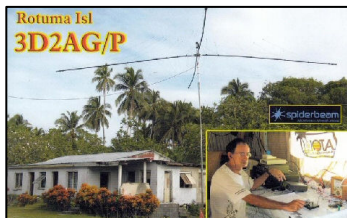

DX INFORMATION

3B8 - Olof, G0CKV and others (K1ZZ, KX7M, N6AA, N6VI and W6XD) will be active as 3B8M from Mauritius (AF-049) on 18-29 November, with participation in the CQ WW DX CW Contest and a focus on the low bands outside the contest. QSL via LoTW and M0OXO's OQRS. [TNX NG3K]

3D2/R - Tony, 3D2AG expects to be active again as 3D2AG/p from Rotuma (OC-060) starting around 17 December until around mid-January 2020. He plans to operate CW, RTTY, FT8 (FT4) and SSB on 160-6 metres, with a focus on the low bands and "QRO when required". On FT8/FT4 he will be using a multi



answer protocol (not to be confused with the Fox & Hound mode). He will have no access to the Internet while on the island. The FT8 QSOs will be uploaded to Club Log after the end of the expedition, while contacts made on CW, SSB and RTTY will be recorded on paper logs as usual. QSL direct to 3D2AG (or Club Log's OQRS for FT8 only); see <https://www.qrz.com/db/3D2AG/P> for PayPal instructions and tentative operating schedule and frequencies.

3W - Mats, RM2D (SM6LRR) will be active again as XV9D



from Vietnam on 17-30 November. This year he will concentrate on 160-40 metres; he will also participate in the CQ WW DX CW Contest. QSL via LoTW (preferred) or direct to EA5GL. [TNX NG3K]

4L - Tev, TA1HZ will be active as 4L/TA1HZ from Georgia on 13-20 December. He will operate from 4L6QC's QTH, with main activity on the lower bands FT8 and FT4. QSL via LoTW, or direct to TA1HZ. [TNX NG3K]

5N - Bodo, DF8DX and Rene, DL2JRM have been active as 5N7Q from Abuja, Nigeria since 16 November. They

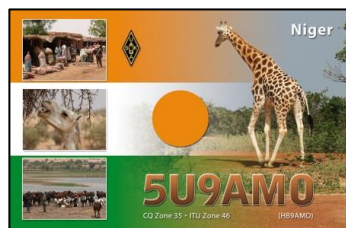

2020 IOTA HONOUR ROLL & ANNUAL LISTING • The last date for mailing applications or score updates to checkpoints for inclusion in the 2020 Honour Roll and Annual Listing is 31 January 2020 (it is advisable not to wait until the very last moment, though). If postmarked after that date, they will be processed in the normal way, but the scores will be held over to the following year's listing. Participants who have not updated since the 2015 annual listings and wish to remain listed should make a submission before 31 January 2020. Furthermore, those who have not logged into their record for more than two years, will need to revalidate their registration through [info@\[i\]iota-world.org](mailto:info@[i]iota-world.org). Do not leave it to the last moment as you may run out of time.



3Y0I PREPARATIONS RESUMED • The second attempt at operating from Bouvet Island is "under planning", the 3Y0I team announced on 28 October. "We estimate that the second attempt would be around U\$ 170.000 in total", they say, "but this time it may only take place if we receive financial support to cover at least half of the missing budget, which is U\$ 85.000". They ask the amateur radio community to consider making a donation to the

DXpedition via the GoFundMe fundraising platform. Complete information, including the direct link for donations, can be found on the 3Y0I's website: <https://bouvetoya.org/3yoi-preparations-resumed/>.

4U1UN • Two updates were posted to the United Nations Amateur Radio Club (4U1UN) Facebook page on 20 November. First: the 4U1UN beacon, which was temporarily deactivated due to wind-incurred damage to the antenna, is back - "not sure how much longer it'll survive", however, as "the antenna is literally being held together with tape and chewing gum at this point". Second: "some may have had the good fortune of working Adrian [KO8SCA] today while he



ran some tests", and it seems that "everything is finally functioning as it should. That said, you should start to hear 4U1UN back on the air very soon". Actually, Adrian was active on 40 metres SSB from 4U1UN for about one hour (23.00-00.00 UTC) on 27 November: "more good things to come in future, now that the remote setup is working correctly". QSL via HB9BOU.



CLUB LOG • In addition to the supporting grant awarded by the Northern California DX Foundation [425DXN 1486], Michael Wells, G7VJR and Club Log have received donations from The Yasme Foundation (USD 4,000), the Chiltern DX Club (USD 2,600) and the International DX Association (INDEXA, USD 500). The grants are for significant hardware upgrades to Club Log, needed to take the system into the future with improved resiliency and enhanced performance, as well as to facilitate further innovation. Since its inception in 2008 Club Log has grown to be an integral aspect of competitive DXing for both DXers and DXpeditioners alike. Today Club Log hosts 590 million QSOs with nearly 70,000 registered callsigns - and counting.

