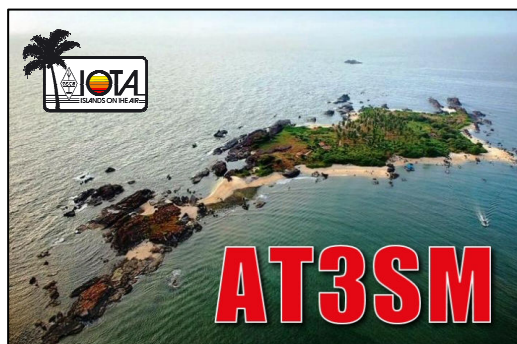

DX INFORMATION

6W - Gerhard, OE3GEA will be active as 6W/OE3GEA from near Dakar between 27 January and 4 February. He will operate CW on 30-10 metres. QSL via home call. [TNX DX Newsletter]

6W - Willy, ON4AVT will be active again as 6W7/ON4AVT from Warang, Senegal from 3 February to 16 April. Usually he operates mainly FT8 on 80-10 metres; he will be QRV also on the QO-100 satellite. QSL via Club Log's OQRS.

8P - Chris, WA7RAR will be active again as 8P9CB from Barbados (NA-021) on 10-25 January. Most of his operations will be portable at various locations, especially POTA sites. He will be QRV on 20-10m CW and SSB. QSL via LoTW, or direct to WA7RAR.

8Q - Keith, G3WRO will be active holiday style as 8Q7WR from the Maldives (AS-013) from 24 January to 6 February. He will operate SSB on 40-10 metres, possibly also on 80m. QSL via home call. [TNX The Daily DX]



8R - 8R7X is the callsign for the 14-24 February DXpedition to Guyana [425DXN 1675]. Four young operators (DJ4MX, DK6SP, HA8RT and M0SDV) will operate CW, SSB, FT8 and RTTY on 160-6 metres. QSL via M0OXO's OQRS and LoTW. See <https://8r-2024.com/> for more information.

9A - Throughout 2024 Tom, 9A2AA will use 9A67AA to mark his 67 years of activity on the amateur radio bands. QSL via home call.

A3 - Darren, VK4MAP has been active as A31DJ since 28 December, and will remain QRV as A31DJ/p until 11 January. He was on Tongatapu Island (OC-049) until 2 January, then he moved to Eua Island in the same IOTA group. He operates SSB on 80, 40, 20, 15, 12 and 10 metres. QSL via VK4MAP (direct only).

C6 - Look for Kevin, W1DED to be active as W1DED/C6A from Eleuthera (NA-001), Bahamas on 15-21 January. QSL via LoTW, or direct to home call.



CEOZ - As of 12 January, the **CBOZA** DXpedition's two air freight shipments sent out of Miami last month had cleared Chilean customs, and were at the port in Valparaiso and scheduled for shipment by cargo vessel out to Robinson Crusoe Island, Juan Fernandez.

The DXpedition is set for 10-24 February. The operation by the 7-member on-island team will be complimented by an off-island team of over 30 remote operators from around the world. They will be using a NexGenRiB (Radio in a Box, developed by Gregg, W6IZT, with assistance from Warren, KD4Z and John N4IHV) on FT8 and CW with the callsign **CBOZEW**.

As for FT8 operations, please note that the CBOZEW remote station will be using WSJT-X running Fox/Hound mode, while the CBOZA on-island stations will be running MSHV software.

«The DXpedition made the decision to use the different callsign for two reasons. First, it is a way to commemorate the DXpedition's organizer Marco Quijada, CE1EW who became a Silent Key in November. The second rea-

son is to distinguish the DXpedition's remote CBOZEW QSOs from the on-island CBOZA QSOs. Because **the remote CBOZEW contacts will not count for IOTA** under current rules in the IOTA program, the team felt the easiest way to manage this issue and honor IOTA's requirements would be by simply operating the remote RiB with a different call sign». For both callsigns QSL via Club Log's OQRS, or direct to N2OO.

In addition to the original DXpedition budget, the team has incurred some significant unforeseen expenses: «so at this time we are appealing to DXers who have not lent support to the DXpedition to please consider making a donation». Bookmark <https://cb0za.com/> for more information and updates.

