabilities.



YOTA SUMMER CAMP 2022 • After a two-year Covid-related hiatus, the Croatian Amateur Radio Association (HRS) will host the 10th edition of the Youngsters on the Air Summer Camp in the city of Karlovac on 6-13 August. This event brings together young radio amateurs from IARU Region 1 member societies for a week, creating an opportunity to learn all about different nationalities and cultures, foster international friendships and goodwill, and learn new amateur radio skills. SOME RESPONSES TO RECENT WORLD EVENTS



The Czech Radio Club (the Czech Republic's IARU Society) has resolved that «the OK-OM DX SSB Contest will be held under the same rules as the CQ contests, i.e. stations from Russia and Belarus cannot participate and also contacts with them are not counted». The contest will take place on 9-10 April (<http://www.okomdx.crk.cz/>).

The same decision has been taken by the organizers of the Japan International DX Contest (its CW leg will run from 7 UTC on 9 until 13 UTC on 10 April: <http://www.jidx.org/jidxrule-e.html>), as well as by the UK and Ireland Contest Club and the British Amateur Radio Teledata Group (BARTG).

The Estonian Radio Amateur Union (ERAU) has cancelled this year's ES Open HF Championship, which was due to be held on 16 April.

The Royal Belgian Amateur Radio Union (Belgium's IARU Society) has decided to follow «the actions of the mainstream sporting bodies with regard to all activities of a competitive nature such as contests, awards and ARDF. Russian and Belarusian radio amateurs are therefore currently ineligible to participate in any event that is organised/sponsored by the UBA». The same decision has been taken by Experimenterende Danske Radioamatorer (EDR, the Danish IARU Society).

Einar Enderud, LA1EE passed away on 11 April, aged 79. Back in January-February 1987 he and Kare Pedersen, LA2GV conducted the first ever operation from Peter I Island (3Y1EE and 3Y2GV). He participated in the December 1989-January 1990 DXpedition to Bouvet (3Y5X), and operated also as FO0EEN from Tubuai, Austral Islands (December 1998-January 1999).

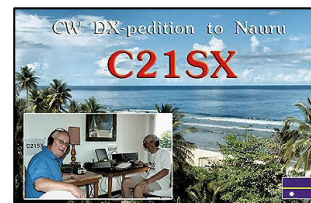
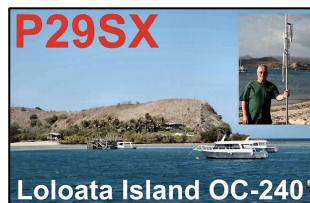
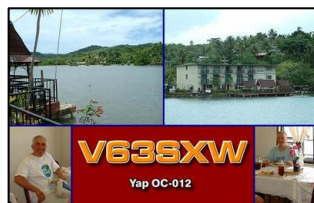
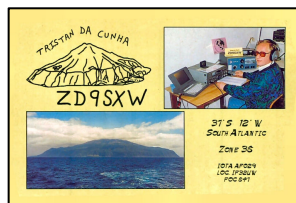
Roger Western, G3SXW passed away on 24 April. He had been either in hospital or in a nursing home since late October 2019, when he fell off a ladder while clearing leaves from the roof gutter on his house and suffered serious injuries.

Born on 1 September 1946 and licensed in 1964, during the Seventies he lived in Iran and operated as EP2IA (1976-1979); he often visited Afghanistan on business and managed to get on the air a few times as YA1R. He was best known, however, for his CW DXpeditions and contesting, so much so that he was inducted into both the CQ Contest Hall of Fame (1998) and the CQ DX Hall of Fame (2007).

His CQ WW DX CW Contest operations with the Three A's Contest Group from Guernsey (1981 and 1982), Jersey (1983-86) and Luxembourg (LX/G0AAA 1987) were followed by 4U0ITU (1989), CN5N (1990), C56N (1991), ZC4Z (1992), ZF2WW (1993). Then it came the glorious season with the Voodoo Contest Group, of which he was a founding member (<https://www.voodoocontestgroup.com/>): 9G5AA (1994), TY5A (1995), 5V7A (1996-98), 9G5AA (1999-2000), XT2DX (2001-02), 5U5Z (2004), TZ5A (2005-06), 3X5A (2007-08), 9L5VT (2010), EL2A (2012) and P3F (2013)

His 100% CW DXpeditions (both solo and with friends, notably G3TXF), included, inter alia, C56/G3SXW (1989), H44SX (1991), 3DA/G3SXW (1992), ZC4SXW (1992), ZD9SXW (1993), XX9TSX (1994), 9N1SXW (1995), FH/G3SXW (2000), S79SXW (2000), FW/G3SXW (2000), VK9CXW (2001), ZL7/G3SXW (2001), V63SXW (2003), TJ3G (2004), P29SX (2004), C21SX (2005), FP/G3SXW (2006), FY/G3SXW (2007), JW/G3SXW (2007), OY/G3SXW (2007), YK9G (2008).

Roger's legacy also includes four books on DXing and contesting: *Up Two. Adventures of a DXpeditioner* (2003), *Contesting in Africa. Multi-Multi on the Equator* (2004), *Micro-DXpeditioning Uncovered* (2008) and *DX Delights. Tales of Travels with my Radio* (2009).
