DX INFORMATION

3B8 - Bob, M0RCX will be active as 3B8/M0RCX from Mauritius Island (AF-049) on 2-27 May. He will operate SSB, CW and digital modes (RTTY, JT65 and PSK) on 40-6 metres. QSL via EB7DX and LoTW. Bureau cards will be sent automatically six months after the operation.

3D2 - Rocco DG5AA, Rich DK8YY and Dieter DL1AWD are active as 3D2RH from Fiji until 4 May. They operate CW, SSB and digital modes on 80-10 metres. QSL via DH7WW, direct or bureau.

5T - Jean, ON8RA has been active again as 5T0JL from Mauritania since 1 March. He operates CW only. See 5T0JL on qrz.com for his QSLing policy and operating habits. Jean has been authorized to use special call sign 5T1MM between 15 and 22 April; look for him especially during the CQ Manchester Mineira DX Contest (19-20 April).

7Q - A large multinational team of 20-24 operators is being assembled for a DXpedition to take place from Malawi between 10 November and 2 December. The call sign will be 7QAA (no second number in the prefix) and the team will be split into two sub-teams: Team One will operate only SSB and RTTY (160-6 metres) on 10-20 November, while Team Two will operate CW only from 21 November to 2 December, including a M/2 entry in the CQ WW DX CW Contest. 

Two callsigns have been issued: for the standard DXpedition operation they will use VK9DLX, while during the CQ WW DX SSB Contest they will use VK9LM (in memory of DJ5CQ, SK since 1995, who was active from Lord Howe Island with this callsign several times in the 1980s and 1990s). Lord Howe can be reached by plane, but the transport capacities on the flight are strictly limited to 14kg per person. Most of the equipment will have to be shipped

from Germany to the island by sea freight, and donations to help offset those costs are gratefully accepted. See www.lordhowe2014.org for further information and updates.



VK9M - After two full days of setting up equipment, VK9MT became active from Mellish Reef with five stations at 04.34 UTC on 30 March. However, "due to the ever worsening weather associated with an impending tropical storm,

the team decided in the interest of safety to end the operation early". Their last night on Mellish Reef "was extremely difficult", as "with continued heavy rain and wind, radio operations were nearly impossible". 

DXCC AND CRIMEA • "Upon request of the CEO, the ARRL Awards committee evaluated the situation at present in Crimea against the DXCC rules. As the interpreter of the rules, the following is the Awards Committee's decision on how to 'count' QSOs with stations operating from Crimea.

Crimea is not a DXCC entity. Neither Russia nor Ukraine is a rare entity and the vast majority of confirmations used for DXCC credit for either entity do not involve Crimea.

DXCC Rule 4 reads: *Confirmation data for two-way communications must include the call signs of both stations, the entity name as shown in the DXCC List, mode, date, time and band. Except as permitted in Rule 1, cross-mode contacts are not permitted for DXCC credits. Confirmations not containing all required information may be rejected.*

A QSL with a call sign issued by the administration of Ukraine and showing the entity name as Ukraine counts as Ukraine.

A QSL with a call sign issued by the administration of Russia and showing the entity name as Russia counts as Russia.

A QSL that satisfies neither condition does not count for either entity". [TNX NC1L]



Final Press Release

Mellish Reef 2014
April 17, 2014

VK9MT Mellish Reef was activated on 30 March at 04:34z with ZL4PW first in the log and went QRT on 4 April at 1353z with JL1MTY closing the log.

Our decision to leave the island didn't come easily; safety was always the first priority. Just as the last QSO was made it became clear we could not remain on the island another day. It was 01:00 (local) when the rain began. The wind was blowing at about 35 - 40 knots; we had water infiltrating the operating tents and the antennas were taking a severe beating. Over the 6 days we were on the island the weather grew progressively worse each day.

After a short meeting the on-island operators decided to QRT and begin packing the equipment in pelican cases for protection. We spent the next several hours packing equipment using head and hand torches.

When the Zodiac arrived for the 6AM shift change we began taking down the antennas and tents. Once the storm was officially declared Cyclone Ita there was no question we made the correct decision.

Our 10 day goal was 80,000 QSOs and as much RTTY as possible. In 5 days we made 40,000 Qs which put us on track for the original target.

The team of eleven operators and five boat crew worked well together. The measure of success isn't how well one follows the plan but instead how we react to the unplanned. The weather required significant plan changes. Until we arrived at the reef the skipper was unable to determine if nighttime travel to and from the reef was possible. As it turned out, because of the many coral heads, the reef could only be travelled during daylight hours when the underwater coral was visible.

We watched Mellish Reef weather for weeks before leaving but Cyclone Ita required us to improvise, adapt and overcome. We knew things would get worse as reports of death and destruction came in from the Solomon Islands.

While disappointed, we are happy to have given ATNOs, band fills and to have put people on the Honor Roll and Top of the Honor Roll.

We appreciate the support from the corporate sponsors, foundations, clubs and the individual donors. When the books are closed we'll provide an accounting to the clubs and foundations.

The team received many e-mails from the global DX community; we thank you for your concern, kind words and understanding.

Logs, QSLs and LoTW:

Our QSL manager Tim M0URX reports he's made great progress with busted and missing calls. ClubLog is up to date with the most current logs, and is updated as problems are resolved.

LoTW will be uploaded at the time this Press Release is distributed.

It is estimated that the actual QSL cards will be in the mail by the end of July.




