





T32C

Between 1 and 24 October 2011, thirty eight radio amateurs from 11 countries activated the Island of Kiritimati (Christmas Island) in the Northern Line Islands, a part of the Republic of Kiribati. The DXpedition was organised by the Five Star DXers Association and operated using the call sign T32C.

Although planning for the DXpedition started over two years previously, not everything went to plan. A standard 8ft by 8ft by 20ft sea container holding 16 Yaesu FT DX 5000 transceivers, 16 Yaesu VL-1000 linear amplifiers, two 11 KVA diesel generators, the antennas and much, much more shipped from the UK to Christmas Island in February 2011. Although the container landed in Suva (Fiji) in April 2011, it became clear just two weeks prior to the start of the DXpedition that, due to a set of very unfortunate circumstances, it would not make it onto Christmas Island in time.

What to do? The decision was made to hand carry as much equipment as possible onto the Island and proceed with the DXpedition. Thanks to a tremendous response from our sponsors, the team members and the amateur radio community, ten brand new Yaesu FT450D transceivers (courtesy of Yaesu), nine linear amplifiers, and sufficient fibreglass poles were rapidly shipped to Honolulu to await hand carrying to Christmas Island.

On 28th September we checked in with Air Pacific for the flight to Christmas Island with approximately 450Kg of excess, yes excess, baggage. Having boarded the plane we thought nothing else could go wrong. Not quite true, imagine our response when the captain announced a delay whilst they offloaded some of the cargo because the plane was overweight. Fortunately he chose to remove some commercial freight and not our equipment.


Despite the initial problems we encountered, the DXpedition was a major success making 213,169 QSOs and establishing at least ten new world records. Additionally we believe it conducted the first ever 6m Earth-Moon-Earth QSOs from T32, as well as the first ever terrestrial QSOs on 6m with Brazil, Paraguay and New Caledonia.

The **Malpelo 2012 DXpedition** is pleased to announce that the HKØNA operating team has added two new operators, both physicians..WØGJ and K9SG. The team now consists of 18 operators representing eight countries.

Two members of the team will travel to Malpelo for a reconnaissance visit in late October. The purpose is to check out possible operating sites and make final decisions on the type and placement of antennas. We want to try to have antennas oriented for all parts of the DX world. Also, some equipment will be moved onto the island and stored until our DXpedition begins in late January 2012.

Every effort is being made to extend the length of time available for operating. This requires coordination with the authorities and agencies that oversee the island and the charter boat company. It appears that we can get to the island one day earlier and may have the option of staying a few extra days. Of course, our costs will rise accordingly. The current plan has the team QRV on or about January 23rd for 12-14 days.

Operations are planned on 160 through 6 meters on CW, SSB and one Digital mode.

Several of the Elecraft K3s are already in Colombia. The other K3s, five KPA500 amplifiers, antennas from DX Engineering, and Spiderbeam 65 foot masts for the low band antennas will be shipped soon. The Alpha 8410s are on their way.

The Malpelo team is paying all their transportation expenses to/from Colombia and putting up about one-half of all the DXpedition costs. This will be a very demanding DXpedition for several reasons. The terrain is particularly difficult, near vertical at times. And in order to have a clear radio view of Asia, the Pacific region and W6/W7; it will be necessary to locate operating site(s) and antennas at the top of the mountain. This further complicates the difficulties and physical risks to the team.

Team members vary in age from 25 to 73. But under the leadership and constant urging of our team's medical doctors, K9SG and WØGJ, we have all embarked on a physical training regimen. We should all be ready for the challenges come early 2012.

Three members of the team K4UEE, N4GRN and W6IZT will travel to Colombia Nov. 5-8 for a planning meeting with team leader, Jorge HK1R and other team members. The purpose of the meeting is to review all the checklists and responsibilities for each team member. With the information gained on the recent reconnaissance visit, decisions can be finalized concerning camp/operating sites, antenna types and placement, safety measures and other critical decisions necessary to the ultimate success for the DXpedition.

One critical decision to be made concerns the duration of the operation. We have permission to stay on site for 17 days versus the 14 days now planned. We will be reviewing the DXpedition budget to determine if we can afford the extra \$15,000 expense for 3 additional days.



You MUST have already made a submission in the 2011 calendar year via either LoTW or via a traditional, paper application. If you have made an application already in 2011, then you may submit a paper ST0R QSL (no other cards, just the ST0R South Sudan card) following these rules:

- Enclose \$5.00 (check, money order, CC#, or cash at your risk) for USA amateurs;
- Enclose \$6.00 (check, money order, CC#, or cash at your risk) for non-USA amateurs;
- Enclose an SASE for the return of the ST0R card;
- This special submission is ONLY for the ST0R card;
- If ANY other card(s) are included this will be considered a full submission subject to full fees, even if you already submitted in 2011;
- These submission conditions apply ONLY if you have already made a submission in 2011;
- This offer DOES NOT apply if you have not yet made your 2011 submission. All DXCC fees are in effect as you can include this card with your regular submission;

EARTHQUAKE EMERGENCY ● Radio Amateurs in Turkey remain active in the response to the earthquake that struck Van province on 23 October. Assistance has been given by TRAC in setting up VHF/UHF networks to relief agencies and some traffic is being carried on the 144 MHz band. The need for HF operations is reducing, however there is still a government station which may operate on 7.092 MHz USB. Amateurs are still requested to be careful when operating between 7.092 and 7.095 MHz to avoid interference to ongoing relief operations. [TNX IARU Region 1]

FUNDING FOR OPERATIONS FROM RARE IOTA GROUPS ● "With the 50th Anniversary IOTA Marathon [425DXN 1042, ed.] starting in January it would be great if we could get together a list of organisations who would be prepared in principle to help fund operations from the rarer IOTA groups during this two year period. Without lots of operations from this tier of IOTA groups the marathon will not achieve the success it deserves. For this purpose we have decided that "rarer IOTA groups" means groups worked by less than 33% of record-holders at the start of day 1 of the operation. Would DX funding bodies and individuals who are prepared to contribute to this two year IOTA initiative please let me know on g3kma@dsl.pipex.com. The intention is that grants would be made directly by contributors to the operation involved as is current usual practice, not through the IOTA Committee. However if we get a good response, we will consider providing some additional funding from a source of funds available to the IOTA Committee." IOTA EU-155 • The retention of EU-155 in IOTA list is in doubt. "The IOTA Manager was informed at Ham Radio 2011 Friedrichshafen that the two barrier islands listed as qualifying for EU-155, Baron and Scanno di Piallazza, no longer exist. Authoritative information has now been provided by a local operator to show this probably to be the case. It is worth noting that the Po Delta is a remarkably fragile natural environment with barrier reefs, as and when they occur, subject to change by tide and storm. IOTA rules require that, in the absence of qualifying islands, the group concerned should be suppressed. One final check will be made on the latest satellite pictures expected shortly following which a decision will be taken and a notice issued.