PRIMNM COMMUNITY GROUP • Don Greenbaum, N1DG has been appointed to the NOAA Fisheries/US Fish and Wildlife Service PRIMNM Community Group, established to provide input to the agencies on the management, proper care, and effective stewardship of the Pacific Remote Islands Marine National Monument. This Community Group will also provide a forum to discuss ideas and opportunities regarding PRIMNM management, for consideration in the draft Monument Management Plan that is under development. The PRIMNM area consists of approximately 1,282,000 square kilometers in the central Pacific Ocean, and encompasses four current DXCC Entities: Baker & Howland Islands, Johnston Atoll, Palmyra Atoll & Jarvis Island, and Wake Island.

QSL GALLERY • The large collection of QSL cards on Les Nouvelles DX's website has been updated. SV2RSG/A • Monk Iakovos, SV2RSG, based at the Koutloumousiou Monastery on Mount Athos, was active as SV2RSG/A on 20 and 40 metres CW on 25-27 October. Bart Jahnke, W9JJ (ARRL Radiosport and Field Services Manager) announced on 7 November that "operations by SV2RSG/A (if from Mount Athos must identify 'A') are accepted by ARRL DXCC. While SV2RSG/A isn't yet in LoTW, we will be happy to help assist with setting that up if Monk Iakovos would like assistance (this assumes logging is or can be put into electronic Cabrillo or ADIF formats)". TA0/R7AL & TA0/RK8A • Vasily, R7AL and Vlad, RK8A had planned to be active as TA0/R7AL and TA0/RK8A from Bogsak Island (AS-123) on 11-14 November, and from Suluada (AS-115) on 15-17 November. The operation from AS-123 was cancelled because "there is a NATO base nearby, and the island is closed", RW3RN reported. Vasily and Vlad went to their second destination earlier than planned, and started operations from Suluada (AS-115) on 13 November. They operated CW on 30 and 40 metres; then, in the UTC morning of 14 November, the island was hit by a fierce storm with heavy rain that damaged the team's equipment and personal belongings. 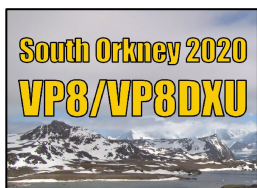
TQSL: NEW VERSION • A new version (v2.5.1) of LoTW's Trusted QSL (TQSL) has been released: <http://www.arrl.org/tqsl-download>. This version has new features as well as corrections for defects found since TQSL 2.4.7 was released. This release also includes an update to the most recent TQSL configuration file. TQSL 2.5.1 can be installed to upgrade any older version

of TQSL. On all three supported platforms (Windows, MacOS and Linux), installing TQSL 2.5.1 will replace older versions of Trusted QSL while preserving your Callsign Certificates, Station Locations, and preferences.



VP6R • The DXpedition to Pitcairn Island went QRT on 1 November at 18 UTC. According to the latest update on Club Log, 82700 QSOs were made with 20491 callsigns from North America (52%), Asia (22,2%), Europe (20,7%) and the rest of the world (5%). The most productive bands were 20m (17099 QSOs), 15m (14421), 17m (11653) and 40m (11106); the most productive mode was CW (34208 QSOs), followed by FT8 (25505) and SSB (22933). Some FT8 QSOs are still not online, though: when the team gets home, there will be a final upload, and Club Log's OQRS will be activated. QSLing details can be found on <https://pitcairndx.com/qsling/>. Eventually the entire log will be uploaded to LOTW. While on the island, the team helped two local hams get back on the air: Meralda, VP6MW has a new vertical for 40, 30 and 15m, and is set up now to operate FT8; Mike, VP6AZ has a repaired vertical and new beam. VP8/VP8DXU • During the week of 21-27 October team members and helpers met in Placerville and Los Altos Hills, California to consolidate, assemble, test, and prepare the equipment for transport to Punta Arenas (Chile) and eventually to the South Orkney Islands. Antennas were assembled, tuned, tested and marked for easy transport and reassembly. All software was loaded on laptops, QSOs were entered into N1MM and test logs were uploaded to their log search server over the Inmarsat BGAN satellite network. WRC-19: REGION 1 50 MHz AMATEUR ALLOCATION • "The World Radiocommunication Conference WRC-19 has approved an allocation in the 50 MHz band for amateurs in Region 1", Hans Blondeel Timmerman, PB2T (IARU Region 1 Secretary) posted to <https://www.iaru-r1.org/> on 21 November.

