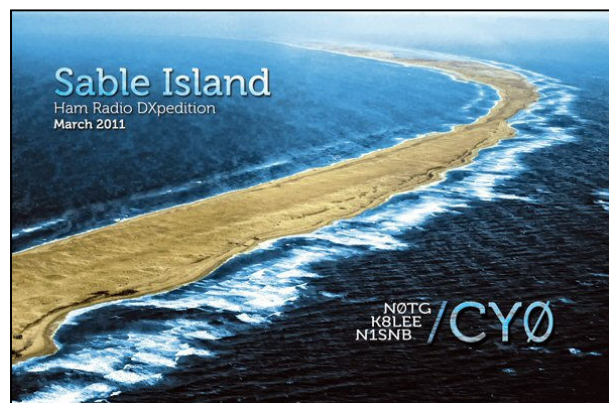

DX INFORMATION

4J - 4K4B, 4L5A, 4J5T and 4K6AE will be active as 4J0SFR and/or 4J0LH from Absheron lighthouse (ARLHS AZE-006) on 25-27 March. They will operate CW and SSB on the HF bands, with possible activity also from Shuvalan (AZE-007) and Amburan (AZE-008) lighthouses. [TNX RW6HS]

4W - David, VK2CZ plans to be active on 80-15 metres as 4W3A from Timor Leste for some 40 hours during the CQ WPX SSB Contest (26-27 March). QSL via M0OXO (QSLing instructions at www.m0oxo.com). [TNX NG3K]

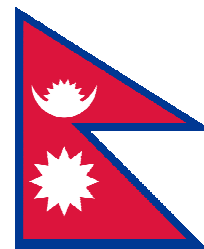

It is also suggested to stay away from the IARU Region 3 Emergency Centre of Activity frequencies (3600, 7110, 14300, 18160 and 21360 kHz).

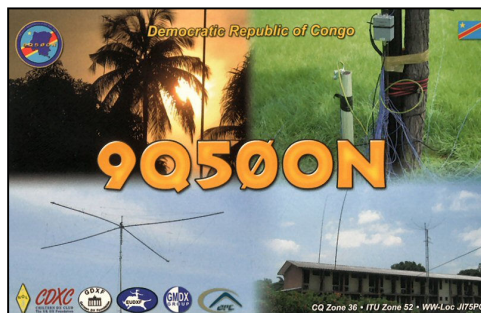
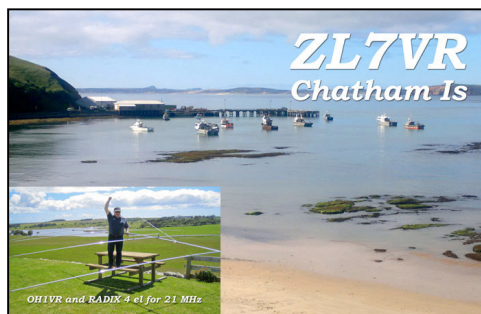
