

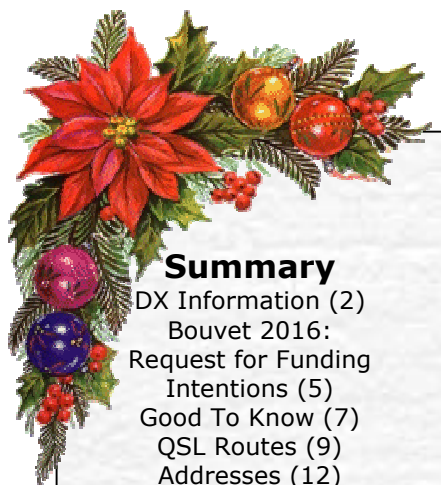

DX INFORMATION

1A0 - DX Friends Team will be active as 1AOC from the Sovereign Military Order of Malta from 28 December to 6 January. The activity is in support of the fundraising campaign to finance medical assistance to the migrants in the Mediterranean Sea. Ten operators (DL8YHR, EA5HPX, EA5KM, EA5RM, EA7AJR, IN3ZNR, IW0DJB, IZ4AKS, IZ7KHR and JH4RHF) will operate CW, SSB and RTTY on 160-6 metres with at least three stations and a focus on working Japan and the North American West Coast. They also plan to have a station active on 144 and 432 MHz EME. QSL via IZ7KHR (QSLing policy on www.1a0c.com); logsearch and OQRS on Club Log. [TNX IZ8IYX]

3A - Jose, EA5IDQ will be active as 3A/EA5IDQ from Monaco on 28-30 December. He will operate SSB and RTTY on 40-10 metres. QSL via EA5IDQ. [TNX NG3K]

4X - Members of the Holyland DX Group will be active as 4X0WFF from the Mamshit National Park (a UNESCO World Heritage site) on 26-27 December. They will operate CW and SSB with two stations. "Purpose of the activity will be theoretical and practical training and refresher courses" for the local operators. E5 - To celebrate the 50th anniversary of self governance in the Cook Islands, the seven resident radio amateurs will be granted the use of a special call sign from 1 January through 31 December 2015: E50A (Andy E51AND), E50B (Bob E51BQ), E50J (Jim E51JD), E50K (Kat E51CK/E51KC) and E50V (Victor E51CG) are on Rarotonga (OC-013), South Cooks; E50D (Des E51DD) is on Aitutaki (OC-083), South Cooks; E50W (Warwick E51WL) is on Penrhyn (OC-082), North Cooks. "We are pretty isolated, have extremely limited Internet access and none of us are avid DXers - much more the rag chewing types", Andy E51AND says. Nobody uses eQSL or LoTW, although Andy is "working at it". Visitors to the islands wishing to operate will be eligible only for the standard E51xxx style calls. [TNX E51AND]

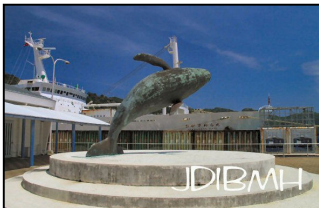

KP1- On 20 December the K1N team reported that "progress in preparations for a late January landing on Navassa is coming along very well". A container is being shipped from Atlanta to the staging point in the Caribbean. The exact dates for the expedition will be known at the end of December. Bob, N2OO is the chief pilot and has organized a worldwide team to collect reports and suggestions from the various target areas (click on the 'Our Team' tab on the DXpedition's website to identify your pilot and his contact information). Feedback will be "prioritized, filtered and/or condensed to pass along to the team at least daily". Follow K1N on Twitter



(@navassa2015) and check out their Facebook page (www.facebook.com/2015Navassa). The cost of the K1N operation is very high and the time to raise the money needed to fully fund

the project is very short. The first half of the nearly \$200,000 for the helicopter transportation has been paid. By the end of this year another \$95-97,000 must be paid to the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service for the transportation of the required law enforcement team. The 15 operators have contributed \$157,500 toward the K1N operation, roughly half of what it will cost. DX Foundations, Radio Clubs, and individuals have been "exceptionally generous" in their financial support, but the K1N team still needs to raise "a significant amount of additional money" before the operation commences in late January. McAuliffe's famous single-word reply in response to a surrender ultimatum). QSL via ON4CFB, direct or bureau (OQRS on Club Log).