CN - Michel, F5LRL will be active as CN2DX from near Kenitra, Morocco from 20 January to 10 February. He will operate CW and SSB on 40-6 metres, and FT8 on 6m. Expect him to be QRV at 5-10 UTC and 18-22 UTC. QSL via EA5GL.

DL - DARC Team SES will operate special event callsign DM24EHF on 6-28 January. The suffix stands for European Handball Federation, whose 16th edition of the European Men's Handball Championship will be hosted in Germany (10-28 January). QSL via the bureau, or direct to DL2VFR.

DL - DG22SIXTY is the special callsign for DARC's Ortsverband Gemund (G22) to celebrate their 60th anniversary from 1 February until 31 December. QSL via the bureau.

DL_ant - Felix, DL5XL will be active again as DP1POL from the German research station Neumayer III, Antarctica (AN-016) starting around 20 January until early March. In his spare time he will operate mainly CW, with some digimode and SSB. QSL via LoTW, or via DL1ZBO; QSOs will



also be uploaded to Club Log.

DU - "BJ", WA7WJR will be active holiday style as DU3/WA7WJR from the Region of Pampanga in the Philippines on 4-9 February. He will operate CW, SSB and digital modes on 20, 17, 15, 12 and 10 metres. He also plans to be active from the Governor Macario Amedo Park and the Mount Arayat National Park during this trip. QSL direct to WA7WJR; all QSOs will be uploaded to LoTW, Club Log and QRZ.

EA - Look for EG59GURU/p to be QRV from various SOTA locations in Spain on 8-21 January. This activity is a tribute to Jose-Antonio Gurutzarri "Guru" Jauregi (EA2IF), an outstanding personality of the Summits On The Air programme, who passed away in 2022. See <https://sites.google.com/view/ea2if-memorial> for more information; QSL cards will not be provided.

EA - Members of URE Valladolid will be active as EG1GOY on 4-11 February for the 38th edition of the Goya Awards, whose ceremony will take place on 10 February. QSL via EA1URV (bureau). Presented the Academy of Cinematographic Arts and Sciences of Spain, the Goya Awards are the Spanish equivalent of the Academy Awards. [TNX EA1LT]

ET - Bob, W9XY and Ken, K4ZW plan to be active from the ET3AA club station at Addis Ababa University's Institute of Technology on 12-20 January. They will focus on the high bands as there are still noise problems on the low bands. QSL via N2OO. [TNX The Daily DX]

F - Special callsign TM26PVJ will be activated from 26 January to 4 February for the 26th "Percee du Vin Jaune", the festival celebrating the "Opening of the Yellow Wine" which this year will take place at Arbois (Jura). QSL via

F8GGZ.

F - Members of Radio Club Jean Bart, F6KMB will be active as TM6C on 4-18 February during the traditional Dunkirk Carnival (Carnaval de Dunkerque). QSL via F6KMB.

F - Francois, F8DVD will be active as TM21AAW on 4-18 February, to promote the 21st Antarctic Activity Week (18-25 February). He will be QRV from his home QTH in France. QSL via LoTW, or via home call (direct or bureau).

FK - After their operation from Wallis Island (see FW below), Stan and Ted will be active as FK/LZ1GC and FK/LZ5QZ from Port Ouenghi, New Caledonia (OC-032) on 10-18 March. They will operate CW, SSB and digital modes on the HF bands. QSLs via Club Log's OQRS (preferred) or via LZ1GC.

FM - Francis, F6BWJ will be active again as FM/F6BWJ from Martinique (NA-107) starting on 11 January for two months. He will operate CW on 80-10 metres. QSL via LoTW, or via the bureau to home call. [TNX F6AJA]

FR - Thierry, FY4JI will be active on various bands as FR4AV from Reunion Island (AF-016) from 4 February to 11 March. QSL via EA5GL.

FW - Stan, LZ1GC and Ted LZ5QZ will be active as



FW8GC and TX8GC from Wallis Island (OC-054) from 19 February to 9 March. They will operate CW, SSB, FT8, FT4 and maybe some RTTY on 160-6m. QSLs via Club Log's OQRS (preferred), or via

H4 - Bernhard, DL2GAC will be active again as H44MS from Malaita (OC-047), Solomon Islands from around 10 February until 25 April. He will be QRV on a daily basis, with activity on 160-6 metres SSB and some FT8. QSL via home call, direct or bureau. He will upload his log to Club Log and LoTW.



