3A - Ennio, IW1RBI will be active again as 3A/IW1RBI from Monaco on 11-13 September. He will operate SSB, RTTY and FT8 on 80-6 metres. QSL via home call. [TNX IW1RBI]

9A - Neno, 9A5N and Tom, 9A2AA will be active from Lastovo (EU-016) and several other nearby islands between 30 August and 11 September. QSL via home calls. [TNX 9A2AA]

9G - Currently QRV «from a temporary location in Accra», Matteo, IZ4YGS will be active again as 9G5GS from Sanzule, Ghana from 8 August to 15 September. In his spare time he will operate SSB and FT8 (Fox & Hound on 3590, 7056, 10131, 14090, 18095, 21091, 24926 and 28091 kHz), as well as USB on the QO-100 Geostationary satellite. QSL via Club Log's OQRS, LoTW, eQSL, or direct to home call.

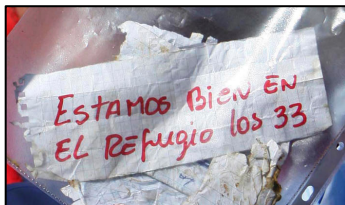
9H - COVID-19 permitting, Reiner, DL2AAZ will be active as 9H3SAT from Gozo Island, Malta (EU-023) on 4-18 September. He will operate SSB and CW on the HF bands, 6 metres and especially on the QO-100 Geostationary satellite. QSL via home call, direct or bureau. He does not use Club Log or LoTW. [TNX The Daily DX]



9M - Fifteen special event stations located in various Malaysian states and federal territories are expected to celebrate the 63rd anniversary of Malaysia's independence (31 August 1957) on 30-31 August. Active from West Malaysia will be 9M63MA, 9M63MB, 9M63MC, 9M63MD, 9M63MJ, 9M63MK, 9M63MM, 9M63MN,

9M63MP, 9M63MR, 9M63MT, 9M63MW and 9M63MY. Active from East Malaysia will be 9M63MQ (Sarawak) and 9M63MS (Sabah). QSL via operator's instructions.

CE - Radio Club Eternautas (CE3ETR) will operate special call sign CB33M from 5 August to 13 October. Look for activity on 80, 40, 30, 20, 15 and 10 metres SSB, CW and digital modes. This operation commemorates the tenth anniversary of the Copiapo mining



accident, when 33 miners were rescued after being trapped 700 metres underground in a copper-gold mine in the Atacama Desert for 69 days. QSL via CE3ETR.

CE - Members of the Radio Club Traiguén (CE6TRA) will be active as CB6P, CB6Q, CB6T and CB6TEB on 1-30 September to commemorate the arrival of the first railway in Traiguén. QSL direct to CE6TRA.

CN - Taking part in the annual Throne Day's celebrations, members of the Association Royale des Radioamateurs du Maroc (ARRAM) will be using the special prefix CN21 between 28 July and 15 August. Throne Day is a public holiday in Morocco that commemorates the enthronement of the incumbent monarch. Since 1999, it has been celebrated on 30 July.



CN - Members of the Association Royale des Radioamateurs du Maroc will be using the special prefix 5E7 on 17-31 August to mark the 67th anniversary of Revolution Day (20 August 1953).

CO - Once again special station T45FM will be QRV from the lighthouse at Punta Maya on 21-23 August, especial-

ly during the International Lighthouse Lightship Weekend. Expect activity on 80-10 metres, mainly digital modes. QSL via RW6HS. [TNX RW6HS]

CT - Members of the Oeste DX Gang will be active as CQ00DX/p from the lighthouse of Cape Carvoeiro on 21-23 August. They will operate CW, SSB and FT8/FT4 on the HF bands, plus 6 and 2 metres. QSL only via LoTW or Club Log's OQRS.

DL - DJ1JB, DJ4EL and DJ5TM will be active from IOTA Group EU-042 between 27 August and 3 September. Their main QTH will be on Pellworm Island, with side trips to as many nearby islands as possible. They will be using three different callsigns on different islands at the same time.

EA - Special event callsigns EG1SDC-EG9SDC and EH1SDC-EH9SDC will be activated on 1-13 September to commemorate Day of Asturias and the principality's patron saint, popularly known as the Santina de Covadonga. This is the 36th edition of the 'SDC' special event. QSL for all callsigns via



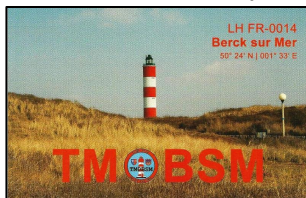

EA - Special call sign AO5CLE will be active on all bands and modes on 5-20 September to mark the centenary of the Spanish Legion, established in 1920 as the Spanish equivalent of the French Foreign Legion. QSL via EA5GTU.

