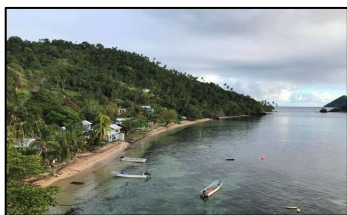

DX INFORMATION



3D2 - Cezar, VE3LYC will be active as 3D2LYC from Yanuca Island (OC-189), Fiji on 1-5 May. He will operate CW and SSB on 30, 20, 17, 15, 12 and 10 metres; his goal is «to make 4000

QSOs with 2500 unique stations located on six continents». QSL via Club Log's OQRS (preferred), or via VE3LYC (direct and bureau). More information can be found on <https://3d2lyc.weebly.com/>.

4W - Ben DL6FBL, Braco E77DX and Robert SP5XVY will



be active as 4W1A from Timor Leste on 12-22 April. They will operate CW, SSB and RTTY on 40-10 metres. This will be a «scouting trip for a larger activity by Lagunaria DX Group in November». QSL via Club Log's OQRS, or

via DJ4MX. See <http://timor-leste-dx.de/> for more information.



4X - Celebrating the 75th anniversary since the foundation of the Israel Amateur Radio Club (IARC) and the establishment of the State of Israel, local amateurs may use special prefixes 4X75 and 4Z75 on 14-30 April (e.g. 4Z4DX may use 4Z75DX, 4X1RE may use 4X75RE, etc.). An award will be available for contacts made with 4X75 and 4Z75 stations, as well as with "regular" 4X and 4Z stations, during that time frame: <https://www.iarc.org/iarc75/>. [TNX 4Z4DX]



5U - Giorgio, IU5HWS will be active again as 5UA99WS from Niamey, Niger between 1 May 1 and 15 June. In his spare time he will be QRV on 40-10m FT8 and SSB. QSL via LoTW, or via EA5GL. [TNX DX World]

7X - 7T60ARA is the special callsign celebrating the 60th



anniversary of Algeria's IARU member society, Amateurs Radio Algériens (ARA). Look for activity between 23 March and 23 April. More information can be found on <https://www.qrz.com/db/7>

8Q - Kasimir, DL2SBY will be active again as 8Q7KB from the Maldives (AS-013) from 27 April to 7 May. He will operate CW, SSB and FT8/FT4 (using MSHV) with a focus on 30, 17, 12, 10 and 6 metres. QSL via LoTW, Club Log's OQRS, or direct to home call. He no longer uses the bureau.



9Q - **Early announcement:** Silvano, I2YSB and the Italian DXpedition Team are in the final planning stages for a DXpedition to the Democratic Republic of the Congo which is expected to take place for a couple of weeks in early September.

9X - Harold, DF2WO will be active again as 9X2AW from Rwanda on 5-15 May. He will operate CW, SSB and digital modes on the HF bands and 6 metres. QSL via M0OXO's OQRS. [TNX The Daily DX]



BY - Ten stations (B0CRA, B1CRA, B2CRA, B3CRA, B4CRA, B5CRA, B6CRA, B7CRA, B8CRA and B9CRA) from across the country will be active on 1-5 May for this year's "5.5 China Amateur Radio Festival" on air event, organized by the Chinese Radio Amateurs Club (CRAC). See

C3 - Operated by EA3NT, MM0NDX, MM0OKG and members of URA (Unió de Radioaficionats Andorrans), look for C37RC to be active on various bands CW, SSB, FT8

and FT4 during the last weekend of April. This operation celebrates DX World's 16th anniversary. QSL via URA (bureau or direct) and LoTW. [TNX DX World]

CN - Celebrating World Amateur Day and IARU's 98th anniversary, Moroccan amateurs are allowed to use special prefix CN98 on 15-20 April. QSL via operator's instructions.

CN - Special callsign 5F15SIA will be active from 25 April to 7 May for the 15th edition of Morocco's International Exhibition of Agriculture (Salon International de l'Agriculture). QSL via LoTW, or direct to CN8WW.