HL - Ji, DS1TUW plans to be active as DS1TUW/2 from Paengnyong Island (AS-122, WWL PM27ix) from 29 February until around 1 UTC on 3 March. He will operate CW, FT8 and some SSB depending on propagation, on 40-6 metres. He plans to enable Club Log's Live Stream «to minimize the dupes», but «bear in mind there could be intermittent internet disconnections». QSL via Club Log's OQRS (direct and bureau), LoTW, or via home call.



HS - Champ, E21EIC and other six operators (namely E20NKB, E25KAE, HS0ZET, HS0ZKF, HS3NBR and HS6SSE) will be active as E20AX/p from Lipe Island (AS-126) on 12-14 January. They will operate CW, SSB and FT8 with two stations on 40-10 metres. QSL via E21EIC (but all QSOs will be confirmed automatically via LoTW and the bureau).

I - Throughout 2024 ARI Fidenza will use a series of special callsigns each representing a "keyword" that summarizes and characterizes the content of a sentence from one of Guglielmo Marconi's many public speeches:

I - A team from Slovenia (S51V, S52OT, S54W, S56N, S57DX, S57UN, S59A) will be active from Lampedusa Island (AF-019) on 20-28 January. Main activity will be during the CQ WW 160-Meter CW Contest as IG9/S57DX; outside the contest they will be QRV on all bands and modes. DXCC wise this one counts as Italy, but as African Italy in the CQ Contests and the CQ DX Marathon. QSL via S57DX. [TNX NG3K]



J3 - ON4HIL, ON4MA, ON5RA, ON5TN, ON6CC and ON7RU will be active as J38R from Grenada (NA-024) on 4-16 March. They will operate CW, SSB and FT8 on 160-10 metres, as well as RTTY on 20m, with up to four stations. Logsearch and Live Stream on Club Log; QSL via MOURX's OQRS; full log

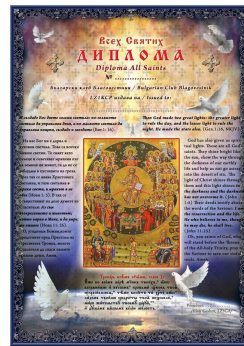

J7 - Laurent, FM5BH as J79BH and David, F8AAN as J79AN will be active from Dominica (NA-101) on 17-24 January. They will operate mainly CW, possibly with some SSB and FT8, on 80-10 metres. QSL J79AN via Club Log's OQRS, LoTW, or direct to F8AAN; QSL J79BH via Club Log's OQRS, or direct to FM5BH.

JD1_mt - Take, JG8NQJ expects to be back to the weather station on Minami Torishima (OC-073) sometime in late January, his QSL manager reports. Usually he remains there for about three months, and is QRV as JG8NQJ/JD1 in his limited spare time. He operates CW and some FT8 (please note that he wants you to call with your signal report, not your grid square). QSL via JA8CJY (direct), JG8NQJ (bureau) and LoTW.

ON - OT65BXE is the special callsign for members of UBA Section Bruxelles-Est to celebrate their club's 65th anniversary on 1-31 January. QSL via ON5UB.

OZ - Queen Margrethe II of Denmark will abdicate on 14



January, the 52nd anniversary of her accession. She will be succeeded by her elder son, who will reign as King Frederik X. To honour the incumbent monarch and welcome the new one, six special event stations in the Danish Realm (metropolitan Denmark, the Faroe Islands, Greenland) will be active on

all bands and modes as follows:

12-14 January OZ24QUEEN, OY24QUEEN, OX24QUEEN
14-16 January OZ24KING, OY24KING, OX24KING

OZ - Celebrating King Frederik X's succession to the Danish throne, special callsign OZ24FX will be used by several operators on 14-21 January. QSL via LoTW, eQSL,

Club Log's OQRS (direct and bureau), or direct to OZ1ACB. See <https://www.qrz.com/db/OZ24FX> for complete information about the available awards.