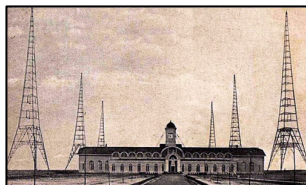
ES - Look for ES0/LY50 to be active from a «few Estonian lighthouses» located on islands in IOTA Group EU-034 on 17-19 August. QSL direct to home call.

F - The Radio Club du Val d'Issole (F8KGH) will be active as TM76DP on 8-22 August to commemorate the 76th anniversary of the landing operation ("Debarquement de Provence") of the Allied invasion of Provence during World War II (15 August 1944). They will operate SSB, CW and digital modes on 80-6 metres. QSL via LoTW and eQSL. [TNX Les Nouvelles DX]

F - A German team (DJ5KX, DJ8EI, DK5OPA, DL1DCT, DL5KA and DL8KR) will be active again as TM0BSM from the lighthouse at Berck-sur-Mer, France on 20-23 August. 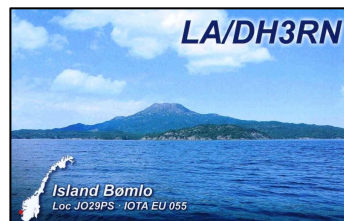

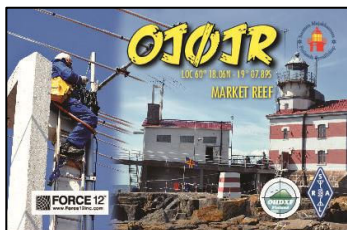

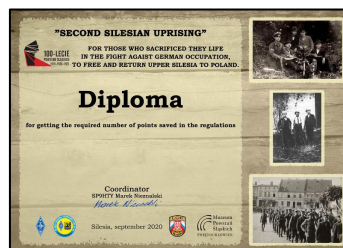

SP - Special callsigns 3Z1920PS, HF1920PS, SN1920PS,



SO1920PS, SP1920PS and SQ1920PS will be activated from 15 August to 15 September to commemorate the centenary of the second Silesian Uprising (19-25 August 1920). The Silesian Uprisings ("Powstania Slaskie")

were a series of three conflicts in Upper Silesia from 1919 to 1921 in which Poles and Polish Silesians sought to break away from Germany and join the new Polish Republic, founded after World War I. SV - Francesco, IK6QON will be active as SV8/IK6QON from Kerkyra Island (EU-052) on 9-20 August. He will operate CW and SSB on 40-6 metres. QSL via home call. [TNX NG3K]

SV - Pol, SV1AHH and George, SV1GGF will be active as SX1AFM on 1-30 September, in celebration of the 70th anniversary of the Hellenic Air Force History Museum. They will operate all modes on 80-6m. A certificate will be available, see <https://www.qrz.com/db/SX1AFM> for information.

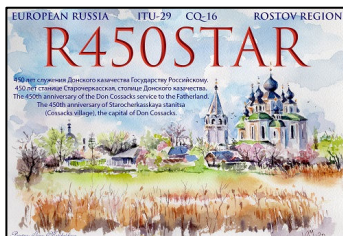
SV - SX300ML is a special callsign commemorating the 2500th anniversary of the epic Battle of Thermopylae (480 BC), when King Leonidas of Sparta and a small force of Greek warriors, including 300 Spartans, resisted the much larger invading Persian army led by Xerxes the Great. The callsign's suffix stands for «molon labe» («come and take them!»), the laconic phrase attributed to Leonidas in reply to Xerxes' demand that the Spartans surrender their



weapons. Activity is expected to start in on the island of Agios Efstratios (EU-049), and to continue at the Science Center & Technology Museum in Thessaloniki between 5 and 19 September. QSL via LoTW, Club Log's OQRS, or direct to SV2GWY. More information can be found on <https://www.qrz.com/db/SX300ML>.

TA - Commemorating the 105th anniversary of the Battle of Gallipoli during World War I, special event stations TC3GP and TC3GS will be active on 3-23 August. QSLs via YM3KCN.