CO - Seven operators (CO2XN, CO8ZZ, KB2FMH, N3QQ, OK8AU, R9LR, UA9OBA) will be active as CO0RRC from Cayo Coco (NA-086), Cuba from 24 April to 3 May. They will operate CW, SSB, FT8 (F/H) and FT4 on 160-6m. QSL via LoTW, Club Log, or via N7RO (RW3RN for



Belarus and Russia). See qrz.com for more information.

CT7 - Markus, DJ4EL will be active as CT7/DJ4EL from Culatra Island (EU-145) on 6-10 April. He will operate SSB on 40-10 metres. QSL via Club Log's OQRS and LoTW. [TNX DX World]

CY9 - **Early announcement:** the CY0S team, along with members of the previous CY9C DXpeditions, have announced their plans to go back to St. Paul Island (NA-094) in July-August 2024.

DL - Special callsign DR0LIMES will be active between 1 April and 30 June for this year's German World Heritage Day (4 June). The *limes* was the border line of the Roman Empire at its greatest extent. In 2005, the remnants of the Upper German-Raetian Limes were inscribed on the UNESCO World Heritage list as «Frontiers of the Roman Empire».

DL - Special event callsign DM23BUGA will be active from 9 April to 8 October. All QSOs will be confirmed automatically via the bureau; direct cards via DL2VFR. The suffix stands for *Bundesgartenschau*, the biennial horticulture show and festival that this year will take place in Mannheim.



DU - Jairus, 4F1DY will be active on 40-10 metres SSB as 4F1DY/2 from Calayan Island (OC-092) on 21-23 April. He also plans to be QRV from Palawan Island (OC-128) on 4-7

May, and from Jomalig Island (OC-091) on 9- 11 May. QSL via EA5GL. [TNX DX World]

DX0 - The DX0NE DXpedition to Kalayaan, Pag-asa Island, Spratly Islands (AS-051) [425DXN 1647] is now scheduled to take place from 30 April to 9 May. Gil, 4F2KWT will be the only operator; one of his two radios will be dedicated to FT8 using MSHV. The pilot station will be Nic, DU1NA (dx0ne.pagasa@gmail.com): «Internet on the island will be spotty», Gil says, «and I may only be able to check messages sporadically». QSL via Club Log's OQRS (preferred), or via IZ8CCW. See <https://www.mdxc.support/dx0ne/> for possible updates.

EA - Representing the three provinces of Aragon, special callsigns AM23SJH (Huesca), AM23SJT (Teruel) and AM23SJJ (Zaragoza) will be activated on 23 April to celebrate Day of Aragon and the name-day of San Jorge (St. George, Aragon's patron saint). All QSOs will be confirmed automatically via the bureau.



F - Jean, F8CHM will be active as TM1AI from Aix Island (EU-032) on 13-16 April. He will operate CW and SSB on 80, 40, 20, 15 and 10 metres. QSL

via home call.

F - Special callsign TM50IS will be activated on 22-30 April from the city of Abbeville and other locations in the Bay of Somme (TM50IS/p) during the 32nd edition of the Bird and Nature Festival. QSL via F5KRH.



F - Members of the Radio Club de Provins (F6KOP) will be active as TM45KOP on all bands and modes from 29 April to 13 May to celebrate their club's 45th anniversary. QSL via LoTW (preferred), or via F5GSJ.

FP - Georg, DK7LX has been active as FP/DK7LX from St Pierre et Miquelon (NA-032) since 18 April, length of stay unknown. In his spare time he operates CW. QSL via Club Log's OQRS; he does not use LoTW.



G - Celebrating the 85th anniversary of the First Class CW Operators' Club (<https://www.q4foc.org/>), special callsign GB85FOC will be used by a number of different members during the month of May. QSL via LoTW, or G3SWH's OQRS (<https://www.q3swh.org.uk/decision.html>).

G - Radio amateurs in the United Kingdom and Crown Dependencies may use a special Regional Secondary Locator on 1 May-30 June to celebrate the Coronation of King Charles III (alternatively, they can append the suffix '23C' to their callsigns).

The RSL - i.e. the second letter in the existing callsign (D, I, J, M, U and W, plus E for Intermediate licences) - may be replaced by the letter 'R'; where no RSL exists, the letter 'R' may be added. Club Log will map all the GR/MR/2R callsigns to England, unless a callsign exception exists for

the station. A number of awards will be available; see <https://rsgb.org/coronation> for the details.

