# DX INFORMATION

**3B8** - Jean-Paul, PFOX will be active as 3B8X from Mauritius from 21 November to 1 December. He will operate CW on the HF bands. QSL via LoTW, or via home call (direct or bureau). [TNX DX World]

**3B8** - Team 3B8M (QSL via LoTW and M0OXO's OQRS) will be QRV again from Mauritius (AF-049) during the CQ WW DX CW Contest (M/M category). Before and after the



contest (20-30 November) they will be QRV on all bands CW, SSB, FT8 and via QO100. The operating team includes Philipp DK6SP (3B8/DK6SP, QSL via LoTW and Club Log's OQRS), Olof GOCKV (3B8HA,

QSL via LoTW and M0OXO's OQRS), Alan K0AV (3B8/K0AV), Jamie M0SDV (3B8/M0SDV, QSL via LoTW and Club Log's OQRS), Oliver W6NV (3B8/W6NV) and Denny KX7M (3B8/KX7M, QSL via LoTW and F5CWU's OQRS: <https://www.f5cwu.net/oqrs/>).

**3B9** - Kazu, M0CFW will be active as 3B9/M0CFW from Rodrigues Island (AF-017) on 20-30 November. He will participate in the CQ WW DX CW Contest as 3B9KW. QSL via LoTW, and later via Club Log's OQRS. [TNX NG3K]

**3D2/R** - Tony, 3D2AG will be active again as 3D2AG/p from Rotuma Island (OC-060). Departure is scheduled for 19 November, and he expects to be QRV on or



around 24 November until 20 December. He hopes to operate CW, SSB, RTTY and some FT8 on 160-6 metres, with a focus on the higher bands (15, 12 and 10m). QSL via Club Log's OQRS (please note that as he will

Gerben PG5M, Erno DK2AMM, Johannes PA5X, Guenter DL2AWG and Ron PA3EWP will be active as 5R8CG, 5R8MM, 5R8PA, 5R8WG and 5R8WP, respectively, from 22 November to 3 December. They



will operate CW, SSB, RTTY and FT8 on 160-6 metres with two stations. QSL 5R8CG via Club Log's OQRS or via PG5M; QSL 5R8PA via Club Log's OQRS or via

PA5X; QSL 5R8MM, 5R8WG and 5R8WP via Club Log's OQRS or via DL2AWG.

**5W** - Sigfrido, HB9FFN (IW9FMD), an agronomist who works for the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (FAO), is now based in Apia, Samoa (OC-097) for the foreseeable future. **A6** - Celebrating the 22<sup>nd</sup> edition of the FIFA World Cup to be held in Qatar, the Emirates Amateur Radio Society (EARS) will operate special callsign A60FIFA from 19 November to 19 December. QSL via EA7FTR. Individual operators may append a serial number to the special callsign, and be active as A60FIFA/0, A60FIFA/1, etc. (see qrz.com for the QSL routes). The FIFA World Cup is a quadrennial international football (soccer) tournament contested by the men's national teams of the member associations of the Federation Internationale de Football Association.

**A9** - Also joining the celebrations of Oman National Day, the Bahrain Amateur Radio Society (BARS) will operate special callsign A91OMA on 12-18 November. QSL via EC6DX and LoTW.

**C6** - A team of four (AA7JV, HA7RY, HA8KW and KN4EEI) will be active as C6AGU from Wood Cay (NA-001), Bahamas starting on 19 or 20 November. They will participate in the CQ WW DX CW Contest (26-27 November) and the ARRL 160 Meter Contest (2-4 December). Between the two contest weekends they will focus on the low bands. **DX0** - 25 November was the tentative departure date for the DX0NE DXpedition to the Spratly Islands [425DXN 1629]. Owing to recent «security issues», however, the

DXpedition has been cancelled. Hopefully it will be re-scheduled sometime «during the first half of 2023». [TNX The Daily DX]

**E7** - Special callsign E730ITU has been active since 28 October and will remain QRV until 14 November to mark the 30<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Bosnia and Herzegovina's membership in the International Telecommunication Union (ITU). QSL via LoTW only.

