4X - Special call signs 4X75V and 4Z75V will be active from Israel on 1-10 May to commemorate the 75th anniversary of the end of World War II. QSL via 4X6ZM and logsearch on Club Log; all QSOs will be confirmed automatically via the bureau.



5Z - Members of the Radio Society of Kenya will be active as 5Z4STAYHOME "in recognition of the extraordinary circumstances the current COVID-19 pandemic has wrought globally". All QSLs

will be sent via the bureau.

9A - Radio Klub Grada Zaboka (9A0Z) & friends will be active as 9A1CHRIS on 4-10 May to honour the memory of Kresimir "Chris" Kovarik, 9A5K (8 May 1974-27 February 2019). A special QSL card will be downloadable on <http://www.9a0z.com/>. Past President of the Croatian Amateur Radio Association (HRS) and Vice Chairman of the IARU Region 1 HF Committee, Chris was the author of DXlog.net and a competitor in three World Radiosport Team Championships (2006, 2014 and 2018). In 2019 he was inducted into the CQ Contest Hall of Fame.

9M - Members of the Malaysian Amateur Radio Transmitters Society will operate three special call signs starting on 15 May for three months: 9M4STAYHOME, 9M4COVID19 and 9M4DUDUKRUMAH ("stay home" in Malay). Operations will

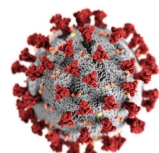

FP - Eric, KV1J has had to postpone his trip to Miquelon Island [425DXN 1501] because of travel restrictions. He now plans to be QRV as FP/KV1J from 22 September to 6 October, "subject to restrictions at that time". He will operate SSB, RTTY, FT8, FT4 and some CW



on 80-6 metres, with a focus on 60, 12, 10 and 6 metres. Activity on 160 metres will be limited. He will participate in the CQ WW RTTY DX Contest. QSL via home call (direct or bureau), LoTW and eQSL; logsearch on Club Log. See <http://www.kv1j.com/fp/July20.html> for updates.

G - David, G4YVM will be active as GB4DLS until 2 June to commemorate the 80th anniversary of the pivotal role played by the "Dunkirk Little Ships" during Operation Dynamo (26 May-4 June 1940). He will operate mainly CW, but "will try to run some SSB as well". QSL via G4YVM. The Little Ships of Dunkirk were a flotilla of hundreds of private boats that sailed from Ramsgate (England) to help evacuate 338,000 Allied soldiers from the beaches and harbour of Dunkirk in northern France.

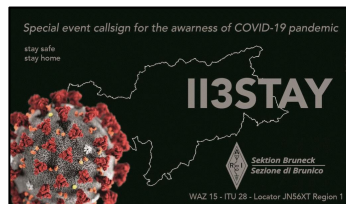

HK - The Ministry of Information Technologies and Communications has granted a special "stay home" callsign for the Liga Colombiana de Radioaficionados' members to use. Look for 5JSTAYHOME (only one digit) to be active on all bands and modes from 12 May to 27 July QSL via LoTW and eQSL.



HS - Members of the Radio Amateur Society of Thailand (RAST) will be active as E2STAYHOME from 2 May until 15 July. All QSOs will be confirmed via LoTW and the bureau; direct cards via E21EIC.



I - I13STAY is another "stay home" callsign, to be used by members of ARI Bruneck/Brunico (IQ3ED) between 12 May and 31 December. QSL via the bureau, or direct to

IN3ZWF.

I - 4U9STAYHOME is the special callsign for the UN Global Service Center's Amateur Radio Club (4U1GSC) to join the Stay Home campaign from 15 May to 15 June. DXCC wise, this activity counts for Italy. QSL via 9A2AA, direct or bureau.



I - Michele, IZ2FME will operate CW only as I12EMCA between 1 July and 31 December. The special callsign's suffix stands for Emilio Caimi (1876-1963), the straight key manufacturer whose company supplied the Italian Royal Air Force in the Thirties. QSL via LoTW, or direct to IZ2FME.



JA - Once again the ITU Association of Japan's Amateur Radio Club will operate special event station 8J11ITU from 30 April to 31 May to celebrate the World Telecommunication and Information Society Day (17 May) and the creation of the International Telecommunication Union. QSL via the JARL bureau and eQSL.

JT - Special event station JU85UIA will be active through the end of the year in celebration of the 85th anniversary of the University of Internal Affairs in Ulaanbaatar, Mongolia. QSL direct to JT1CH.