Also taking part in the celebrations will be a number of GB special callsigns, including stations from England (GB0KCC, GB0KCH, GB1KC, GB2KCC, GB3KCR, GB4HCC, GB4KC, GB4RLS), Jersey (GB3KCC) and Northern Ireland (GB0KC, GB8KC, GB8KCC, GB9HRH) to name a few. QSL, if any, via operators' instructions



G - GB23C will be the Flagship Special Event Station to mark the Coronation of King Charles III. Manned by members of the Cray Valley Radio Society and located in the Monument Gardens of

the Old Royal Naval College in Greenwich, the station will be active round-the-clock from late 3 May until around 8 UTC on 9 May on 80-10 metres SSB and CW, as well as on 6 metres and 2 metres. On 10 May the callsign will be available for individuals and clubs to use until the end of June. See <https://www.cvr.org/gb23c/> for more information. QSL via M0OXO's OQRS.

GM - A team of six (namely 2E0NSQ, G0AZE, G0VQO, M0EBJ, M0GLV and M0KVK) will be active as GB0SIM from the Isle of Muck (EU-008) on 16-20 April. They plan to operate CW, SSB and possibly FT8 on 160-10 metres with two stations. QSL direct to G0AZE; the log will be uploaded to Club Log, LoTW and eQSL.

GM - A large group of Camb Hams will be active as G53PYE from the island of Islay (EU-008) from 30 April to 6 May. Look for them on 160-10m CW, SSB and digital modes, plus via QO-100 on SSB. There may be some SOTA or Worked All Britain activity from Islay and possibly Jura. QSL via LoTW and Club Log's OQRS only. [TNX G3ZAY]

H4 - Michael, DL2GMI expects to be active again as H44MI from Malaita Island (OC-047), Solomon Islands on 4-10 April. He will operate SSB, RTTY and some CW on 80, 40, 20, 17, 15, 12 and 10 metres. QSL via LoTW, Club Log's OQRS, or via DL2GMI (direct or bureau).

H4 - Early announcement: N7JP, N7QT, N9ADG, NU7J and WA7CPA will be active as H44WA from the Solomon Islands in March 2024. Updates will be posted to <http://www.h44wa.com/>.

HK0/A - Look for HK0/PY7RP, HK0/PY7XC and HK0/PY8WW to be active from San Andres Island (NA-033) on 4-11 May. They will operate SSB, CW and FT8 on 40-6 metres, with a focus on the higher bands and a dedicated 6m station running 24/7. Also, look for HK0/PY8WW to be QRV from Providencia (NA-049) on 1-3 May. QSL HK0/PY7RP via Club Log's OQRS or direct to home call (and later LoTW); QSL HK0/PY7XC via LoTW or direct to PT7WA (he will also upload his log to Club Log); QSL HK0/PY8WW via Club Log's OQRS or direct to home call.

HP - Nuria, EA3WL and Josep, EA3BT will be active holiday style as H31W and H31B, respectively, from Contadora Island (NA-072) on 3-8 April. They will operate SSB, CW and FT8 (F/H) on 40-6 metres. QSL via Club Log's OQRS.



HV - Look for HV0A to be active on CW only from the Vatican City on 2 April starting around 7 UTC. QSL via LoTW, or direct to IK0FVC.



HV - HV1CN will be QRV again from Vatican Radio's headquarters for the International Marconi Day. Look for activity on 22 April from 7 to 13 UTC. Plans are to operate CW and SSB on 40 metres and possibly other bands, as well as CW, SSB and FT8 via QO-100. QSL via LoTW; paper cards via the bureau to IQ0CV, or direct to IK0PHU. Vatican Radio, the official broadcasting service of Vatican City, was established in 1931 by Guglielmo Marconi.

I - Look for IY0CG, IY0GA (Sardinia), IY0IMD, IY0MMR, IY0ORP, IY0TC, IY1MR, IY1SM, IY1SP, IY1TO, IY4FGM, IY5PIS, IY6GM and IY7M to be active during the Interna-

tional Marconi Day (22 April). QSL via operators' instructions. These stations are affiliated to the Coordinamento Stazioni Marconiane Italiane which gathers amateur radio stations operating from historic Marconi sites located in Italy (<http://csmi.altervista.org/wp/>).