**E7** - Celebrating Statehood Day of Bosnia and Herzegovina (25 November), special callsign E7BOSNIA will be active from the ancient royal cities of Jajce, Visoko and Bobovac on 13-29 November. QSL via LoTW See <https://www.qrz.com/db/E7BOSNIA> for more information.

**EA** - Celebrating Christmas, the HamRadioDX group will be active as EG3HAM on 1-25 December, with certificates, «cash prizes» and a Christmas Draw (see qrz.com for complete information). Activity will be on 80-10 metres CW, SSB and FT8.

**F** - The Radio Club de Nice is active again as TM8AB to commemorate the anniversary of the first transatlantic amateur two-way contact between Leon Deloy, F8AB and Fred Schnell, 1MO (28 November 1923). Activity started on 11-13 November, and will continue on 26-30 November and 2-4 December. QSL via F4KJQ.



**F** - TM35FIST is the special callsign for Jean, F6JOE to celebrate the 35th anniversary of the FISTS CW Club (International Morse Preservation Society) on 5-11 December. Previous activities were on 2-15 May and 7-13 November. The Club (<https://fists.co.uk/>) was founded in 1987 by the late George Longden (G3ZQS), after recognising a need for a club in which veteran operators would help newcomers and less experienced operators learn and improve CW proficiency. QSL via F6JOE.

**F** - Michel, F8GGZ and Serge F6HFI will be active as TM200LP on 10-21 and 27-29 December to commemorate the 200<sup>th</sup> anniversary since the birth of Louis Pasteur (27 December 1822), the French scientist renowned for his discoveries of the principles of vaccination, microbial fermentation, and pasteurization. QSL via F8GGZ (bureau preferred).

**FM** - Jeff, N6GQ will participate in the CQ WW DX CW Contest as TO5Z from Martinique (NA-107). Before the contest he will operate CW and SSB (no FT8) on 10-160 metres (no WARC bands). QSL via LoTW, or direct to home call. [TNX NG3K]

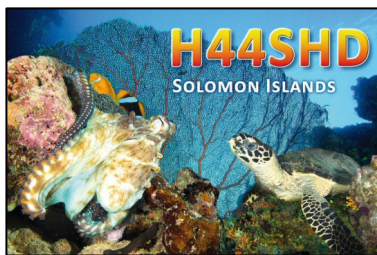
**FS** - John K9EL, Paul K9NU, Ed N9EP and Bob W9AP will



be active again as TO9W from Saint Martin (NA-105) from 30 November to 9 December. They will operate CW, SSB, FT8, FT4 and some RTTY with three stations. «The team's primary

focus will be on 160, 80 and 40 metres during hours of darkness and CW on all bands», they say, but they «will also operate 30 through 6 depending on openings». QSL TO9W via LoTW, Club Log's OQRS (preferred), or via W9IYL. Certificates will be awarded for several categories of most band-modes worked during the operation; the number of band-mode QSOs will be taken from Club Log's Leaderboard (all prior TO9W QSOs will be removed, and then merged back with the 2022 QSOs at the end of the operation). **H4** - Remo, HB9SHD will be active as H44SHD from Uepi Island (OC-149), Solomon Islands on 6-19 December. He



will operate SSB and FT8 on 40-6 metres. From 20 December to 3 January he will be QRV as H44SHD/mm while on a diving cruise, with possible land based brief operations from other IOTA groups

such as the Russell Islands (OC-168) and the Florida Is-

lands (OC-158). QSL via home call (direct or bureau); the log will be uploaded to Club Log and eQSL. Before that, he might be QRV as P29AH/mm while in Papua New Guinea waters between 27 November and 5 December (no land operation is expected and no QSL cards will be printed).

**HBO** - Bodo, DF8DX will be active as HB0/DF8DX from Liechtenstein on 11-13 November. He will be signing HB0DX (QSL via LoTW) during the Worked All Europe DX RTTY Contest, and HB0/DF8DX (QSL via LoTW and Club Log's OQRS) outside the contest.

