**3C** - Ken, LA7GIA (<http://la7gia.com/>) will be active as 3C7GIA from Malabo, Bioko Island (AF-010), Equatorial Guinea on 4-13 March. He plans to be QRV on 80-10 metres CW, SSB and RTTY. QSL via LA7GIA and LoTW; logsearch on Club Log. [TNX DX World]

**3X** - The 3XY1T DXpedition team [425DXN 1278] expects to arrive at Los Island (AF-051), Guinea on 18 February in the morning. They will use generators as the island as no power grid; consequently, there might be



occasional breaks for the maintenance of this equipment. RTTY operations will be concentrated on a single band (15 metres). Stations in VK/ZL are invited to use the cluster to warn the team of possible openings; long-path openings to Japan will be closely
