On 16 May CQ magazine (www.cq-amateur-radio.com) announced its 2014 Hall of Fame inductees, adding two members each to the CQ DX and Contest Halls of Fame, as well as eight new members of the CQ Amateur Radio Hall of Fame.

CQ AMATEUR RADIO HALL OF FAME

The CQ Amateur Radio Hall of Fame honors those individuals, whether licensed hams or not, who have made significant contributions to amateur radio; and those amateurs who have made significant contributions either to amateur radio, to their professional careers or to some other aspect of life on our planet. The 2014 inductees (listed alphabetically) are:

- **Clifford Berry, W9TIJ**, who helped usher in the computer age as co-inventor of the Atanasoff-Berry computer (or ABC), the precursor of virtually all electronic computers.
- **Warren Bruene, W5OLY**, prolific radio designer and innovator who designed many Collins radios and helped the company introduce single-sideband voice communications.
- **John Huntoon, W1RW**, former ARRL General Manager, QST Editor, helped bring about international allocation of the 30-, 17- and 12-meter bands.
- **Mike Koss, W9SU**, DXer and Dxpeditioner; founder and owner of filter manufacturer ICE (Industrial Communications Engineers); key player in establishment of Indianapolis Motor Speedway Amateur Radio Club, W9IMS; organizer of special event station W87PAX at 1987 Pan American Games in Indianapolis.
- **Nancy Kott, WZ8C**, former Editor of WorldRadio and WorldRadio Online and tireless promoter of Morse Code as U.S. coordinator of the FISTS CW Club.
- **Paul Laughton, N6BVH**, software designer whose accomplishments include developing Apple's disk operating system and Atari's operating system.
- **Ralph Showers, ex-W3GEU**, expert on electronic interference and leader of efforts to set national and international standards for electromagnetic compatibility (EMC). He holds several awards from the American National Standards Institute (ANSI) and the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers (IEEE).
- **Steve Wozniak, ex-WV6VLY and ex-WA6BND**, co-founder of Apple Computers.

CQ DX AND CONTEST HALLS OF FAME

The CQ DX and Contest Halls of Fame honor those amateurs who not only excel in personal performance in these major areas of amateur radio but who also "give back" to the hobby in outstanding ways.

The 2014 inductees to the CQ DX Hall of Fame are:

- **Joe Reiser, W1JR**, a DXer and DXpeditioner since the 1950s, Joe has DXCC Mixed, Phone, CW, Digital and QRP with over 300 entities confirmed for each, along with 13-band Worked All States, 13-band Worked All Continents and CQ's USA-CA All Counties award. Joe is also a pioneer in 432-MHz EME (Earth-Moon-Earth) communications, ran his own antenna manufacturing company (Antennaco) and is a prolific writer and public speaker.
- **David Collingham, K3LP**, a leading DXer and DXpeditioner who is also focused on using amateur radio as an educational tool, at home and around the world. He has equipped a complete station at his hometown elementary school and has taught amateur radio to young people in Iraq, Ethiopia and Rotuma.

The 2014 inductees to the CQ Contest Hall of Fame are:

- **J. Scott Redd, K0DQ**, is already a member of the CQ Amateur Radio Hall of Fame for his service to our nation as an Admiral, Deputy Administrator of the Coalition Provisional Authority in Iraq and the first Director of the National Counterterrorism Center. Scott has always found time within his professional duties for amateur radio and his first love, contesting. He is one of only two people to have won the single-operator category of all of the world's major contests.
- **Ed Muns, W0YK**, is a noted RTTY contester with 9 single-op all-band and one multi-two championships and six world records. Ed is also Director of the CQ World Wide RTTY DX and RTTY WPX Contests, and manager of the North American Sprint RTTY Contest. He is also very active in the Northern California Contest Club and is a past club officer and director.

Formal inductions to the CQ Contest and DX Halls of Fame were scheduled for the Dayton Hamvention®. More detailed descriptions of inductees will appear in the official announcement in the July 2014 issue of CQ magazine.

PARTICIPATION AWARDS FOR WRTC 2014



WRTC 2014, Inc., host of the 2014 World Radiosport Team Championship competition, is pleased to announce the awards that will be available for stations that work the WRTC teams during the competition.

The "WRTC2014 Chase" will run concurrently with the IARU HF Championship beginning on July 12 at 1200Z. The fifty nine WRTC2014 stations will have distinctive callsigns that will be easy to recognize (calls to be announced at a later date).

Activity Awards

Andy Blank, N2NT, director of the WRTC2014 competition committee stressed the importance of off-site participants as part of the competition. "The WRTC teams will be using 100 watts to simple antennas. High activity will make the competition more exciting and help identify the more skilled operating teams. In what other sport can you stay home and still be on the field of play?"

Everyone is encouraged to work the WRTC teams on as many bands and modes as possible. All contacts with WRTC2014 stations will be confirmed by QSL card via the bureau for DX stations and direct to US stations. All contacts will also be confirmed through ARRL's Logbook of the World. As an added incentive, each QSO with a WRTC team counts 5 points for the ARRL Centennial QSO Party.

Any station that appears in all 59 WRTC team logs will be able to download a certificate from the WRTC2014 Web site after the contest. No additional application is necessary.

"Assistant Judge" Award

Scores are expected to be very close among the top teams. Log checking will be an important element of certifying the order of finish for all teams. The WRTC2014 Judging Committee needs as many logs as quickly as possible to assist with the log checking process.

Everyone who submits a log within six hours after the end of the contest will be given the title of "Assistant Judge of WRTC2014." All logs received will be entered into a drawing for one of 25 "WRTC2014 Assistant Judge" hats.

Bronze Awards

Every station that submits a log containing confirmed contacts with the WRTC teams on 30 or more band/modes will be eligible for the Bronze level award. These logs will be entered into a drawing to win one of 10 WRTC2014 bronze medals or one of 50 WRTC2014 mouse pads.

Silver Awards

A Silver medal will be awarded to the first 5 stations from each continent and W1 that have confirmed contacts with all 59 teams regardless of mode. Any other stations that work all 59 teams will be entered into a drawing to win one of 25 WRTC2014 caps.

Gold Awards

Gold medals recognize the highest level of achievement - contacting the WRTC teams on the most band/modes. With 59 teams, 5 bands, and 2 modes, there are 590 possible band/modes available. Gold medals will be awarded to the top 5 band/mode leaders in each continent and W1. In the event of a tie, the order will be determined by earliest completion time.

Eligibility

To earn any of the Bronze, Silver, and Gold awards, participants will be required to submit their contest log within six hours after the end of the contest (by 1800z July 13, 2014). Logs in Cabrillo format meeting the requirements of the IARU HF Championship must be submitted by email to iaruhf@arrl.org and must be acknowledged by the robot. Entrants are encouraged to submit their log immediately after the contest.

Larry Tyree, N6TR, is responsible for managing the WRTC2014 log checking process. "We have less than 24 hours to process and cross-check the logs in order to announce the winners at the Award Ceremony on Monday evening. Receiving as many logs as possible shortly after the end of the contest will help improve the quality of the log checking."

Unlike most on-the-air competitions, all stations are required to use identical antennas from the same geographic region, eliminating all variables except operating ability. Previous WRTCs have been held in Seattle (1990), San Francisco (1996), Slovenia (2000), Finland (2002), Brazil (2006), and Russia (2010). 


