

DX INFORMATION

3D2/R - Tony, 3D2AG is unable to join the 3D2EU DXpedition to Rotuma (OC-060) [425DXN 1387]. The remaining four team members (DJ9RR, DK2AMM, DL6JGN and PA3EWP) will be QRV from one QTH, instead of the originally planned two different operating locations. Plans are still to operate CW, SSB and digital modes on 160-10 metres (60m excluded) with two stations from 23 February to 16 March. Plans are for 3Z9DX and a few other operators to spend a couple of weeks on Bouvet Island sometime during the subantarctic summer.



ARRL INTERNATIONAL DX CONTEST (CW) • Object of the contest is for W/VE amateurs to work as many stations in as many DXCC Entities as possible on 160, 80, 40, 20, 15, and 10 metre bands, while DX stations (also including KH6, KL7, CY9 and CY0) work as many W/VE amateurs in as many of the 48 contiguous states and provinces as possible (complete rules can be found at <http://www.arrl.org/arrl-dx>). This year's event will run from from 00.00 UTC on 17 February to 23.59 UTC on the 18th. FT8 DXPEDITION MODE • A "Release Candidate" version (WSJT-X v1.9.0-rc2) of the WSJT-X digimode software is due to be released later this month. It will introduce a new "FT8 DXpedition Mode", whose basic goal is to enable DXpeditions to make FT8 QSOs at the highest possible rates. The DXpedition station (the "Fox") will be able to transmit up to five signals simultaneously, and contact multiple calling stations (the "Hounds") at the same time. The new mode will permit contacts to be completed with as little as one Fox transmission per contact, and sustained rates of several hundred QSOs/hour are expected to be possible. Making FT8 QSOs with KH1/KH7Z (this summer's expedition to Baker Island) will require the DXpedition and everyone trying to work them to use the new version of WSJT-X. H44MS • Bernard, H44MS [425DXN 1381] has moved to a new QTH on Malaita Island (OC-047) and will remain there "for the next four weeks or more". His new location is next to the sea and less noisy than his previous QTH in Honiara, but there is no access to the Internet. He operates SSB only, using dipoles for 80 and 40 metres, and a beam for 20-6 metres. QSL via DL2GAC, direct or bureau.



LOTW & WAZ AWARD • Beta testing for bringing CQ Magazine's Worked All Zones (WAZ) award program into ARRL's Logbook of the World (LoTW) system continues to move forward. Some problems in the implementation were discovered by testers and have since been corrected; the documentation has also been improved by feedback from the testers. In parallel, the LoTW server has been executing a background task that creates and populates a WAZ account for each LoTW user. Beta testing will continue until this background task completes. When all WAZ accounts have populated, LoTW-WAZ will be made available to everyone. The goal is for operators to be able to directly submit LoTW confirmations for WAZ credit. Standard LoTW credit fees and separate CQ award fees will apply. [TNX ARRL]



MOBILE DXCC • The new Mobile DXCC Operating Award is now available to radio amateurs who have contacted at least 100 DXCC entities from a working vehicle, with antennas and power source capable of operating while in motion. This award specifically excludes QSOs made by aeronautical or maritime mobile stations. The Mobile DXCC is a one-time award and is non-endorseable. Contacts made any time in the past do count toward the award. Proof of contact (QSL cards or LoTW) is required, but do not need to be submitted. Full details, including the application form and the record sheet, can be found on <http://www.arrl.org/mobile-DXCC>.

NOMINATIONS: CQ HALLS OF FAME • The CQ DX Hall of Fame and the CQ Contest Hall of Fame recognize those amateurs who have made major contributions to DXing and contesting, respectively. The CQ Amateur Radio Hall of Fame recognizes those who have made major contributions to amateur radio as a whole, and radio amateurs who have made major contributions to society at large. The activities and accomplishments that qualify one for membership in these elite groups involve considerable personal sacrifice and can usually be described by the phrase "above and beyond the call of duty". Nominations to any of the halls of fame may be made by individuals, clubs or national organizations, and must be submitted by 1 March to be considered. A maximum of two people may be inducted into the Contest and DX halls of fame each year. There is no set maximum for inductees into the Amateur Radio Hall of Fame. Nominations may be e-mailed to hall-of-fame[@]cq-amateur-radio.com (preferred) or mailed to CQ (Amateur Radio, DX or Contest) Hall of Fame, c/o CQ Magazine, 17 West John Street, Hicksville, NY 11801, USA. Be sure to specify for which hall of fame the nomination is made.



NOMINATIONS: CWOPS AWARD • The "CWops Award for Advancing the Art of CW" recognizes individuals, groups or organizations that have made the greatest contributions toward advancing the art or practice of radio communication by Morse code. QSL JY5HX • Effective 10 February, Boris E73Y is the new QSL manager (direct and bureau) for Dr. Munzer Qraini, JY5HX. Boris has the complete logs, and will activate Club Log's OQRS as soon as he receives the cards from the printer in late February. [TNX E73Y]



VP6D • Vadym, UT6UD has joined the team that will be active from Ducie Island (OC-182) between 20 October and 3 November [425DXN 1387]. "Six meter EME was added to the project", the team announced on 8 February. "With planning support from Lance W7GJ, and the 6 meter community, we hope to make the first ever 6m EME QSOs from Ducie Island".