**HH** - The Radio Club d'Haiti (HH2RCH) will be active as HH18NOV on 18-27 November. QSL via Club Log's OQRS, or via N200. This special callsign memorializes the Battle of Vertières (18 November 1803), the last major battle of the Haitian Revolution that ended with the former colony's independence.

**HR** - Gerard, F2JD will be active again as HR5/F2JD from Copan, Honduras from 23 November to 13 March 2023. He will operate CW, SSB and digital modes on the HF bands. QSL via F6AJA (direct or bureau); logsearch on <http://LesNouvellesDX.fr/voirlogs.php>. [TNX F6AJA]

**HR** - K1TR, K1XM, KQ1F, SM7IUN and W1UE will be active from Roatan Island (NA-057) on 20-30 November. They will participate in the CQ WW DX CW Contest as HQ9X (QSL via KQ1F and LoTW); outside the contest they will operate CW, SSB and FT modes. [TNX The Daily DX]

**I** - Bruno, IK1VHX will be active as II1MM between 1 and 31 December. The special callsign memorializes the 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Istituto Idrografico della Marina Militare, the Hydrographic Institute that has been the official nautical charting agency of the Italian Navy since its establishment in 1872.

**JA** - Take, JI3DST will be active again from Miyakojima (AS-079) between 17 November and 15 December. He will operate SSB and CW as JS6RRR (including an entry in the CQ WW DX CW Contest), JI3DST/6, JJ5RBH/6 and JR8LY/6, as well as JI3DST/p, JJ5RBH/p and JR8LY/p on FT8. The QSOs will be made available for both Club Log and LoTW Matching on the IOTA website.

**JA** - Look for Kenji, JA4GXS/2 to be QRV from Toshi Island (AS-206) on 19-20 November. He will operate CW, SSB and FT8 on various bands. QSL via home call, direct or bureau. [TNX DX World]

**ON** - Special callsign OT5IDPD will be active from 3 November to 3 December for the International Day of Persons with Disabilities, whose annual observance (3 December) was proclaimed by the United Nations General Assembly in 1992. All operators (Frank ON4AAC, Erik ON4ANN, Raff ON6IX and Greg ON6YP) will be hams with a disability. QSL via LoTW and eQSL, or via ON6WL.

**ON** - Commemorating Remembrance Day, members of UBA section ARA (Active Radio Amateurs, ON6ARA) will be active as OP22HWL on 10-13 November. The station will be set up at the Klein Zwaanhof museum. The special callsign is in memory of Harry Whitelock, killed in action in the Ypres Salient of World War I (6 August 1917). He was the grandfather of ARA's good friend Paul Whitelock, G0GMY. QSL via ON2WAB.

**OX** - Alex, OZ7AM as OX7AM and Mikkel OZ7AKT as OX7AKT will be active from Kangerlussuaq, Greenland (NA-018) on 22-29 November and 24-29 November, respectively.



Look for OX7AM to participate in the CQ WW CW Contest: he is going to attempt 2BSIQ (Two Bands Synchronized Interleaved QSOs), «so bear with me if I mess up», he says.

QSLs OX7AM and OX7AKT via LoTW, Club Log's OQRS, or via OZ1ACB. [TNX DX World]

**P2** - Team P29RO has been QRV from Loloata Island (OC-240) [425DXN 1635] since 25 October, and will go QRT around 4 UTC on 9 November. This is one day earlier than planned, as «the warm and humid climate is a challenge for central Europeans», and they will need more time than expected to dismantle the antenna system.

**P4** - Jaap, PA7DA will be active holiday style as P40DA from Aruba (SA-036) on 14-27 November. He will operate FT8 and FT4, «but also SSB and CW» on 80-10 metres. QSL via home call, direct or via the Dutch QSL bureau. He does not use Club Log or LoTW. [TNX The Daily DX]

**P4** - John, W2GD will be active as P44W from Aruba (SA-036) on 21-29 November. Main activity will be during the CQ WW DX CW Contest, with some spare time operations on 30, 17 and 12 metres outside the contest. QSL via LoTW, or direct to N2MM. [TNX NG3K]

**PA** - Celebrating the 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the World Wide Flora & Fauna in Amateur Radio programme, PD7YY, PE5TT, PF5X and PH0NO will be active as PA10FF on 19 November. **PY** - Celebrating the 22<sup>nd</sup> edition of the FIFA World Cup to be held in Qatar, the Liga de Amadores Brasileiros de Rádio Emissão's HQ will be operating special callsign PV22CUP from 19 November to 18 December. QSL via LoTW, eQSL, or via PY2KP.

