Special callsigns (QSL via operator's instructions) are expected to be aired during this year's AAW from Algeria (7T22ANT), France (TM1ANT, TM21AAW), Italy (II2ANT, II5ANT, IR1ANT), Netherlands (PA6ANT, PF88ANT), Poland (SP0ANT), Spain (EH3ANT, EH5AAW, EH5ANT), USA (K4K, N5T). H40WA: FT8 SPOOF PREVENTION ---> The upcoming DXpedition to Temotu will operate FT8 using WSJT-X in Fox/Hound mode. In an effort to combat piracy, the team will be testing the anti-spoofing technology for FT8 developed by Brian Moran (N9ADG). H40WA will transmit CQ and work stations, and every few cycles will send a callsign followed by a 6-digit verification number, e.g.

010200 -3 0.1 300 - H40WA 695243

010200 -3 0.1 360 - CQ H40WA RH29

Only the genuine H40WA will be able to send the right code for a particular timestamp, which can be verified here: https://www.9dx.cc/verify/H40WA. This should help calling stations have confidence that they are not copying a pirate. In addition, Club Log's Live Stream feature will be enabled for QSOs in all modes: https://clublog.org/livestream/H40WA.