P4 - Tom, K8CX will be active as P40CX from Aruba (SA-036) on 9-16 December. He will be QRV on 160-6 metres and participate in the ARRL 10 Meter Contest (<http://www.arrl.org/10-meter>) as a mixed-mode entrant. QSL via home call, direct or bureau. [TNX K8CX]

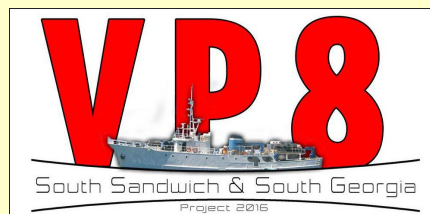

On 8 January a team of fourteen (JH4RHF, K1LZ, K3LP, K3VN, K4ZLE, K6TD, K9CT, N2WB, N6HC, N6PSE, NA6M, RA9USU, VE7CT and WD5COV) will depart the Falkland Islands on the RV Braveheart and embark on a 32-day voyage encompassing South Sandwich and South Georgia Islands. Plans are to be QRV on 160-10 metres CW, SSB and RTTY with six stations for eight days from each location, weather and sea conditions permitting. The primary focus is "completing eight days of activation at South Sandwich Island as it is most needed by the global DX community. If we are delayed in getting to or leaving South Sandwich, we will sacrifice time at South Georgia". QSL via N2CW, direct or bureau (preferably through the OQRS on Club Log). The budget for the DXpedition is USD 425,000, and donations are gratefully accepted. BOUVET 2016: REQUEST FOR FUNDING INTENTIONS by Mark Demeuleneere, ON4WW

Dear DXer,

On 26 October 2014 an announcement was made through various channels that I had obtained permission to land and reside on Bouvet Island (3Y/B) for the mid-January 2016 until mid-April 2016 time frame.

On the webpage <http://www.on4ww.be/bouvet2016.html> an extensive description of the project as well as a request for (exclusive) funding was put forward.

On 19 November 2014 I sent a request for funding intentions to the various DX Foundations, DX Clubs, Radio Amateur Organizations and some of the corporate material providers.

Today I am addressing you as an individual DXer who has actively contributed towards the success of one or more of the fairly recent major DXpeditions.

On 11 November 2014 Alex/UN7PCZ announced a two week DXpedition to Bouvet Island during the December 2015 - January 2016 time frame. I do not at all see this as a competing project, and welcome this great news.

The fact of a large group going to Bouvet has convinced me even more that I should try to obtain funding through a single/exclusive sponsor, as extensively outlined at <http://www.on4ww.be/bouvet2016.html#funding>.

Two main reasons for this would be to 1) off-load the financial burden from the ham community (in case the sponsor doesn't want a financial return but has other plans with the project), and 2) for me to be able to focus on the DXpedition logistics, rather than having to search for finances.

In case I manage to secure an exclusive sponsor for this project, it would obviously be favorable if this sponsor does not

specifically seek a financial return. In the opposite scenario I will have to turn to the ham community, investigating what is feasible in terms of financial support.

The subsequent question: what financial support would you be able to pledge for this project? This is no formal request for funding, I am only asking for your intentions in order to assess the financial feasibility of the project - with the scenario outlined above.

The forecasted budget is put at 250,000 euro (+/- 310,000 USD), which is far less than a larger group operating for a shorter period of time would require. Furthermore, this is a generous forecast, I expect the final budget to ultimately be less.

In the last month I received donation pledges from individual DXers ranging from 15 to 3,400 euro. To give you an idea what would be needed to reach 250,000 euro: if each of the addressees on this list would pledge 55 euro (70 USD), Bouvet 2016 would be a fact.

This of course I can neither ask nor expect, it is just a mathematical example of what is required financially.

Another important aspect to me is the transparency and control of funding. Every cent raised for this project will be registered through the non-profit organization 'Peter I - Antarctica Expedition 1994' (renamed 'Antennes zonder Grenzen - Antennes sans Frontieres' in 1995). This organization was formed in 1993 by Peter ON6TT, with the goal of transparent accountability for every cent spent on the 3Y0PI DXpedition - visible to the entire expedition team. Good accounts make good friends!

You will notice further below what my intentions are in regard to QSLing: I want people to be able to receive bureau cards, get instant LoTW, e-QSL and Club Log confirmation. This is important to me: I don't want youngsters and less fortunate radio hams having to pay for a QSO with Bouvet. Call me idealistic/philanthropic/ideological, but it does indeed matter to me. With the upcoming of the 3Y0F-group, many of you may decide to put your bets on that project. However, in the event that the UN7PCZ-group withdraws its plans (it wouldn't be the first time a major DXpedition is cancelled), my Bouvet project will probably be the only one in many years to come.