I - Ninety-five years ago (25 May 1928) the airship *Italia* crashed on the ice on its way back from the North Pole, and a small tent dyed red for maximum visibility was the only shelter for the survivors. Commemorating the role of radio (and amateur radio) in rescuing the Red Tent survivors, special callsign **II1ITR** will be active on 80, 40, 20, 15 and 10 metres SSB and CW from 25 May to 12 July. QSL via **IZ1ETD**. See <https://www.qrz.com/db/II1ITR> for more information.



JA - Take, **J13DST** will be active from Miyako Island (AS-079) from 17 April to 15 May. He will operate SSB and CW as **JS6RRR** (including participation in the CQ WW WPX CW Contest), **J13DST/6**, **JJ5RBH/6** and **JR8YLY/6**, as well as **J13DST/p**, **JJ5RBH/p** and **JR8YLY/p** on FT8. The QSOs will be made available for Club Log and LoTW Matching on the IOTA website.

JA - Look for **JE1HXZ/6** to be active from Kuroshima, Yaeyama Islands (AS-024) from 28 April to 8 May. He will operate CW, SSB, RTTY, FT8 and FT4 on the HF bands and 6 metres. QSL via the bureau and LoTW.

JA - Look for Kenji, **JA4GXS** to be active as **JA4GXS/6** from Amami O Island (AS-023) on 6-8 May. He will operate CW, SSB and FT8 on 40, 20, 15, 10 and 6m. QSL via home call, direct or bureau. [TNX The Daily DX]

JD1_oga - Once again Harry, **JG7PSJ** will be active as **JD1BMH** from Chichijima (AS-031), Ogasawara from 22 April to 5 May. He will operate CW, SSB and RTTY on 40-10 metres. JW - Thomas, **DC8TM** and Martina, **DF3TS** will be active as **JW/DC8TM** and **JW/DF3TS** from Longyearbyen (EU-026), Svalbard on 9-12 April. They will operate SSB and FT8. QSL via home calls.

JW - Thomas, **DC8TM** and Martina, **DF3TS** will be active as **JW/DC8TM** and **JW/DF3TS** from Longyearbyen (EU-026), Svalbard on 9-12 April. They will operate SSB and FT8. QSL via home calls.

OE - Special event station **OE23M** will be activated to take part in the International Marconi Day (22 April). QSL via **OE1YPP** (bureau) or direct to **DokuFunk**, **OE23M**, **An den Steinfeldern 4A**,

OZ - A team of seven Belgian operators (**ON1BN**, **ON4AWT**, **ON6EF**, **ON6VJ**, **ON7TA**, **ON7VM** and **ON9DJ**) will be active as **5P5FI** from Fano Island (EU-125) on 22-29 April. They will operate SSB, CW and FT8 on 160-6 metres with three stations. QSL via **ON6EF**, direct or bureau.

PA - On 5 May 1923 the Governor General of the Netherlands East Indies



opened officially the two-way telegraphy radio service from Radio Malabar (callsign **PKX**) to Radio Kootwijk in the Netherlands (callsign **PCG**). Celebrating the 100th anniversary of those pioneer stations in the

field of long-range long-wave telegraphic communication, special event stations **PA100K**, **PA100M** and **PA100PCG** will be active from 5 May to 30 June. All QSOs will be confirmed automatically via the bureau. Also taking part in the celebrations will be special event station **8A100K** from Indonesia (5-13 May). A certificate will be available; detailed information can be found on <https://radioclublumburg.nl/mk/index.html>.



PY - Team **ZY1M** will be active from Maricas Island (SA-079) on 14-16 April. Updates will be posted to <https://www.qrz.com/db/ZY1M>.



QSL via **PY1AA** (direct or bureau), LoTW, eQSL.
PY - Beto, **PY6RT** and Jose, **PY6HD** will be active as **PR6T** from Tinhare Island (SA-080) on 20-23 April. They will operate SSB and FT8 (using **MSHV**) on 40, 20, 15 and 10 metres. QSL via Club Log's **OQRS** and LoTW.



