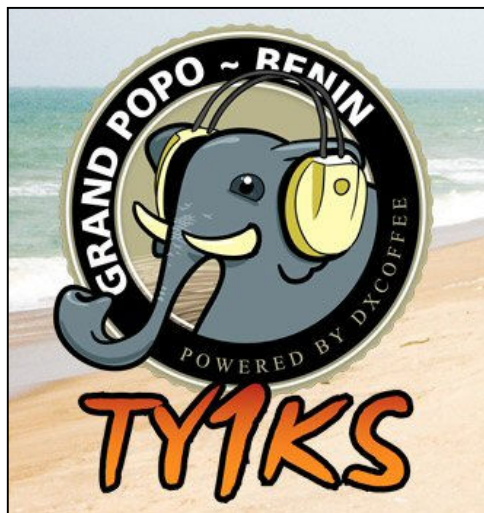

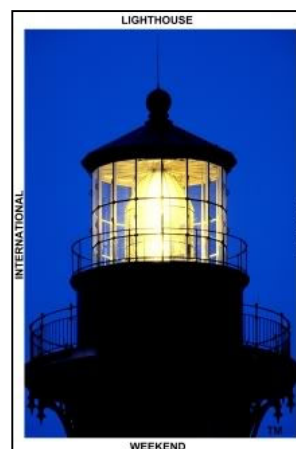

DX INFORMATION

5W - Lance, W7GJ (5W0GJ) will conduct a 6m EME DXpedition to Samoa on 22-31 August. QSL direct to home call. Further information, including details on the QSO procedure that he uses "most effectively during these types of operations", can be found at <http://www.bigskyspaces.com/w7qj/Samoa2011.htm>

7P - Expect 7P8FM (QSL via ZS4FM) and 7P8DEF (QSL via ZS4DEF) to be active from Lesotho until 9 August. Look for activity on 160, 80, 40, 30, 20, 15 and 10 metres SSB, typically between 5-8 UTC and 14-22 UTC. [TNX The Daily DX]

7P - Peter, EI7CC will be active again as 7P8PB from Lesotho on 18-30 August. This will be mainly a family holiday, and he will be QRV when circumstances permit. QSL via EI7CC, direct or bureau, and LoTW (logs will be uploaded on a daily basis to LoTW if at all possible). [TNX EI7CC]

The team for next year's **HK0NA** DXpedition to **Malpelo** [425DXN 1041] is now complete and includes HK1MW, HK1N, HK1R, HK1T, HK1X, HK3JJH, DJ9ZB, K4UEE, K5YY, LU9ESD, OH0XX, VE7CT, W6IZT, WB9Z and YV5SSB/6. They will depart from Buenaventura, Colombia on 22 January 2012 for the 235 mile voyage to Malpelo. Depending on sea and landing conditions, they expect to be QRV within 36 hours after landing for about 10-12 days. The team will return to Buenaventura on 6 February. Operations are planned on 160-6 metres on CW, SSB and digital modes, from two operating sites with 6-7 stations QRV on open bands. "Our antennas will be strategically deployed to maximize our signal and to ensure DXers worldwide will have an opportunity to QSO us. We expect to dedicate one antenna solely to Asia as that direction is usually blocked by a mountain top". QSL via N200.