**SP** - Celebrating the 95<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Polskie Radio Katowice, the largest regional station of Polish Radio,



special callsigns 3Z95PRK, HF95PRK, SN95PRK,



SO95PRK, SP95PRK and SQ95PRK will be QRV from 26 November to 11 December. QSL via operators' instructions. A number of certificates will be available, see <https://logsp.pzk.org.pl/a/95prk/index.php> for information.

**SV** - SX338M is the special callsign for members of the Radio Amateur Association of Western Peloponnese to celebrate the 70<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Hellenic Air Force's 338 Squadron on 1-31 December. QSL via LoTW and eQSL.

**T33** - Team T33T (two operators: «Banaba is extremely hard place to stay even for us», they say, and «we are doing our best to be active as much as we can») has been QRV from Banaba since the early UTC hours on 5 November. They decided to use low power and concentrate on Asia (Japan) e the US West Coast during the first days, before running more power



and turning the antennas towards Europe on the long path. There is «a chance we will have to stay on Banaba little longer due the vessel schedules», they add, «maybe till 24 November». **T33** - Norbert, DF6FK and Judith, DL2ZAD have announced their plans to be active as T33BB and T33BA from Banaba Island (OC-018) on 12-24 January 2023. More information is expected in due course. [TNX DX World]

**T8** - Upon arrival in Palau on 1 November, team T88WA discovered that their primary operating site had an «intractable S9 noise across all bands coming from underground cable and telephone wires running all along the island under the power poles».



They surveyed six other locations, found two that could potentially work and finally were given permission «to rent some state owned land in far northern Palau» (WWL

PJ77hr). They moved all of their equipment to the new site, and finally T88WA was QRV with the first station on 4 November around 12.15 UTC. The team reports that they are not completely noise free, though, as they have «a big batch of interference from 3.550 to 3.800. We'll continue to work to resolve, but may have to dodge it on 80m». QSL via M0URX, direct or preferably through his OQRS (<https://www.m0urx.com/oqrs/>). See qrz.com's entry for T88WA for band plan and QSLing policy.

**T8** - Nobu, JA0JHQ will be active again as T88PB from Koror (OC-009), Palau on 25-29 November, with main activity during the CQ WW DX CW Contest. QSL via LoTW (preferred) or direct to JA0JHQ. He will be followed by Tony, JH1FFW, who will operate FT8 and SSB on 40,

20, 15, 17 and 10 metres as T88RC from 30 November to 5 December (QSL via LoTW, eQSL, or via JH1FFW).

**TK** - A large team from Slovenia (S53BB, S53CC, S53F, S53MM, S53RM, S53WW, S53ZO, S550O, S57AL, S57C, S57K, S57L and S57VW) will be active as TK/homecall from Corsica (EU-014) on 21-29 November. They will participate in the CQ WW DX CW Contest as TK0C (M/2); outside the contest they will operate SSB, CW and digital modes on 160-2 metres. QSL TK0C via LoTW, eQSL or via S50C. **TY** - Pekka OH2TA, Tapani OH5BM and Timo OH5LLR will



be active as TY5AF from Benin on 21-29 November. Operating from Villa Karo, the Finnish-African cultural center located in the village of Grand-Popo, they will be QRV on 160-10 metres, with a focus on CW during

the CQ WW DX CW Contest. QSL via LoTW, Club Log's OQRS (preferred), or direct to OH5LLR.

**UA** - Special callsigns R2022DX and UE32DX (QSLs via RQ7L) will be active on 21-30 November for the 32<sup>nd</sup> anniversary of the Miller DX Club (<http://mdxc.ru/>).

