



DX INFORMATION

3B9 - Juha, OH1LEG is active as 3B9/OH1LEG from Rodrigues Island (AF-017) until 7 January. He operates holiday style using SSB, RTTY and PSK31 on 160-10 metres. QSL direct to OH1LEG.

5W - Ralph, H44RK will be active as 5W0W from Apia, Samoa (OC-097) from 8 December to 3 March. He will operate SSB and digital modes on 20-10 metres. QSL via NR6M.

5Z - Bertrand, DF3ZS and Tom, DL1QW will be active as 5Z4/DF3ZS and 5Z4/DL1QW from Kenya on 7-20 January. They will operate holiday style on 80-10 metres CW, SSB and RTTY. QSL via home calls. [TNX The Daily DX]

6W - Francis F6BLP (www.f6blp.org) will be active as 6W7SK from Senegal on 4-18 January. He will operate mainly CW on 80-10 metres, and hopefully also on 160m. QSL via home call, direct and bureau, LoTW and eQSL.

7P - After being QRV for 20 months as 9J2RI, Chris, ZS6RI will operate as 7P8RI from Lesotho starting around 17 December. He will be active in his spare time on a 2-week-on/2-week off work schedule. See qrz.com for QSL details.

8Q - Max, HB9TUZ will be active as 8Q7MS from the Maldives (AS-013) from 26 December to 3 January. He will operate SSB on 80-10 metres. QSL via eQSL only ("no direct, no bureau").

9M6 - "Disappointed with the current poor conditions and high noise level at my home QTH", Steve, 9M6DXX will spend the weekend of 8-9 December at a seaside hotel where he will be able to put up vertical antennas by the sea. Look for him to operate SSB only with 400 watts on 80-10 metres, including a part-time participation in the ARRL 10 Meter Contest. He will be checking 80m for Brazil, northern South America, the Caribbean, eastern USA and Canada around 1000-1050 UTC and 2130-2215 UTC on both days. He will also look for northern and western Europe on 80m between 1500 and 1800 UTC. If propagation is not good on 80m, he will try 40m instead. QSL 9M6DXX via MOURX, direct or bureau, and LoTW. Plans are to have two tents on the island, and to operate with deep cycle batteries and generators. Another five-men logistics team will assist the landing and will then camp on the mainland, across from the island, for the entire duration of the




BEST PRACTICES FOR DXPEDITION OPERATING ● "We believe that much of the chaos on the bands during DXpeditions is caused by the operating tactics of the DXpedition operator - this leads to poor operating by DX-Chasers, and therefore to chaos. At a meeting of RSGB, CDXC and GM-DX on October 13th we agreed to strengthen the 'DX Code of Conduct' and to prioritise the DXpedition side. This has now been completed, thanks to Wayne N7NG and 'DX University', and has been renamed 'Best Practices for DXpedition Operating'. Please go to www.dxuniversity.com click on DXpeditioning Tools, then Basic Practices. Each of the 13 points is hyper-linked to some explanatory text". [TNX G3SXW]

DXCC NEWS ● Both 5T0SP (Mauritania 2012) and ZL9HR (Auckland & Campbell Islands 2012) have been approved for DXCC credit.

DXCC ● The deadline for the 2012 DXCC Annual and Honor Roll listings is rapidly approaching. In order to appear in these listings, your submission must be postmarked by 31 December 2012. The current publication schedule for these lists can be found on the ARRL's Awards Blog page (<http://www.arrl.org/awards-blog>). At present, there are 340 current Entities on the ARRL DXCC List; Honor Roll entry level is 331 current Entities.

DXPEDITION OF THE YEAR POLL ● The DX World.net 2012 DXpedition of the Year poll is now open at <http://dx-world.net/>. "This was an incredibly difficult poll to decide on considering so many notable expeditions took place

during the last 12 months. It's conceivable that up to 40 different DXpeditions could have been nominated, however, a short-list of 26 made the poll. In previous years the poll was limited to three or five votes. This year we have decided to allow 'free' votes on as many DXpeditions you wish to select. In addition, to prevent repeat votes, an account must be created using your callsign and QRZ.com listed email address. Once created you will receive an email then you are ready to vote". IARU NEWS ● Two new member-societies have joined IARU. On 1 November 2012 voting was completed on the admission of Federation of Radio Sport of Azerbaijan (Proposal No. 247) and St. Vincent & Grenadines Amateur Radio Club (Proposal No. 248) to IARU membership. With 53 affirmative votes required for approval there were 60 votes in favor of Proposal No. 247 and 61 votes in favor of Proposal No. 248. Accordingly, both proposals were adopted.

IRON HAM CONTEST ● Drawing inspiration from the Ironman Triathlon races, the Araucaria DX Group introduces the WW Iron Ham Contest, a competition that combines the main operating modes (Phone, CW and RTTY) into one single contest to be held on 29-30 December (from 12 UTC on Saturday through 11:59 UTC on Sunday). 