While they are "working with several amateur radio equipment manufacturers and suppliers who indicated interest in supporting VP6D", the logistics plan is coming together. "Our equipment will be consolidated in Fremont, California for testing, packaging and shipment to the Braveheart in New Zealand. The team has a group reservation for our flight transportation from Papeete to Mangareva and back. Braveheart will pick us up in Mangareva and return us there at the end of the expedition".

Detailed antenna plans "are coming together nicely with 2-element vertical dipole arrays on the high bands backed up by a couple of horizontal beams, 4-squares on 30/40 meters and verticals on 80/160 meters. The 160 receiving antenna plans are under development". The fundraising campaign continues - see <http://vp6d.com/> for information. [TNX K5GS]

YJ0AG • Grant, VK5GR will be active as YJ0AG from Efate (OC-035), Vanuatu on 17-29 April [425DXN 1393]. His new website, which includes his past operations, can be found at <http://vk5gr-iota.net/>.

Z60A • The first Z60A activation ended on 18 February, the actual day of Kosovo's 10th independence anniversary. Delegates from ten different countries were part of the initial Kosovo activation, which resulted in 81,478 QSOs with 26,487 unique call signs. Of the total number of QSOs, some 22% (17,876) were from North America and 10% (8255) were with DXers in Asia. Europe was obviously dominating with 66% (53,725) QSOs. As for QSLing, "Club Log OQRS system is set to cover the cost of direct QSL postage (USD 3.00), while also allowing voluntarily, private contributions. All donations small or large are most welcome to support SHRAK, the Kosovo Amateur Radio Association to aid in recruiting additional Kosovar

youth and to activate the existing Amateur Radio operators and support their activities. As many have requested confirmations during the ongoing activation, it has been decided to do an immediate LoTW and fast direct QSL service for those who contribute USD 20.00 or more. This option would not delay any of the traditional QSL options, but just put a priority on those who are willing to help Kosovo Amateur Radio finally move beyond the past ten difficult years". The complete Z60A log will be uploaded to LoTW approximately four weeks after the current activation, to "allow for corrections and checking for potentially busted calls".

3Y0Z: BOUVET ISLAND

After experiencing strong winds and turbulent seas, the 3Y0Z DXpedition arrived at Bouvet on 31 January at around 6 UTC, and dropped anchor off the east side of the island. On 1 February winds were 35-45 knots and the ship was pitching and rolling up to 30 degrees, which made flying and a landing attempt impossible. In the local morning of 2 February the situation had not sufficiently improved, and the forecast does not look very promising. Plans are to get everything ashore as quickly as possible when a weather window opens, "with never more people than our infrastructure can support". The "first strike team" will have to select and secure a site, and will include EY8MM, K0IR and Alejo Contreras Steading (Antarctic explorer, guide and mountaineer).

"During the last 72 hours, we continued to experience the high winds, low clouds, fog and rough seas that have prevented helicopter operations since our arrival at Bouvet", the 3Y0Z team reported on 3 February at 20 UTC. "No improvement was predicted in the weather forecast for the next four days. Then, last night, an issue developed in one of the ship's engines. This morning, the captain of the vessel declared it unsafe to continue with our project and aborted the DXpedition". On 5 February the captain decided that "it is in the best interest of safety and expediency to proceed directly to Capetown, South Africa rather than Punta Arenas, Chile". On 9 February the Betanzos was continuing her slow voyage at a reduced speed, with one of her two engines out and still some 1700 kilometres to go. A tugboat is on its way to assist her to the port of Capetown. The team is "deeply disappointed, but safe", and "there is already talk about rescheduling the DXpedition".

"ETA at Cape Town harbor is 0930 on Saturday morning", the 3Y0Z team reported on 16 February. "We understand that immigration and customs will come aboard at 1700, and we will likely be cleared to depart the vessel. DAP has us all booked into a local hotel near the waterfront. On Sunday, there will be a reception held at a local yacht club sponsored by a local radio club and numerous DXers. We are very much looking forward to that and are certainly honored.



The first of the team will begin departing for home on Sunday night, and the majority will be on their way Monday evening/early Tuesday morning. A few more will straggle out and be on their way home on Wednesday. When we depart the vessel on Saturday, that will be our 31st day aboard the ship. Needless to say, we are ready to set foot on dry, un-moving ground once again. Ralph and I are very proud of this team. They have endured many hardships since departing home in early January. They have been patient and

resilient and good company. There will be more updates in the future, as we begin to unravel this attempt and plan our subsequent strategy".