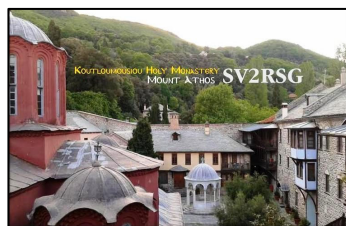

UR - Special callsigns EM100ALK, EM100LK and EO100A will be active from 1 June to 1 July to memorialize Ivan Nikitovich Kozhedub (1920-1991). QSL via operator's instructions. A certificate will be available, see <https://www.grz.com/db/EM100ALK> for information. A Marshal of Aviation, Ivan Nikitovich was a flying ace, attributed with the highest number of air combat victories of any Soviet pilot during World War II.

VE - Gilles, VA2EW (VE2TZT) will be active as CF2T between 8 May and 6 June to commemorate the 75th anniversary of the end of World War II. Main activity will be during the CQ WW WPX CW Contest. QSL via LoTW.

VE - Although the Formula 1 Grand Prix in Montreal has been cancelled, Jean, VE2JCW will be active as VE2SPEED between 1 and 30 June. QSL via Club Log's OQRS, or direct to VE2JCW.

VU - Special COVID-19 stations from India include AT0II ("Improve Immunity", QSL via VU2DCT); AT20SH (QSL via Club Log's OQRS, or direct to VU2HIT); AT2SH (QSL via MOOXO's OQRS); AT2SHI ("Stay Home India", QSL via eQSL, or direct to VU2UUU); AT2SON ("Save Our Nation", QSL via VU3ZIG); AT2TNX (QSL via Club Log's

"After their successful VP8PJ South Orkney Islands 2020 DXpedition, PDXG is pleased to announce their intention to activate the New Zealand Sub Antarctic Islands (ZL9), Clublog #24 Most Wanted, in the 2021-2022 time-frame. The plan includes 160-10m operation, CW/SSB/RTTY/FT8, with an emphasis on 160, 80, 60, 40 and, propagation dependent, 12 and 10 metres. The landing permit process is pending and discussions with transportation partners have begun. However, the COVID-19 lockdown has caused significant delays and uncertainty. The UN HQ station 4U1UN will be QRV; also active will be its sister stations 4U1GSC from Italy (operated as 4U9STAYHOME) and 4U1A from Austria (operated as 4U2STAYHOME), as well as special event station W2I/STAYHOME (headed by N2RJ and W2IRT, and activated on SSB, CW and FT8 simultaneously).



The COVID-19 Radio Communication Event is endorsed by IARU President Tim Ellam (VE6SH), and under the patronage of Pekka Haavisto, Finland's Minister for Foreign Affairs. COVID-19 IMPACT ON YOTA • The 10th edition of the Youngsters on the Air (YOTA) Summer Camp, to be hosted by the Croatian Amateur Radio Association on 8-15 August [425DXN 1498], has been cancelled and postponed to 2021. Also postponed until the summer of 2021 is the first YOTA IARU Region 2 Summer Camp, which was expected to be held on 21-26 June.



DXCC YEARBOOK • The 2019 ARRL DXCC Yearbook, which includes the Clinton B. DeSoto Challenge top scorers and the Annual Listing, is available for viewing and/or downloading on <http://www.arrl.org/dxcc>. The Annual Listing of DXCC membership contains the callsigns and credited totals for new awards and endorsements during the calendar year period from 1 January through 31 December 2019. The DXCC Honor Roll includes those who are within 9 Entities of the "current" Entity count for Mixed, Phone, CW and Digital modes. As of 31 December 2019, there were 340 Entities on the DXCC List, and entry level DXCC Honor Roll was achieved at 331. In order to appear in this Annual List, you must have made a submission during the 2019 calendar year, and an active award total must have increased by at least one point. All active Honor

Roll members appear automatically, regardless of a submission.

CQ AMATEUR RADIO HALL OF FAME

The CQ Amateur Radio Hall of Fame was established in January 2001 to recognize individuals - radio amateurs or not - who significantly affected the course of Amateur Radio, as well as radio amateurs who have made significant contributions either to amateur radio, to their professional careers or to some other aspect of life on our planet. This year's inductees, which bring the total number of members of the CQ Amateur Radio Hall of Fame to 333, are:

- **Chet Atkins, W4CGP (SK)**, legendary musician known as "Mister Guitar", and music producer; ushered in "the Nashville sound" on RCA Records. (Note: Chet's call has subsequently been re-issued).
- **Les Barclay, G3HTF (SK)**, propagation expert, leader of International Telecommunication Union propagation study groups and Chairman of the ITU's first Radiocommunication Assembly in 1993; top official in the UK's telecommunication regulatory agency.
- **George Laurer, K4HZE (SK)**, developer of the UPC (Universal Product Code) or "bar code" on merchandise, permitting items purchased at stores to be scanned on checkout rather than manually rung up.

