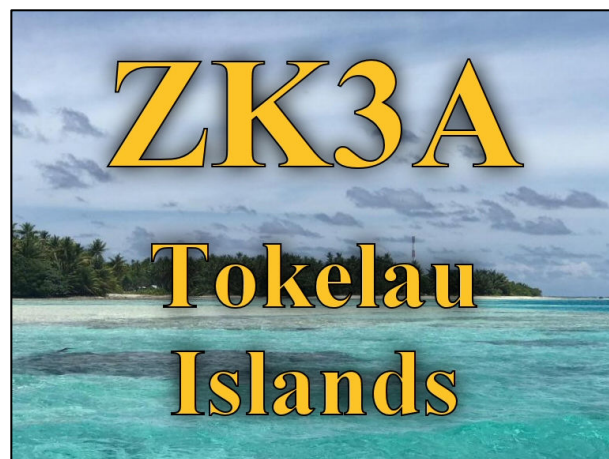

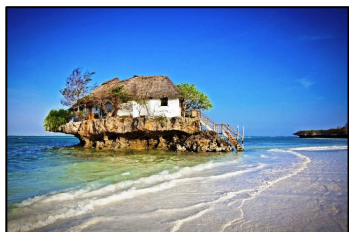

# DX INFORMATION

**3W** - Geri, DK8KW will be active as 3W9KW from Hanoi, Vietnam on 18-26 October. He will operate QRP CW and possibly SSB, depending on conditions. QSL via DK8KW.

**3W** - Alex, KU1CW will be active as 3W9A from Vietnam on 20-28 October, CQ WW DX SSB Contest included. Outside the contest he will operate all modes on 80-10 metres. QSL via LoTW. [TNX The Daily DX]

**5H** - Alex K2BB, Serge RT5D, Serge US7UX, Alex UT7UV and Paul UU0JR will be active as 5H3UA from Zanzibar



Island (AF-032), Tanzania on 16-28 November, CQ WW DX CW Contest included. They will be QRV on 160-10 metres SSB, CW and FT8; additionally, they will also operate JT65 EME on 6 and 2 metres as

5H3EME, including participation in the ARRL EME Contest on 16-17 November. QSL via Club Log's OQRS; the logs will be uploaded to LoTW in 6 months after the DXpedition. See <http://5h3eme.com/> for more information.

**5R** - Hiro, JF1OCQ as 5R8VX and Kuni, JA8VE as 5R8KU will be active from Nosy Be (AF-057), Madagascar on 12-25 November. They will operate SSB, CW and digital modes on the HF bands. QSL 5R8VX via JF1OCQ, QSL 5R8KU via JA8VE. [TNX DX World]

**5T** - Johannes, 5T5PA (SSB and some FT8) and Evert, 5T2KW (CW) will be active "from a special location" in Mauritania on 19-26 October. Their main focus will be on the low bands (160, 80, 60 and 40m). They will setup separate verticals for 80m and 160m, delta loops for 60m and 40m, and three receiving Beverages in the direction of JA/EU, NA and SA/VK/ZL. QSLs via LoTW and Club Log's OQRS. 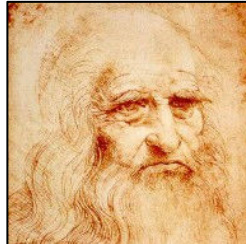
metres SSB. QSL via home call.

They will run five stations on CW (1823, 3519,



7010, 10109, 14019, 18069, 21029, 24891, 28019 kHz), SSB (3795, 7125, 14215, 18140, 21295, 24945, 28019 kHz), RTTY (3595, 7049, 10140, 14080, 18103, 21080, 24910, 28080 kHz) and FT8 (1840, 3567, 7056, 10131, 14080, 18103, 21080, 24910, 28080 kHz). Additionally, they will listen for US General class stations on 14280 kHz and up, JA stations on 160m CW down 5-6 kHz, JA stations on 160m FT8 1908 kHz. 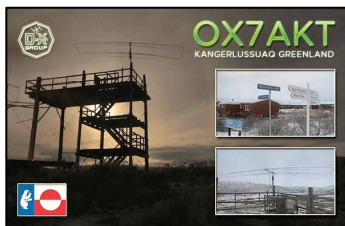

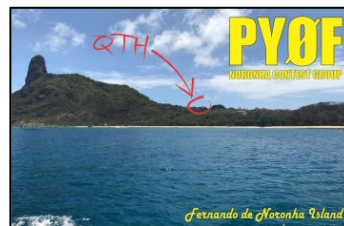


**PA** - Marcel, PD5MVH has been active as PD5MVH/p from Ameland Island (EU-038) since 19 October, and will

"All of the cargo is already at our operating site", the say.