QSL 706T • The QSLing process was stopped on 18 December, in order to avoid the known problems that affect the postal service over Christmas. Shipping will be resumed after 8 January, with plans to clear all of the direct requests (OQRS and traditional) by the end of that month. Bureau cards will follow starting in February. The entire log was uploaded to LoTW in August.

THE CDXC DX ARCHIVE • This project was born out of a proposal, made by Alan, 5B4AHJ/G3PMR to the Chiltern DX Club Committee in early 2011. In his research work for Club Log's callsign database, Alan recognised that there are many DX documents that exist only in paper format, and are thus inaccessible to the majority of interested persons. Alan

proposed that CDXC should set up a DX Archive project, whereby DX documents would be digitised and made freely accessible to all, in a searchable format, via the CDXC web site. The initial phase of this project involved the acquisition and scanning of as many issues of Geoff Watts' (later RSGB's) "DX News Sheet" and "RSGB DX News Magazine" as possible. YASME EXCELLENCE AWARDS • In 2008 The Yasme Foundation (www.yasme.org) established the Yasme Excellence Awards, to be awarded "to individuals who through their own service, creativity, effort and dedication have made a significant contribution to amateur radio. The contribution may be in recognition of technical, operating or organizational achievement as all three are necessary for amateur radio to grow and prosper". The latest recipients, announced on 7 December, are:

- George Fremin (K5TR), Tree Tyree (N6TR), Trey Garlough (N5KO) and Scott Neader (KA9FOX) for their contributions to many infrastructure projects that benefit the ham community at large.
- Mark Spencer (WA8SME), for his instrumental work in the ARRL Teachers Institute and other training efforts, development of PIC microcontroller projects and books for amateurs, and work with leaders in student and scientific teams applying amateur radio to scientific projects and experiments.
- Champ Muangamphun (E21EIC) and Pornchai Semjang (HS2JFW), for leadership in the Thai amateur community, especially during the recent flooding which helped open the door to the new Thai HF licensing and enhanced the stature of amateur radio with the Thai government.
- Tomas Hood (NW7US) and Carl Luetzelschwab (K9LA), for sustained education of the amateur community regarding propagation, solar and geomagnetic physics.
- David Freese (W1HKJ), for creating and maintaining the freeware software package FLDIGI, probably the most widely used digital communication software in ham radio and a frequent gateway for new hams who are more familiar with computer-based communications.
- Dean Straw (N6BV), for his contributions to amateur antenna system design and the development of software tools such as HFTA to optimize system design.
- Peter Martinez (G3PLX) and Pawel Jalocho (SP9VRC), for the development of PSK31, a widely used digital mode entirely invented by amateurs that is enabling many amateurs to successfully use HF with very modest stations.
- Arie Kleingeld (PA3A), Ad Van Ginneken (PA8AD) and Arie Noordzij (PA3AN), for their sustained contributions to the Mercy Ships Project.

The YASME Board of Directors also announced supporting grants to WRTC 2014, the World Wide Radio Operators Foundation, Club Log, the NCDXF Beacon Project, Yasme Scholarships (administered by ARRL) and the Amateur Radio Association of Kosovo (SHRAK). [TNX W6SZN]



ZL9HR • The operation was originally scheduled to be QRV from 28 November. The sailing vessel "Evohe" with the ZL9HR team departed Bluff, on the southern coast of New Zealand's South Island, on the 26th around noon local time. However, bad weather forced the team to shelter in the lee of Stewart Island and wait for conditions to improve. They arrived at Campbell Island around 18 UTC on 30 November, and came on the air at about 04.30 UTC on 1 December using minimum equipment. The following day the full range of masts and antennas were installed. The team could not extend their stay on the island, and went QRT at about 16:00 UTC on 8 December. The decision was based on the weather forecast, as they needed to get favourable conditions for the voyage back to New Zealand. The final log includes 42115 QSOs (almost the 79% equally shared between Europe and North America) with 15226 unique calls. The OQRS on Club Log is now up and running.

IOTA NEWS

- The 2012 IOTA Contest data has now been uploaded to the IOTA database. This means that credit can be obtained for IOTA QSOs where participants submit matching contact details. Cards for these QSOs are not required.
- Updates for the Honour Roll and other annual listings must be sent on or before 31 January. IOTA rules limit inclusion in the listings to those participants who have updated their scores at least once in the preceding five years and have opted to have their scores published. Listing in the 2013 tables will be restricted to those participants who have updated their scores since February 2008.
- IOTA charges, most of which have remained unchanged since 2007, will rise on 1 January 2013. The full list can be seen at <http://www.rsgbiota.org/info/directory/charges-en.pdf>. The new fees will be applied automatically through the charging module to all applications received on or after 1 January. The RSGB regrets the need to increase charges but the current financial climate makes this unavoidable. Applications/updates received before that date will attract the previous charge.