**V2** - Bud, AA3B will be active again as V26K from Antigua (NA-100) on 22-28 November. He will operate mainly CW, and will participate in the CQ WW DX CW Contest. QSL via LoTW, Club Log's OQRS, eQSL, or via home call (direct and bureau). [TNX NG3K]

**V8** - V85NPV is the new callsign issued to Didier, F5NPV on 31 October. Over the past three months he was QRV as V85/F5NPV. He operates from Bandar Seri Begawan, the capital city of Brunei, and expects to remain in the country for a few years. QSL via eQSL and LoTW; paper cards will not be available.

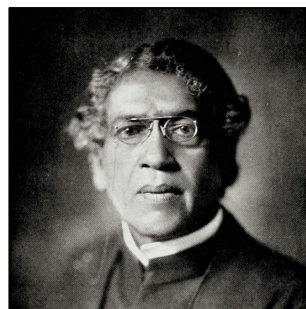

## BOUVET 2023 • 3Y0J PROPAGATION POLL



Team 3Y0J has launched a Propagation Poll «to prepare for not only working the Big Guns, but to better understand when and if we succeed to work the Small Pistols»: <https://www.3y0j.no/latest-news>.

«By participating in this poll you intend to provide 3Y0J with information about your station setup to aid 3Y0J to understand what your station configuration looks like. Please give as accurate information as possible. When you work 3Y0J we will get info about what category you belong to. The information will only be used to display to the operators once you work them what category you belong to - so for them to get a better view of the propagation».

The categories have been intentionally limited to three:

1. Small Pistol max 100 W, vertical/dipole
2. Regular Station max 1 kW, 2-3 el yagi on 20-10m, wires on the low bands
3. Big Gun HP (>1 kW), high gain yagi on 20-10m, yagi on 80-30m

«In addition we will establish a baseline of DX stations - hopefully several thousand unique stations will participate in the survey. During the DXpedition we will not only know if we work a Small Pistol, Regular Station or Big Gun - but we can compare the various stations in our log with the baseline.

We are working on a script that automatically will do an online analysis of the QSO database, so to display an online parameter indicating if we reach out to the small pistols or not. Thus, everytime the 3Y0J operators log a QSO with a station which is part of the DX baseline (i.e. the participants in the survey) the respective Indicator (Small Pistol, Regular Station or Big Gun) will be updated. The Indicators will be compiled to a relative parameter which compares the actual stations worked with the DX baseline. This online parameter will give us an indication how well we manage to work the small pistols, and even at a certain continent. We then need to understand if this is due to the propagation or our operating practice».

## BOUVET 2023 • 3Y0J FLEXIBLE BAND PLAN



The initial band plan for the much anticipated January 2023 DXpedition to Bouvet Island is now available on <https://www.3y0j.no/bandplan>. «We will work closely together with our pilots and if we see that something is not working, we will do adjustments», the team stated on 10 November. A few hints and tips from the team include:

- We will always keep lowest 10 kHz on WARC bands clear to allow regular DX traffic. So you will never hear us calling CQ in that portion of the band.
  - CW split will be limited to 15 kHz spectrum, and Phone split will be limited to 30 kHz spectrum. Thus operator will choose a frequency within the spectrum and limit the split to max 15 kHz and 30 kHz respectively.
- 160m will be CW only and 80m will be CW/SSB, so no FT8 on 160/80m.
  - Special permit up to 1500W on CW/SSB.
  - CW/SSB will have priority over digital modes.
  - RTTY will be on 1-2 bands, 14125 and 21125 kHz.
  - 60m frequencies have been updated, potentially 60m for last few days. There is no promise for 60m, but we want to do it if we can.

As for FT8 operation:

- FT8 will be F/H only, 4 stations aimed running 24/7 with 100W.
- We will NEVER transmit FT8 on regular FT8 frequencies. The 4 x FT8 stations can be controlled by one operator, or each FT8 station can be controlled individually by an operator running SSB/CW (SO2R) mode.
- FT8 will be on 40-10m running 100W, but focus on our 7 yagis 20-10m.
- We have chosen FT8/RTTY frequencies that gives us better in band separation, and also so to avoid the most public frequencies that might be occupied by others DXpeditions in F/H mode.
- We have agreed with Crozet that he runs FT8 on 10131 and Bouvet on 10140 kHz.