VP6R will be active as VP6R from 18 October to 1 November,



including participation in the CQ WW DX SSB Contest as a full-scale Multi-Multi entry. Plans are to operate CW, SSB, RTTY and FT8 (Fox & Hound) with "8 stations, each capable of maximum legal power, with

monoband Yagis for the high bands and verticals with good radial systems and directional receive antennas for the low bands". Announced frequencies are 1826.5, 3523, 7023, 10108, 14023, 18069, 21023, 24891 and 28023 kHz (CW); 3785, 7082, 14185, 18130, 21285, 24955 and 28485 kHz (SSB); 1836, 3567, 7056, 10131, 14090, 18095, 21091, 24911 and 28091 kHz (FT8); 3580, 7045, 10142, 14080, 18099, 21080, 24911 and 28080 kHz (RTTY). VP6R will be also active on 6 metres FT8 (50323 kHz), 6m EME (see <https://pitcairndx.com> for information) and 60m. The FT8 protocol has been formalized, and details can be found on the "How to Work VP6R" page.

The pilot station network for the DXpedition includes WB9Z (Chief and North American pilot), EA3AKP (Western and Southern Europe), G3XTT (Western Europe), IK0FVC (Southern Europe), JJ3PRT (Japan), NP4G (South America and Caribbean), OG2M (Northern Europe), R7LV (Eastern Europe), ZL3IO (Oceania), ZS1C (Africa) and W7GJ (EME Pilot). **CLUB LOG GATEWAY** • There is a new Club Log tool available for users (DXpedition teams and single operators alike) of Win-Test, N1MM and DXLog to upload to Club Log efficiently and reliably in real-time. The Club Log Gateway is a small command-line tool that is designed to run on a Windows, Mac or Linux computer. It stores a record of the QSO (including handling edits and deletes) in a database file that is sent periodically to Club Log. This is achieved in near real-time, including via slow connections such as satellite phones, using an extre-



mely efficient and lightweight protocol that saves over 90% of the normal overheads of ADIF uploads. This means that real-time uploads are realistic, and not too hard to achieve. The payload is about 500 bytes for 35 QSOs. Using the gateway, you can push QSOs into Club Log within a few seconds. **IARU: TWO NEW MEMBER SOCIETIES** • The IARU member-societies have voted to admit The Saudi Amateur Radio Society (SARS) and the Seychelles Amateur Radio Association (SARA) to membership. SARS (<https://arsr.sa/en/>) was founded on 25 June 2018 and is legally registered/recognized to represent the amateurs of Saudi Arabia. As of January 2019 there were 66 members out of a total of 479 licensed radio amateurs in the country. SARA was founded in December 2018 and was registered with the Seychelles government on 31 December. SARA has six members, two of whom are licensed. It is believed that there are four licensed amateurs in Seychelles, a number that SARA hopes to increase. Saudi Arabia and Seychelles are located in ITU Region 1 which also corresponds to IARU Region 1. Their IARU membership became effective on 9 October 2019 upon completion of the voting procedure set out in the IARU Constitution. [Source: [iaru.org](http://iaru.org)]

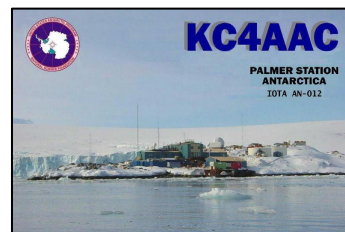

**NCDXF & CLUB LOG** • The Northern California DX Foundation (NCDXF) has awarded a grant of \$4,000 to Club Log to support their capital needs for important IT system upgrades to move their system into the future. Michael, G7VJR, recently reached out to NCDXF with an inquiry for interest in support that triggered an immediate and overwhelming response from every NCDXF Director. Following NCDXF's action, Michael is quoted: "For some time now, I've been anxious to provide a more resilient way to run Club Log. With 70,000 active users, and most significant expeditions depending upon it, it's vital to keep Club Log working around the clock - but until now the expense has been prohibitive. Club Log depends on donations for its running costs, but to fund a capital project like this takes the financial backing of a foundation that takes the lead and supports expeditions and DX-related projects at a really high level. NCDXF has made an extraordinary grant to Club Log, giving me an opportunity to unlock all the work that I need to do in this area. **SABLE ISLAND 2020** • On 20 October Murray, WA4DAN went on a reconnaissance trip to Sable Island to meet with the on-island Parks Canada staff to work out details for the 2020 DXpedition [425DXN 1463]. He also set up a station and worked 200 stations in 31 countries in a brief propagation test as CY0/WA4DAN on 14200 kHz. The day after he met with the Parks Canada Sable Island manager in Halifax to determine the size of the DXpedition team and the exact dates for the operation. Details will be published on a CY0 website to be launched soon.