- **Yasuo "Zorro" Miyazawa, JH1AJT**, whose Foundation for Global Children helps fund educational and medical programs for children around the world; FGC also works with several countries to help them organize and train teams for the Olympic Games and Paralympic Games.
- **Champ Muangamphun, E21EIC**, is a DXer and DXpeditioner who has been a sparkplug for growing interest in ham radio in Thailand and throughout Southeast Asia; Champ also accompanies JH1AJT on many of his humanitarian missions and operates DXpedition-style ham stations while Zorro works with government officials and non-governmental organizations on behalf of the Foundation for Global Children.
- **Sultan Qaboos bin Said, A41AA (SK)**, Sultan of Oman from 1970-2020; transformed impoverished country into a modern and prosperous state with influence throughout the Middle East.
- **Tom Roscoe, K8CX**, a champion of amateur radio history who collects and makes available online his "Ham Gallery" of old QSL cards and other historic photos.

CQ CONTEST HALL OF FAME

Established in 1986, the CQ Contest Hall of Fame honours those contesters who not only excel in personal performance but who also "give back" to the hobby in outstanding ways. CQ Contesting Editor David Siddall (K3ZJ) conducted a virtual induction ceremony at the conclusion of the daylong 2020 Contest University webinar on 14 May. This is the 37th annual induction and the first to be conducted online. The 2020 inductees to the CQ Contest Hall of Fame are:

- **Geoffrey Howard, W0CG/PJ2DX**, who purchased and restored the PJ9JT contest station in 2000 that had been owned by CQ Contest Hall of Famer John Thompson, W1BIH/PJ9JT. The location was named "Signal Point" and the PJ2T callsign pays homage to PJ9JT. Geoff established the Caribbean Contest Consortium to help manage and maintain the station, and has consistently made the station available to guest operators over the years, including serving as host station several times for young operators participating in the Dave Kalter Youth DX Adventure program. He has also worked closely with VERONA, Curacao's national ham radio society. Geoff served for more than 25 years in the United States Air Force, retiring as a colonel; worked for RCA and the Federal Aviation Administration, and taught in the Graduate School of Management at Kent State University in Ohio.
- **Willard "Bill" Myers, K1GQ**, a pioneer of computer-based systems for designing and switching antennas at contest stations, designed the Cushcraft "Skywalker" series of monoband Yagis, helped build the early PacketCluster network and served as mentor to several of today's most prominent contesters, including K1AR, K1DG, K1JX, and others. Bill was also a major behind-the-scenes force at the 2014 World Radiosport Team Championship (WRTC) competition in Massachusetts, and is currently providing support and refinement of the SkookumLogger contest logging program for Apple computers.
- **Gene Zimmerman, W3ZZ (SK)**, was a major force in VHF contesting as well as an accomplished HF contester. He was a member of both ARRL's and CQ's contest committees at various times between 1972 and 2012, was QST magazine's VHF Editor for nearly a decade, and was CQ Contest magazine's VHF columnist as well. Gene took over the struggling CQ World Wide VHF Contest in 1999, reinvented it as a 6- and 2-meter only event and sparked its growth into a truly worldwide competition. He was also instrumental in organizing the mid-Atlantic VHF contesting group that became known as the K8GP Grid Pirates.

Registered participants in the virtual Contest University webinar were able to view the induction ceremony live. It was also "simulcast" on DX Engineering's YouTube channel, where it is stored for later viewing: <https://www.youtube.com/user/DXEngineering/featured> (the recording of the ceremony starts at 09:15:30).

CQ DX HALL OF FAME

Established in 1967, the CQ DX Hall of Fame honours those DXers who not only excel in personal performance, but who also "give back" to the hobby in outstanding ways. CQ DX Editor Bob Schenck, N200, made a virtual presentation on the Ham Nation podcast on 20 May. The 2020 inductees to the CQ DX Hall of Fame are:

- **Tony Gonzalez, EA5RM** - has been an active DXpeditioner for 20 years, often organizing and leading teams to operate from difficult and challenging locations. Tony and his teams have also helped establish or re-establish amateur radio activities in several countries, including Rwanda (where it had been banned for a decade due to civil war) and the newly-independent country of South Sudan. In addition, Tony has made ten trips to Bolivia to establish and maintain HF communication links between medical facilities and remote villages in the Amazon rain forest, and has operated as CP1XRM during his free time. Tony's work in South America earned him the ARRL International Humanitarian Award in 2015.
- **Edward "Ned" Stearns, AA7A** - is an accomplished DXer, DXpeditioner (he's been on 32 of them and led 8) and technical innovator. He introduced the use of switchable vertical dipole array antennas on island DXpeditions and designed "dual-band discone" antennas for use with the Northern California DX Foundation's worldwide beacon network. Ned also worked with 2019 DX Hall of Fame inductee Joe Taylor, K1JT, on developing the "Fox/Hound" mode for FT8 used by DXpeditions. Ned also maintains two remote stations in Arizona, has made presentations at many technical conferences and has served in a variety of leadership roles in the hobby. On the air, he is at the Top of the Honor Roll for DXCC Phone and Mixed, was the first recipient of 11-band DXCC and has worked over 160 countries via EME (Earth-Moon-Earth).



DXPEDITION OF THE YEAR • On 14 May the Southwest Ohio DX Association announced their 2019/2020 DXpedition of the Year award, which recognizes "excellence in DXpedition planning and execution" from Most Wanted DXCC Entities. DXpeditions completed from March 2019 through February 2020 were eligible for this year's award, which has been presented to the T19A DXpedition to Coco's Island (February 2020). GERMANY: EXPANDED ACCESS TO 6M • The German regulator (Bundesnetzagentur) "has made a first preliminary implementation of the WRC-19 results for the 6m band". Fixed amateur radio stations in Germany have now access to 50-52 MHz on a secondary basis, with a maximum bandwidth of 12 kHz for all modes and the use of horizontally polarized antennas. Contest operations are also permitted. In addition, on the 50,000-50,400 MHz sub-band holders of Class A licences can transmit with a maximum of 750W PEP, and Class E licencees can use a maximum of 100W PEP. The maximum permitted transmission power is still limited to 25W PEP elsewhere. These provisions will apply until 31 December 2020, or until a revised Frequency Ordinance comes into force - whichever is earlier.



INDEXA NEWSLETTER • The Spring 2020 issue (#129) of the International DX Association's Newsletter is now available for download on the INDEXA website (<https://indexa.org/newsletters.html>). This issue reports on the September 2019 DXpedition to Western Kiribati (T30L) and Nauru (C21WW) conducted by the Latvian team of YL2GM, YL1ZF, YL2KA and YL3JA.

IOTA AND LOTW QSO MATCHING • Islands On The Air (IOTA) Ltd has announced "the implementation of the ARRL application which allows the use of QSO matching via LoTW. This will allow IOTA chasers to obtain credits by matching their logs with those at LoTW in addition to those at Club Log. We have a lot of work ahead of us to identify the time windows of past IOTA operations and this will be phased in over the next few months. An initial list of operations arising from the link-up with LoTW has been added to the database and these will become available for QSO matching from 21 May. Further additions will be made on an ongoing basis". IOTA CONTEST 2020: CHANGES • In line with "Stay at Home" guidance, to minimise the impact of COVID-19, the IOTA Contest 2020 will be exclusively for single operators using their home stations: only "Single Operator Fixed Island" stations, and "Single Operator Fixed World" stations will be eligible to enter. The RSGB will not be awarding trophies this year, but downloadable certificates will be available to winners. The IOTA Contest will be held from 12 UTC on 25 July until 11:59 UTC on 26 July. IOTA DXPEDITIONER OF THE YEAR • The second Island Radio Expedition Foundation's (IREF) "IOTA DXpeditioner of the Year" Award was presented on the Ham Nation podcast on 27 May. The three awardees are Mikhail Zavarukhin VE7ACN (1st place), Vasily V. Pinchuk R7AL (2nd) and Vladimir P. Angeli RK8A (3rd). The award is for encouraging "expeditioners, through friendly competition, to activate islands that won't necessarily meet IREF funding guidelines but are needed by many of the newer chasers". QSLs