PY - Team **PR5M** will be active from Mel Island (SA-047) on 21-23 April. They will operate CW and SSB on 20, 15, 10 metres (maybe also 30m). QSL via **PP5BZ** (direct or bureau), and LoTW.

SV - **SX50AHH** is a special callsign for Polydoros, **SV1AHH** to celebrate his golden jubilee in amateur radio. Operated from Greece by **SV1JFL**, **SV1QVA**, **SV1GGF** and **SV1AHH** himself, the callsign will be used on 10-28 April on 160-10 metres CW, SSB, FT8, FT4 and RTTY. The logs will be uploaded to eQSL, LoTW, Club Log; paper cards will not be available.



T30 - The **T30UN** operation from West Kiribati (**OC-017**) [425DXN 1664] is now expected to start on 10 April in the local early afternoon (**T30** is UTC +12 hours) for about five weeks. Plans

are to be **QRV** on 160-6 metres with one CW station, one

SSB station and seven FT8 stations. It will be possible to see two FT8 stations on the same band at the same time on different frequencies, The band plan can be found on <https://www.qrz.com/db/T30UN>; updates will be posted to <https://www.facebook.com/rebeldxgroup>. QSL via Club Log's OQRS.

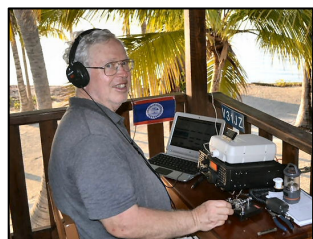
T31 - After their T30UN operation from West Kiribati, the Rebel DX Group will be active as T31TT from Kanton Island, Central Kiribati (OC-043) starting during the first week of June for 9-10 days. In 2016 the Rebels operated from Kanton as T31T. Bookmark <https://www.facebook.com/rebeldxgroup> for updates.

T8 - Ichy, JH7IPR will be active again as T88UW from Koror (OC-009), Palau 14-20 April. He will focus on 12 and 10 metres CW and FT8, and on 6 metres all modes. QSL via Club Log's OQRS, LoTW or via home call (direct or bureau).



UA - A very large number of Russian stations using special prefix RP78 (where the letter P stands for *pobeda*, i.e. "victory") will be active on 1-9 May to celebrate the 78th anniversary of the end of World War II. See <https://pobeda.srr.ru/> for more information, including the list of participating stations and their QSL routes.

UA0 - Team RI0Z (namely R7AA, RM0F, UA6EX and UA7A) will be active from Bering Island, one of the Komandorskiye Islands (AS-039), from 18 August to 1 September. QSL via Club Log's OQRS (direct and bureau), or via R7AA. Bookmark <https://dxpedition.wixsite.com/ri0z/> for updates.



V3 - Art, NN7A will be active as V31JZ/p from South Water Caye (NA-180), Belize on 17-23 April. He will operate CW and possibly some SSB on 80-10 metres. QSL via Club Log, LoTW, or via home call (direct and bureau).

VE - Radio Amateurs of Canada is once again holding a «Get on the Air on World Amateur Radio Day» special event in which it encourages as many amateurs as possible to contact as many RAC stations as possible. Operating across Canada from 00.00 UTC to 23.59 UTC on 18 April, the RAC official stations will be VA2RAC, VA3RAC, VE1RAC, VE4RAC, VE5RAC, VE6RAC, VE7RAC, VE8RAC, VE9RAC, VO1RAC, VO2RAC, VY0RAC, VY1RAC and VY2RAC. QSL via LoTW or via the bureau. Those contacting one or more RAC stations, on any band and mode, will be eligible for a certificate: <https://www.rac.ca/certificates/>.



VE - Canada is an independent country, but the British monarch remains the nation's head of state. Celebrating the Coronation of King Charles III, Canadian radio amateurs are permitted to replace their normal prefix from 5 May to 2 July: VA stations can use CJ, VE stations can use CK, VO stations can use CY, and VY stations can use CZ.