P4 - Mathias, DL4MM will be active again as P4/DL4MM and P40AA (used for FT8/FT4 and during the CQ WW 160-Meter CW Contest on 26-28 January) from Aruba (SA-036) on 19-31 January. He will operate CW, SSB and digital modes on 160-10 metres. QSLs via Club Log's OQRS, LoTW, or via DL4MM. [TNX NG3K]

PJ5 - Janusz, SP9FIH will be active again as PJ5/SP9FIH from Sint Eustatius (NA-145) from 11 January to 3 March. QSL via Club Log's OQRS, LoTW, or via SP9FIH. Bookmark <https://pj5-2024.dxpedititions.org/> for updates. [TNX NG3K]

T32 - A German team (DF4GV, DJ7TO, DK2AMM, DL1KWK, DL2AWG and DL4SVA) will be active as T32EU from Kiritimati/Christmas Island (OC-024), East Kiribati on 13-27 March. They will operate CW, SSB, RTTY and maybe FT8 on 160-6 metres with three stations. QSL via DL2AWG.

T8 - Look for T88AQ (QSL via Club Log's OQRS, LoTW, or via JH6WDG), T88HS (QSL direct to JA6KYU) and T88SM (QSL direct to JA6EGL) to be active on various bands and modes from the Palau Radio Club on Koror Island (OC-009) on 12-18 January.



TA - Special callsign TC6EQ will be active on 1-29 February to commemorate the earthquake that struck Turkey on 6 February 2023, causing widespread damage and killing nearly 51,000 people. In particular, this activity will honour the memory of Mustafa Ezer (TA8DX), who lost his life in that

UR_ant - Andrii, UT3UTQ has been active as EM1UTQ from the Akademik Vernadskyi station on Galindez Island (AN-006), Antarctica since 9 January. Also stationed at Vernadskyi is Serhii, UW5EHR, who has been QRV as EM1EHR since early December 2023. Both are members of the XXVIII Ukrainian Antarctic Expedition, which is expected to remain at the base until late March.

V3 - Uwe, DL8UD will be active again as V31KO from Belize from 15 February to 6 March. He will operate SSB, CW and FT8 on 160-6 metres, and will participate in the ARRL DX CW Contest (17-18 February), the CQ WW 160-Meter SSB Contest (23-25 February) and the ARRL DX SSB Contest (2-3 March) as V3O. VK - A team of six Australians (Chris VK5FR, Adam



VK5GA/VK2YK, Grant VK5GR, Ivan VK5HS, Andy VK5LA and Paul VK5PAS) will be active as VK5FIL from Flinders Island (OC-261) on 14-21 April. This IOTA group has not

been activated since

VP2M - Thaire, W2APF will be active again as VP2MDX from Montserrat (NA-103) from 11 January to 11 April. He will operate CW, SSB, FT8 and FM on 80-6 metres. QSL via LoTW, or direct to W2APF. [TNX The Daily DX]

VP6 - Roger, G3YBO hopes to be active as VP6/G3YBO from the shack of Meralda, VP6MW for one day, when his cruise ship stops at Pitcairn Island (OC-044). The date will be 28 January from 18 UTC onwards. He will operate SSB on 17-10 metres.



VU - Once again the West Bengal Radio Club (VU2WB) will provide assistance during the Ganga Sagar Mela on Sagar Island (AS-153). Observatory in Flagstaff, Arizona (18 February 1930). The inaugural event was held in 2021; this year's Pluto Anniversary Countdown will run on 10-18 February. Also, Doug Tombaugh (N3PDT), Clyde Tombaugh's nephew, will be operating during the event as W7P/O. QSL direct, see https://www.nadxa.com/w7p_pluto_2030.html for information.

YB - Emmanuel, F5LIT expects to be active again as YB9/F5LIT from Bali Island (OC-022) between 22 and 30 January. Usually he operates SSB on 40-10 metres. QSL direct to home call; he plans to upload his log to Club Log and LoTW.

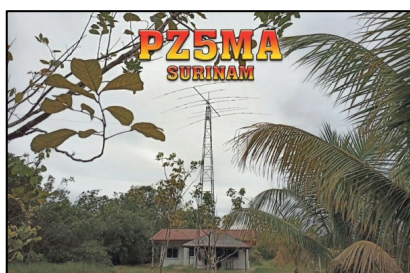

3Y0K: BOUVET ISLAND 2025 • «To date we have secured \$22,000 of the remaining \$150,000 needed to reach the expedition budget», the News Update #3 posted to Facebook on 2 January states. «January and February are critical months to achieve the needed funding to make the expedition viable. We will begin the purchase of equipment not committed as donations and continue to solicit sponsor agreements, but every dollar helps: so please visit <https://3y0k.com/> and click that little donate button – and remember, Century Club Donors will receive a special “Thank You” regardless of being in the log or not.