**TX7T** • The Can-Am DXpedition team [425DXN 1477] will arrive in French Polynesia on 3 November. While in Tahiti (FO), there will be some activity - including low bands - for a couple of days/nights. The team will move on to Hiva Oa (Marquesas Islands) on 6 November, and will depart for home on the 19th. While in the Marquesas, there will be 3-4 four stations active as TX7T on 160-6 metres CW, SSB and FT8. Check out <https://marquesas2019.com/> for more details. Operators are K4UEE, K5PI (team leader), W5MJ, W5RF, W5SJ, VA7DX, VE7KW and F6BCW. Europe is a key target area and every attempt will be made to take advantage of propagation. Pilots are DL9GFB (Chief Pilot), N2SG and N7BT. QSL via M0URX's OQRS and LoTW. This DXpedition is mostly funded by the operators. However, contributions are most welcome and will go toward their freight and shipping costs. [TNX K4UEE]



**VP6R** • As of 01.00 UTC on 25 October, the VP6R DXpedition to Pitcairn Island had approximately 47,000 contacts in the log. "Late yesterday we were hit with a tropical storm with torrential rain and gale force plus winds", the team reported on 25 October. "We had several antennas come down, but they are repairable and will be back up when it is safe to go outside". They "have been working a lot of FT8 on all the bands (except 160m so far) and find that this 'weak' signal mode is putting a lot of new and unique callsigns into the log, proving that this mode is valuable for a great many". VP6R operates FT8 Fox & Hound mode, and "when conditions are good and everyone has FT8 set up properly, we have seen peak rates over 1000 contacts/hour and often sustained rates of 400 contacts/hour from a single station! And, yes, it is possible for one person to operate two stations at once. We do it often". VP6R will shout down temporarily at about 22 UTC on 25 October to prepare for the CQ WW DX SSB Contest. They will be in the Multi/Multi category on all bands. After the contest they will be back in "DXpedition mode" until 31 October.



**VP8/VP8DXU** • Beginning on 24 October, team members will meet near Palo Alto (California) "to consolidate, integrate, test and pack the equipment for its transport to Punta Arenas, Chile". Similar to their Ducie Island (VP6D) plan, "the antenna team designed a strategy that considers Signy Island's location and topography. Vertical Dipole Arrays will be directed towards Europe, over water. For other geographies the topology is less suitable for VDAs so instead Moxons will be

used. Low band vertical antennas will be used for all geographies". As for fundraising, 44 clubs/foundations and over 350 individuals have supported the project so far. "We still have a long way to go", the team says, "but we're encouraged by the response. If you or your club aren't listed on our website, please consider a donation". **WAG & JOTA** • Participants in this weekend's Worked All Germany Contest are reminded that, in order to reduce interference with scout stations active during the annual Jamboree On the Air (JOTA), contest operations are not allowed on 3560-3800, 7040-7200 and 14060-14350 kHz (CW), as well as on 3650-3700, 7080-7140, 14100-14125, 14280-14350, 21350-21450 and 28225-28400 kHz (SSB).

**WRC-19** • The World Radiocommunication Conference 2019 is due to open in Sharm el-Sheikh, Egypt, on 28 October. The meeting, which lasts four weeks, will be attended by three thousand delegates from most of the countries around the world, and will discuss and agree changes to the ITU Radio Regulations.

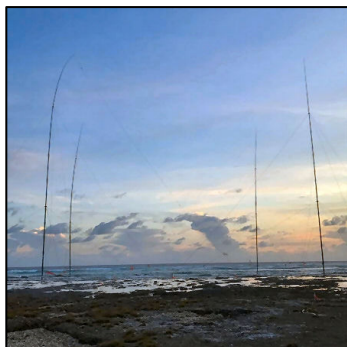


IARU and its member-societies will be there, representing the amateur and amateur satellite services with a team of 14 people from 10 countries. Of particular interest to IARU are the positions on five Agenda Items (AI):

- AI 1.1, to allocate spectrum in the 50-54 MHz Region in Region 1 to the amateur service
- AI 1.13, to consider new spectrum of International Mobile Telecommunications, which potentially might impact amateur spectrum at around 47 GHz
- AI 1.16, which could impact the 5 GHz amateur spectrum
- AI 9.1.6 on Wireless Power Transmission, where harmonics of WPT systems can impact the MF/HF radio spectrum

- AI 10, where it is possible that future agenda items at WRC-23 could impact the amateur service, including the 1240-1300 MHz band.

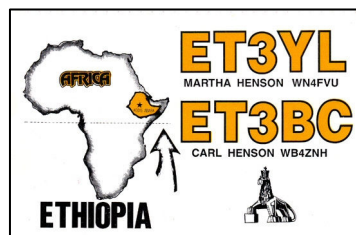
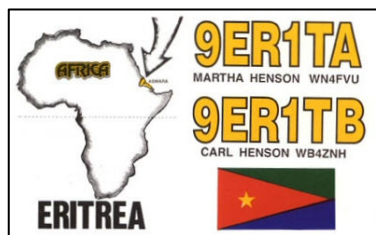

According to the latest update on Club Log, 51260 QSOs were made with 14376 unique callsigns from Asia (38.3%), North America (37.4%), Europe (18.9%) and the rest of the world (5.5%). The most productive band was 20m (13060 QSOs); the most productive mode was CW (29343 QSOs), followed by FT8 (11275), SSB (8443) and RTTY (2199). 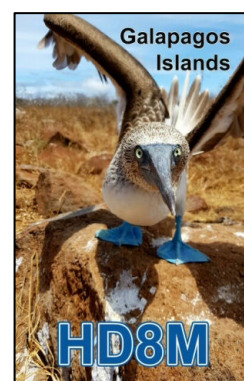