- **9J2LA:** "I am still waiting for the 9J2LA cards to arrive from UX5UO QSL Print", Charles (M0OXO) reported on 12 May. A certain delay was expected "due to COVID-19 issues", but apparently "there are more restrictions on the route between Ukraine and the UK. Labels and envelopes are all ready here, I just need the cards to arrive and they will be mailed within 48 hours of receipt". Please be patient and "stop emailing me asking about the position of the cards and LoTW".
- **E44CC:** all direct OQRS and direct mail requests for E44CC (February 2020) have been processed, and the QSL cards will be mailed soon; bureau requests are yet to be done. There is no backlog for 7P8C, 9LY1JM, F6KOP, F6KOP/p, TM1A, TM9A and TY7C. [TNX F5NQL]
- **EP6DSP:** Russ, WA3FRP is the QSL manager for EP6DSP, a newly licenced operator from Dezful, Iran. Russ accepts direct and bureau cards for all QSOs from March 2020 onwards. [TNX WA3FRP]
- **EY8MM:** Mike Cizek, W0VTT is the new QSL manager for Nodir, EY8MM. Mike will have all logs dating back to 1 January 1994. A batch of new cards has been ordered, but it might take some time before Mike receives them.
- **VP8PJ:** Tim, M0URX reports that all VP8PJ OQRS requests and direct mailed QSL cards received by 20 May were posted from the UK on 21 May. Depending on your country's COVID-19 situation, please allow 10-14 days for the cards to arrive, in some cases possibly longer. Bureau cards will be shipped directly to the worldwide bureaux early next year.

However, if the DXpedition schedule is delayed due to COVID-19 regulations, we have been assured by Parks Canada that they will work with us to reschedule the DXpedition. The team has been polled, and all agree that they will be able to comply to revised dates. Currently the border between Canada and USA is closed until 21 June. Shortly after that date, we hope to have a firm decision for October assuming no additional regulations for travel, etc are placed into effect". [TNX NOTG]

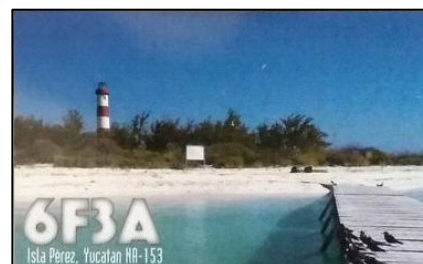
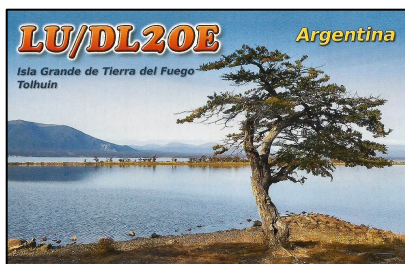
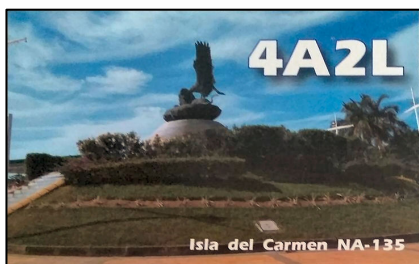
TQSL: NEW VERSION • A new version (v2.5.4) of LoTW's Trusted QSL (TQSL) has been released: <http://www.arrl.org/tqsl-download>. This version has new features as well as corrections for defects found since TQSL 2.5.3 was released. This release also includes an update to the most recent TQSL configuration file. TQSL 2.5.4 can be installed to upgrade any older version. On all three supported platforms (Windows, MacOS and Linux), installing TQSL 2.5.4 will replace older versions of Trusted QSL while preserving your Callsign Certificates, Station Locations, and preferences.

WSJT-X 2.2.0-RC3 • A third candidate release of WSJT-X 2.2.0 has been available for beta testing (not for long-term general use) since 29 May. It provides a number of new features and capabilities, including improvements to the decoders for five modes (FT4, FT8, JT4, JT65 and WSPR), a new format for "EU VHF Contest" Tx2 and Tx3 messages and improvements to accessibility, as well as other minor enhancements and bug fixes. A detailed list of program changes since the RC1 release can be found here: https://physics.princeton.edu/pulsar/k1jt/Release_Notes.txt. Note that the WSJT-X development team - "on a trial basis, and in response to numerous suggestions from around the world" - has also added a second set of suggested dial frequencies for FT8 on 40, 30, 20 and 6 metres (7071, 10133, 14071 and 50310 kHz) to be used when the conventional sub-bands seem "too full". The General Availability (GA) release will likely be made in the first week of June.



+ SILENT KEYS+ Bill O’Kain (K4LTA) passed away on 28 April. Born in 1931 and first licenced in 1956 as KN4LTA, he was a member of the First Class CW Operators’ Club (FOC) and was very active in many contests. Bill and his wife Ruby (K4UPS) enjoyed several trips to the Caribbean since 1980 (J37BO, J38A, J6LTA, J70A, J74Z).

Herbert L. Schoenbohm (KV4FZ) became a Silent Key on 29 April aged 84. First licenced in 1954 as W0VXO, in 1968 he moved to the U.S. Virgin Islands. Herb was one of the pioneers in Top Band DXing, and was the third (tied with W8LRL) to gain DXCC on 160 metres back in 1977.
