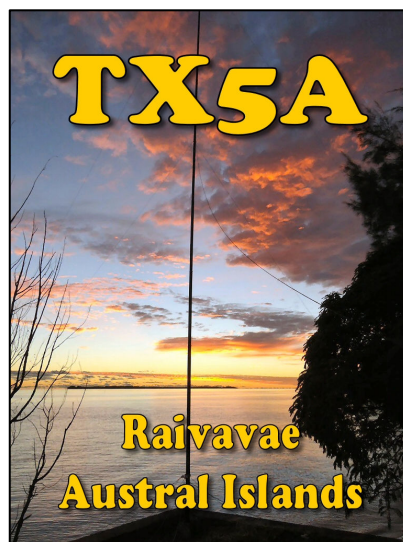

3B8 - Hans, PA3HGT will be active again as 3B8/PA3HGT from Mauritius (AF-049) on 4-24 September. He will operate SSB and possibly some digital mode on 40, 20 and 10 metres. QSL via home call, direct or bureau. [TNX DX World]

7Q - Alex, IW5ELA will operate mainly CW as 7Q7ELA on 17-26 September. It will be a "suitcase operation" while touring Malawi. All QSOs will be confirmed automatically via the bureau. Logsearch on Club Log.

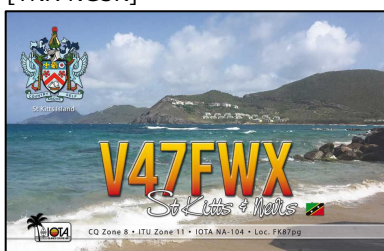


UA9 - The RI0B DXpedition [425DXN 1419] is now set to start on 25 August from Arkhangelsk. Along all the way the RI0B team will be signing RT9K/mm while sailing on the yacht "Apostol Andrey" (whose worldwide-famous skipper, Nikolay Litau, is an amateur radio operator himself, R3CN). Three operators (UA9KDF, UA9LDD and UA1QV) will leave Arkhangelsk on 25-26 August. They will meet the rest of the team (RW0BG and UA0BA) at Dikson on 5 September, and then proceed immediately to the Firnley Islands (AS-054). On their way back they will stop and be QRV from other islands in five IOTA groups: Tyrtov (AS-121), Rozmyslov (claimed to qualify for AS-104), Nansen (AS-104), Scott-Hansen (AS-068), Arkticheskogo Instituta (AS-087) and finally Sibirjakov (AS-005). Owing to the long route and unpredictable weather conditions, it is not possible to announce the actual dates of island activity. Plans are for three stations to operate CW, SSB and digital modes on 40-10 metres. RI0B will use FT8 DXpedition mode on 14095 kHz. QSL via Club Log's OQRS. 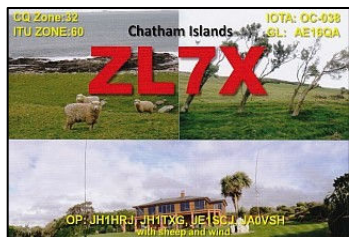

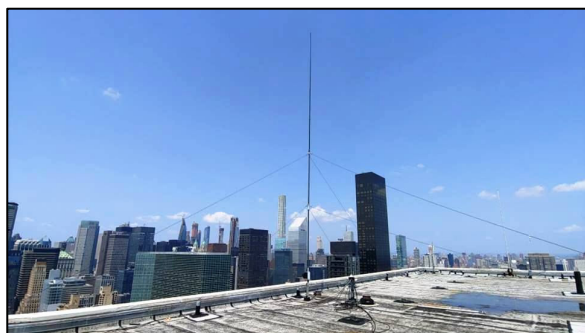

Yesterday represents an additional milestone for the club as Adrian (who did most of the work) and I, finally erected a brand new SteppIR BigIR vertical antenna on the Secretariat's roof. All that remains is to connect and lay the ground radials, fine-tune the rack mounted devices, and setup and configure the remote K3. Once done and after almost a decade off-air, we can finally call CQ 20 de 4U1UN".

"With regards to remote", K2QI explained in late July to DX World (see <https://dx-world.net/whats-the-issue-with-4u1un/>), "the operators will still be inside the UN proper. Just now, everything will be done by IP where the control heads are located on the first floor and the transceiver on the 41st floor to minimize coax length to the antennas. There will be no true remote operations of the station from outside the compound as dictated by current UN network

"We're one step closer to being back on the air", James Sarte, K2QI (President of the United Nations ARC, <http://www.4u1un.net>) posted to Facebook on 16 August. "As some may know, Dmitri Zhikharev RA9USU along with Adrian Ciuperca KO8SCA have been working with me behind the scenes to get the station operational again. Through the generous donations of Dima and his associates (notably Ed Kritsky NT2X), we were able to get a rack mounted K3, Acorn 2000 linear amplifier, and associated network-enabled control hardware. We were also granted another K3 to act as a remote head from SK Tony N2UN via his widow, and delivered to us by Andrew Bodony K2LE. Finally, Adrian has been doing a lot of behind-the-scenes networking and legwork with his counterparts to help get things done from within the United



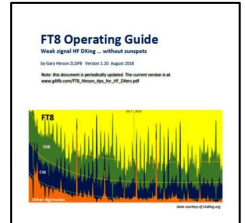
security protocols”.

On 22 August Adrian, KO8SCA completed the installation of the antenna on the roof of the United Nations HQ building in New York City. He was able “to put 4U1UN on the air from the 41st floor to run some tests at the barefoot levels”, The Daily DX reported. “He managed to work about 50 stations on 14.240 MHz between about 1615Z and 1645Z. In the future he hopes to be able to get the amplifier online and remote the station down to the third floor. This new location will make it easier for guest operators to activate the 4U1UN station”. QSL via LoTW, or via HB9BOU (direct or bureau).



CW OPEN • CWops sponsors CW Test - fun, weekly competitions at times thought to be optimum for amateurs in ITU Regions 1, 2, and 3 (www.cwops.org/cwt.html).