VK - VK100ZL is the callsign issued for members of the Wireless Institute of Australia (WIA) to use from 26 April

to 25 July. The special event callsign commemorates the 100th anniversary of the first Trans-Tasman amateur radio contact, made on 26 April 1923 between Frank Bell (later known as Z4AA) at Shag Valley in Otago and Charles Maclurcan (2CM) in Sydney.

VK - VI2023HRH is the special callsign for members of the Wireless Institute of Australia to celebrate the coronation of King Charles III on 1-31 May. QSL via operator's instructions.

VP2V - Seth, KD9TAW will be active as VP2V/KD9TAW from Tortola, British Virgin Islands (NA-023) on 17-22 April. He will operate FT8 and SSB on 40, 20, 17, 15 and 10 metres. QSL via LoTW and Club Log.

VP5 - John, W0UV will be active as VP5/W0UV from Providenciales (NA-002), Turks and Caicos Islands on 4-11 April. He will operate FT8 on 40-10 metres. QSL via LoTW; paper cards will not be available.

VP5 - W2FQ, KC8RP and W1WV will be active as VQ5Q from Providenciales (NA-002), Turks and Caicos on 20-27 April. They will operate CW, SSB and FT8 on 80-10 metres. QSL via LoTW, Club Log's OQRS, or direct to W2FQ. [TNX The Daily DX]

VP8 - Special callsign VP8KCC will be used from the Falkland Islands on 6-7 May to celebrate the Coronation of King Charles III. [TNX The Daily DX]

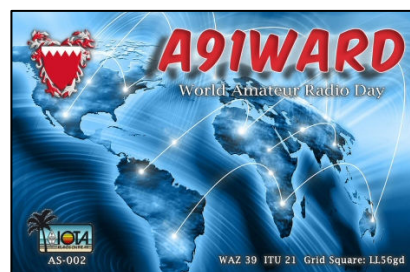
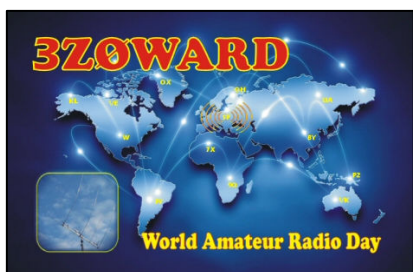

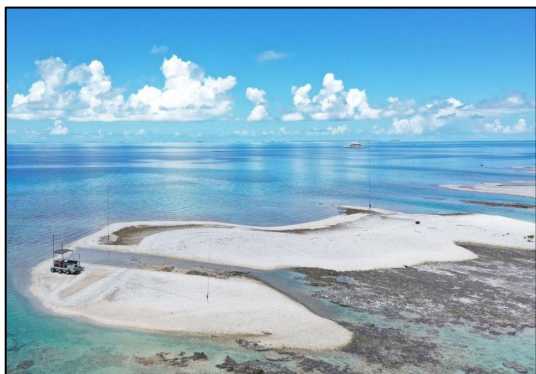

FO/AA7JV

On 10 April Northern California DX Foundation Directors successfully concluded their 11-day ground-breaking experiment from Tikehau Atoll in the Tuamutu Islands, French Polynesia, with a remotely operated DXpedition. While FO is not rare for DXCC, Tikehau (OC-066) was needed by 72% of the active IOTA chasers.

George, AA7JV and Mike, KN4EEI Mike, arrived at Tikehau on the morning of 28 March and deployed two RIBs (Radio In a Box) in a matter of hours. In addition to their CW and SSB QSOs done locally (from the ship), a total of over 11,000 FT8 QSOs were completed remotely. The remote operators were N1DG, AA7A, K6MM, K6GFJ and ND2T. The station was accessible 24/7 using home computers and desktop sharing software. No specialized hardware or software was required. The operators were working from their homes in shifts, just like on a regular DXpedition, without the cost and hassle of traveling.



This operation did not use any unattended operation (as required by ARRL DXCC rules). All callsigns were selected by the operators for a QSO. The remotely operated stations were connected to the Internet via a Starlink satellite connection. Operating mode was FT8 and FT8 F/H. The radios were Flex 6700 radios housed in the NCDXF sponsored RIB stations that were put ashore by AA7JV and KN4EEI. Operating power was 100 watts and each station had its own vertical antenna. AC power was provided by Honda EU2100 generators running in the ECO mode. The stations were on the island unattended, with remote supervision and control from the catamaran Magnet, which was anchored a mile off-shore.