Coming in late February/early March we will have the vessel inspection to verify its seaworthiness for the long journey from the Falklands to Bouvet. At this time, we must make the first \$100,000 deposit presuming the boat passes professional inspection so funding is time critical, please help if you can, with whatever you can. We will also be procuring the custom-made tents to survive the harsh environment found from our previous activation of Bouvet, as

well as proper antenna systems. Up to June we will complete the testing of the remote equipment on a South Pacific expedition by some of our friends in the DX community and begin training the chosen remote operators. Note that the remote will be FT modes – all SSB and CW will be from the island only. All other equipment, radios and antennas will be tested under duress to ensure all work without failure on Bouvet.

The next steps are to optimize our landing plan relative to predicted weather conditions, put the finishing touch on our logistics plan and prepare all equipment and supplies for shipping to the Falklands. By late August or early September, the

container will be packed and sent to meet us at the boat in January or February of 2025. All equipment, hard supplies and logistical materials will be used for our Peter I expedition the following year, greatly reducing the costs for that adventure». Updates will be posted as things progress and milestones are reached.

«What is the current 3Y0K plan for landing the equipment? Learning from the 3Y0J mistakes is essential to achieve success. Last time we planned based on little to no information about the landing conditions. This time we base our plan on our own real experience – three of us already did many dinghy landings, and we know the waters». CEPT IDENTIFICATION AND OPERATING RULES • John Crovelli (W2GD) and Ward Silver (N0AX) wrote a short article explaining how to operate and identify properly according to the CEPT rules: «there has been a lot of confusion about what is and isn't permitted and required», Ward says. «We hope this article will help reduce the number of rule violations and help all stations operate properly. CQ WW 160-METER CONTEST • Object of the contest is for amateurs around the world to contact other amateurs in as many USA States (CONUS plus District of Columbia), Canadian provinces, and countries as possible utilizing the 160m band (see <https://www.cq160.com/> for complete rules). This year's event will run on 26-28 January (CW) and 23-25 February (SSB), both legs from 22:00 UTC to 22:00 UTC.

DAYTON TOP BAND AND CONTEST DINNERS • The 34th Top Band Dinner will be held on 17 May, followed by the 30th Contest Dinner on 18 May. The events will take place at the Hope Hotel near Dayton, Ohio. TX5S • The team departed from San Diego on 11 January at 20 UTC, destination Clipperton Island. Follow their voyage at <https://share.garmin.com/TX5S>. During the crossing they were active as N6WM/mm from various ocean grids, which will be duly noted on the QSL cards (QSL via M0URX's OQRS).

The *Shogun* arrived at Clipperton later than expected due to rough seas. By late afternoon local time (UTC -8 hours) on 18 January, nine team members had landed on the island, but they did not yet have any radios yet. Operations started on 20 January at 02.13 UTC. At that time there was only one station running CW on 17 metres, as landing on the island was very challenging, and the team had to stop

sending over equipment when the seas became too dangerous. The camp itself had to be redesigned on the fly to a smaller footprint.

The weather forecast indicates that the team will need to depart the island earlier than originally planned. The objective is to safely navigate over the reef, which requires cooperation between the tides and winds. Therefore, the current plan is for TX5S to begin tear down on 27 January. There will be some activity on 30, 40, 17, 12 and 10 metres during the local night between Saturday and Sunday. On 28 January, all DXpedition equipment and personnel will be removed and the *Shogun* will depart for San Diego.

QSOs are being uploaded to Club Log (Live Stream enabled) and to M0URX's website (<https://www.m0urx.com/oqrs/logsearch.php>), where the OQRS will be enabled shortly after the team leaves the island. QSOs with early donors are being uploaded to LoTW within 24 hours. "Not in Log" and "busted calls" will be investigated by submitting the form on M0URX's website.

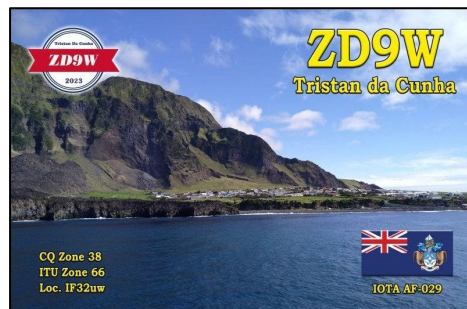
