DX INFORMATION

3DA0 - Arnold, WB6OJB will operate SSB only as 3DA0JK from Swaziland until 8 September around 12 local time. QSL via WB6OJB. [TNX The Daily DX]

3W - Sergey (RA3NAN), Oleg (RK3FA), Eugene (RZ3EC), Andy (RZ3EM) and Andrey/UA6BGB will be active from three Vietnamese IOTA groups between 24 September and 1 October as follows:

24-26 Sep	XV6RRC	Ngu Island	AS-185
27-28 Sep	XV7RRC	Cham Island	AS-162
29 Sep-1 Oct	XV3RRC	Tam Island	AS-157

This is a tentative schedule, as actual dates will depend on local. They plan to operate on 160-10 metres with two stations equipped with amplifiers and several antennas.