"The decision will now be incorporated in the Final Acts of the conference. The decision comes after more than three weeks of strenuous negotiations to reconcile widely disparate views of Region 1 administrations. The result is a dramatic improvement



in the international Radio Regulations for amateurs in Region 1. Before WRC-19 there were only 11 countries in Africa with a primary allocation in the band. When the Final Acts take effect, on a date that has not yet been determined, there will be 44 countries in Region 1 with a primary allocation of at least 500 kHz including 26 countries with a primary allocation of the entire band 50-54 MHz. The entire region will have an amateur secondary allocation of 50-52 MHz except in the Russian Federation, whose administration opted for only 50.080-50.280 MHz on a secondary basis.

There are provisions to protect the other existing services that use the band in Region 1 and neighboring countries in Region 3. The existing primary allocation of 50-54 MHz in Regions 2 and 3 is unaffected. The exact manner in which the allocations will be implemented in Region 1 countries will be determined by each administration and may be either more generous or less, depending on national considerations. The WRC-19 decision on its agenda item 1.1 is the culmination of years of effort by the IARU and its member-societies, mainly in Region 1 but with support from the other two regions".

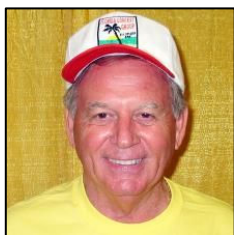
WSJT-X 2.1.2 • The latest release of WSJT-X, the software suite that includes the FT4 and FT8 protocols, is now available. WSJT-X 2.1.1 (released on 25 November) was a bug-fix release to address several regressions in version v2.1.0. WSJT-X 2.1.2 (released on 26 November) is "an emergency bugfix release" to correct errors that crept into the Hamlib package bundled with v2.1.1 and affected control of certain Icom radios. The installation packages for Windows, Linux and Macintosh, as well as the User Guide, can be found on <http://physics.princeton.edu/pulsar/k1jt/wsjt.html>. Upgrading from earlier versions of WSJT-X should be straightforward. There is no need to uninstall or move any files.

YJ0RRC • Although the same callsign was used from either Gaua Island (OC104) and Tongoa Island (OC-111), there are two separate log searches on Club Log: YJ0RRC for OC-104 (4186 QSO made on 4-6 November) and YJ0RRC/p for OC-111 (6570 QSOs made 8-12 November). After that, Yan, RZ3FW and Sergei, R4WAA were active as YJ0FWA from Efate (OC-035) on 14-19 November.



YOTA MONTH • The Youngsters On The Air group will be active again during the entire month of December. 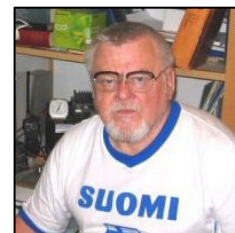

Paul, who had turned 82 on 1 November, passed away suddenly from a heart attack. First licensed in 1953 as WN4YWX, he was a well-known DXer and contester, and participated in several DXpeditions - the 1979 VP2KC CQ WW DX SSB Contest DXpedition to St. Kitts, which broke the world record for the Multi-Multi category; the 1999 Hillview Gardens Borneo DXpedition (9M6AAC, V8500 and 9M600 from the Spratly Islands); the 2009 K4M DXpedition to Midway Island and the 2013 C82DX DXpedition to Mozambique, just to name a few.

Toivo died in a tragic accident while in Israel. He was last heard on the bands as 4X/R1CC just a few days ago. An Ingrian Finn, he was born in 1940 in Leningrad, and was first licensed in 1957 as UW1BF. Over the years he was active from Magadan (UV0IA) and Moscow (UA3AEL, RA3AR, R3AR), as well as from Finland (OH1UU and OG1G).

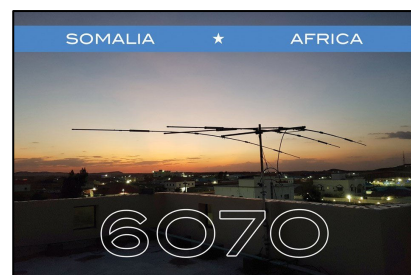

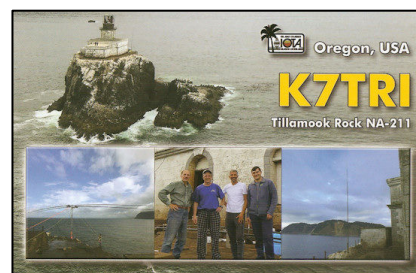
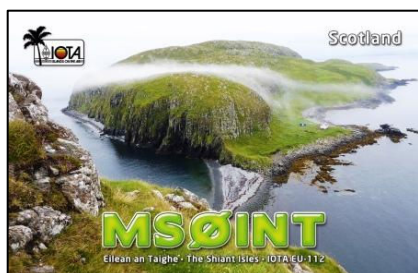