TK - Frans, DJ0TP will be active as TK/DJ0TP from Corsica (EU-014) from 6 August to 14 September. During the International Lighthouse Lightship Weekend (22-23 August) he will operate from the Phare d'Alistro. QSL via LoTW, or via home call (direct and bureau). [TNX DJ0TP]



UA - Special callsigns R450STAR and R450AKSU will be active on 1-30 September to mark the 450th anniversary of the Cossack settlements of Starocherkasskaya and Aksayskaya (nowaday Aksay), Rostov Oblast.

VK - Andy, VK5MAV plans to be active again as VK5MAV/p from Granite Island (OC-228) on either 22 or 23 August, depending on weather conditions. W - John, N9EAJ will be active holiday style as N9EAJ/4 from Santa Rosa Island (NA-142) on 20-25 August. He will operate SSB and CW on 4015 metres. QSL via home call. [TNX The Daily DX]

W - «Hurricanes permitting», look for Allan KV4T/p and Bridget KS4YT/p to be active from Dauphin Island (NA-213) on 4-7 September. They will operate FT4 and FT8 on 40 metres. QSL via home calls, eQSL and LoTW. [TNX DX World]

AUSTRALIA: 2x1 CALLSIGNS • The Australian Communications and Media Authority (ACMA) has approved the issue of 2x1 callsigns with VJ, VK and VL prefixes. These callsigns are to be used for contest operation only (any local or international contest), and will be available to Advanced class licencees only (individual or club). Moreover, Australian amateur radio operators are no longer forced to change callsign when they upgrade to a higher level of licence or move to a different part of the country.



COVID-19 COMMUNICATION EVENT • Held on 6-7 June [425DXN 1518], the «international gathering of STAYHOME/STAYS SAFE stations and fellow amateur radio operators was organized as a brief 24 hours event where hams were able to quickly greet each other, in a contest-like format, in the spirit of well-being», the Organizing Committee (E21EIC, KO8SCA, OH2BH, OH2MM and PY5EG) reports. «A total of 18,838 hams from 181 DXCC Entities participated in the event, using the CW, SSB and FT8 transmission modes. There were 39 registered STAYHOME/STAYS SAFE stations from all continents, making this event a very unique global undertaking. An impressive 120,181 radio contacts were made during the event».

The **World Winners** are LY9A (Multi-Mode), PP5JR (SSB), RG9A (CW) and YO9H (Digital). The **Continental Winners** are EA8RM (Africa), LY9A (Europe), PY5KD (South America), RG9A (Asia), W1UE (North America) and ZL3P (Oceania). The most productive STAYHOME/STAYSAFE groups that dominated the continental landscape were from Romania, Brazil and Finland. The detailed results of the event are available at <http://ko8sca.com/results.pdf>. The prize lottery will be organized within the next two-weeks.

«The COVID-19 Communication Event was part of the global STAYHOME activity from 8 April to 7 June. The OH0-OH9 stations made an impressive 133,000 contacts along with 25,000 FT8 QSOs logged by the Brazilian digital station ZW5STAYHOME, working hams from a total of 180 countries from all 40 CQ zones, with other STAYHOME stations totaling almost 290,000 contacts in the two-month period».



IARU NEWS: HF DIGITAL MODE BAND PLAN REVIEW • «Because frequency allocations and amateur radio operating interests vary in different parts of the world, the development of band plans - voluntary guidelines on the use of the spectrum that is available to radio amateurs - is a responsibility of the three IARU regional organizations», IARU Secretary David Sumner, K1ZZ posted to the website of IARU on 14 August. «Each of the three Regions has a band

planning committee to focus on this work. In recent years there have been increased efforts to bring the regional band plans into alignment wherever possible. Final approval of band plan revisions is generally given by the regional conferences of IARU member-societies that are held every three years on a rotating basis.

This approach to band planning generally has kept pace with the evolution of amateur radio operating. However, the explosive growth in HF (below 30 MHz) digital modes, particularly FT8, has led to perceived overcrowding of HF digital mode band segments. Accordingly, a working group has been formed consisting of representatives of the three regional band planning committees. This is the first time the three Regions have joined together to directly coordinate band planning efforts.

The working group has already had fruitful discussions with the WSJT development Group led by Joe Taylor, K1JT. Additional discussions, including with other HF stakeholders, will be held as part of a fundamental review of the different HF digital modes, and how they can be best categorized and arranged to share the limited spectrum available.

The main aim is to develop solutions that reduce congestion within very popular mode segments while preventing mutual interference between incompatible modes to the greatest extent possible. While the proposed band plan revisions will have to be approved by member-societies in each Region, recent administrative changes mean that the changes can be implemented without having to wait for the regional conferences.