## CROZET 2022-2023

- The *Marion Dufresne* is now scheduled to leave Reunion Island on 12 December, and to reach Crozet on 20 December.
- Thierry, F6CUK reports that, «following the signing of the agreement with the TAAF», he has been authorized to be QRV on the HF bands for three weeks only, between 20 December and 26 January. In addition, he will have to QRT for «at least 5 hours» each day, «to allow the French Polar Institute to take measurements».
- That being the case, Thierry intends to concentrate his activity on 2-3 bands - 20 and/or 17 metres, and 30 metres at night - in order to give an All Time New One to as many people as possible. «I have not chosen any frequencies either»,





he says, «this will be discussed with the scientists on site». At all events, he has already agreed with the Bouvet team that he will operate FT8 on 10131 kHz, and he is aware of the privileges granted to the General US licence class on 20m.

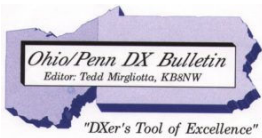
- No constraints will be put on satellite activity, and Thierry will be able to operate via QO-100 for the entire duration of his stay on the island. Departure from Crozet will be around 25 March.
- Thierry and his team are working to secure permission for a longer QRV period on the HF bands; he is in contact with the IPEV (the French Polar Institute Paul-Émile Victor), but to date he has no information about a possible extension.

- As for the callsign, Thierry has applied for a special callsign to mark the 60<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the first amateur radio activity from Crozet, conducted by Roger Baudelot, FB8WW, between December 1961 and February 1962. Thierry's callsign will be announced only a few hours before he starts operations. Bookmark <http://crozet2022.r-e-f.org/news.html> for updates.

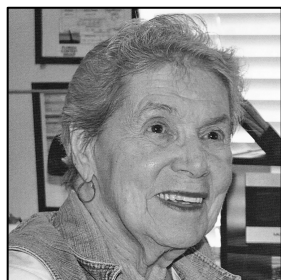

## SILENT KEYS



Ellen White, W1YL passed away on 6 November. She would have turned 96 next month. Licenced since 1946, she «devoted over 75 years of her life to ham radio, including more than 25 years on the headquarters staff for ARRL. She retired in 1978 as Deputy Communications Manager and became the editor of the column *How's DX?* for ARRL's membership journal, *QST*». An accomplished CW operator who loved contesting and DXing, she joined FOC (the First Class CW Operators' Club) in 1966, and in 2019 was granted the Al Slater G3FxB Memorial Award. In the same year she was inducted into the CQ Amateur Radio Hall of Fame as «the grand dame of DXing», and was awarded the Russian E.T. Krenkel Medal «for outstanding global contributions to amateur radio». Her husband Bob White, W1CW (ARRL DXCC Manager from 1952 until 1976) passed away twenty years ago, followed in 2004 by their son Jim White, K4OJ (founder and first president of the Florida Contest

Group).

On 8 November the Kuwait Amateur Radio Society reported the news of the passing of Ahmad Abdul-Jabbar Mansour Marafi, 9K2DZ. He was the «Last Voice from Kuwait», the amateur radio operator who risked his own life to handle health-and-welfare messages in and out of Kuwait during the Iraqi occupation (1990-1991). In 1992 he received the ARRL International Humanitarian Award, awarded to those who, by use of amateur radio skills, provide «extraordinary service for the benefit of others in times of crisis or disaster».

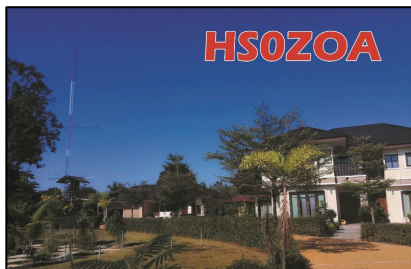