Here is an excerpt of the operational plan:

- projected number of QSOs: 100,000
- QSL: bureau, direct, OQRS, in the way people want it
- log: daily uploads to LoTW, Club Log, e-QSL through proper satellite link
- all HF bands CW/SSB + RTTY on 2 or 3 bands
- antennas: verticals/inv-V's in various constellations and inv-L's will be the only manageable type of antennas that won't break down on Bouvet - with sufficient spares brought along
- radios and amps: I will take what I am comfortable with, well proven and sturdy radios and amps, three of each device
- 24/7 operation during 3 months (with adequate rest periods), mitigating the impact of the Antarctic black-outs known from past expeditions of shorter duration
- operator: one
- I already have several offers from QSL-managers for (free) QSLing (a decision on what to ask for OQRS has not been made; it should be as low cost as possible so everybody can enjoy this service)

I would highly appreciate your response within the next few weeks. By the end of this year I will make a decision whether or not to proceed with the project. In the event that I am not able to secure an exclusive sponsor and at the same time the projected sponsoring from within the ham community would be sufficient, it will be a challenging decision.

Regardless if you are able to foresee financial support to this project or not, I would appreciate if a lead or an introduction to a potential exclusive sponsor would be considered. It is still my favorable prospect for funding, and I thank you in advance for any assistance on that front.

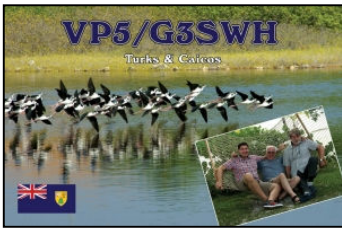

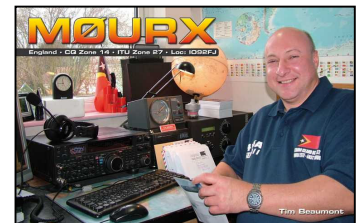

The only RSGB members that I look after and that do collect incoming QSL cards are G1VDP, MOURX, OY1OF and PJ4DX". For all other call signs, and especially all DXpeditions, you must refrain from sending traditional paper cards through the bureau system; instead use Tim's OQRS facility (www.mourx.com/oqrs/) and select the bureau option. All of outgoing bureau cards are sent to all IARU world bureaux every four months (in February, June and October) at Tim's expense, and not via the RSGB Bureau.

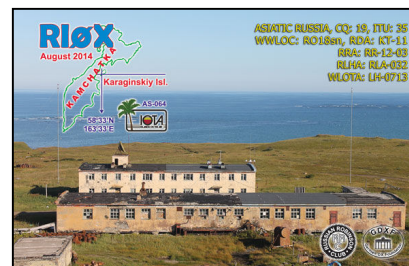
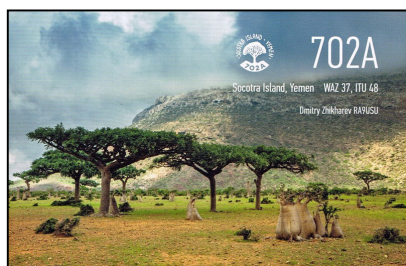


WRTC2018: TEAM SELECTION CRITERIA • The WRTC2018 Organizing Committee has announced the Team Selection Criteria for the World Radiosport Team Championship to be held in Germany in July 2018. There will be 49 Team Leaders selected through 32 qualifying events (30 for DL, 28 for the rest of Europe and 26 for the rest of the world) between February 2015 and November 2016. Team Leaders will be selected on the basis of their 12 best scores compared to others in their Selection Area. The first qualifying event will be the ARRL International DX Contest CW 2015. In addition, there will be up to 14 Special Teams, including the defending champions (N6MJ and KL9A), three Youth Teams (for applicants born after 14 July 1993), up to five Sponsored Teams and up to five Wild Card Teams. 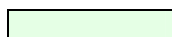


+ SILENT KEYS + Jorg "Joe" Puchstein, **DL8WPX** (ex Y54PL, Y41RM and Y21RM, aka YB6AVE from Sumatra and YB1AQS from Java) passed away suddenly on 16 December at 54 years of age. 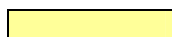

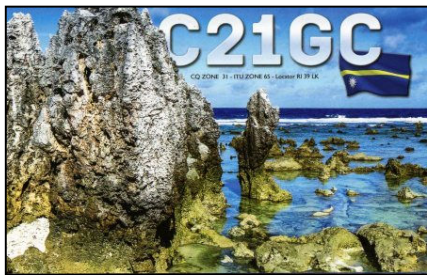

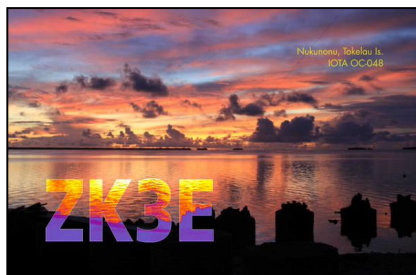