The NCDXF RIB is a complete, fully wired station in a weather-tight box. The RIB integrated a Flex 6700 SDR radio, an amplifier, power supplies and a comprehensive Raspberry Pi based control system developed by KD4Z. The RIBs were designed to eliminate the need for camping and to make DXpedition set-up faster (hours, instead of days). In this Remote DXpedition experiment a dual-radio version of the RIB was used, which contains two complete 100 W stations in a single box. A RIB will be shown at the NCDXF booth at the International DX Convention in Visalia (22 April), and plans are also being made to allow convention goers to operate the RIB Friday evening.



In development and testing since early 2022, the NCDXF Remote RIB technology is aimed at future DXpeditions. It is intended to enable remote operators to participate in DXpeditions without the expense and lengthy travel usually involved. Kevin Rowett, K6TD, President of NCDXF commented: «remote DX operation will bring the opportunity to participate in DXpeditions and share the excitement of handling the pile-ups to a wide range of radio amateurs. It will also allow future DXpeditions to have a smaller number of on-site operators, reducing the expenses and footprint of future DXpeditions». Ken, WZ0L wrote us: «Now that's the way to activate an island».

The NCDXF mission is to make DX happen. The NCDXF has been aware for some time that financing is not the only obstacle faced by would be DXpeditioners. The NCDXF has sponsored the development of the RIB technology to lower the threshold of obtaining landing permits to ecologically sensitive areas.



Later in 2023 the Magnet hopes to visit other DX locations, including an entity or two in the top 20 most wanted. We trust this just concluded operation is one of the final steps in demonstrating to the permitting services that limited intrusion to the island is possible and Amateur Radio can be made eco friendly.

Please refrain from sending direct QSL requests to his QSL manager, but wait until Club Log's OQRS is enabled. Also please note that after processing incoming requests for direct cards, all of the remaining QSOs will be confirmed automatically via the bureau. [TNX IT9EJW]

The winner of the award is determined by the NCDXF Board of Directors. The board considers several factors, including performance, complexity of the DXpedition, and impact on Club Log's most wanted ranking. Especially important are activities associated with humanitarian efforts and education». The second DXcellence Award has been conferred on Thierry Mazel, F6CUK. He «is recognized for the outstanding performance of a well-organized DXpedition to Crozet, FT8WW, that had a significant impact on Club Log users' totals from the #3 Most Wanted entity».

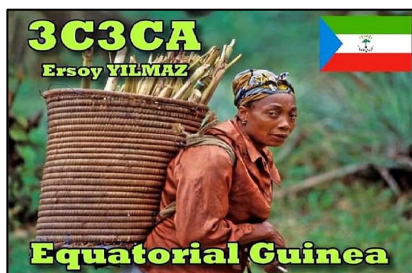
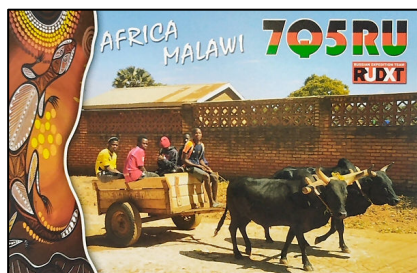
VPO CALLSIGNS • Under the new licensing regulations, VP8 callsigns will only cover the Falkland Islands. South Georgia and the South Sandwich Islands have been allocated the prefixes VPOG and VPOS, respectively. In the near future the British Antarctic Territory (which includes the South Shetland Islands and the South Orkney Islands) is likely to be using VPO prefixed callsigns as well.

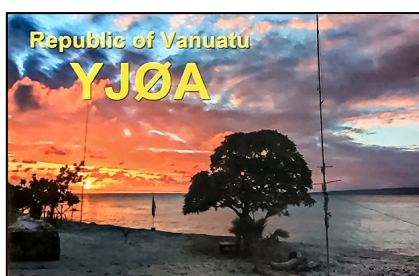
