

DX INFORMATION

3B8 - Nigel, G3TXF has been active again as 3B8XF from



Mauritius (AF-049) since 5 March, and will remain there until 24 March. He will participate in the RSGB Commonwealth Contest and in the Russian DX Contest (16-17 March); outside the contests he operates

CW and FT8. QSL via Club Log's OQRS and LoTW. [TNX The Daily DX]

4L - Luc, F5RAV will be active as 4L/F5RAV from Zeda Tkhilnari, Georgia between 26 March and 2 April, including an entry in the CQ WW WPX SSB Contest. QSL direct to home call. [TNX F8REF]

6W - Jean-Louis, F5NHJ (<https://www.f5nhj.fr/>) is QRV again as 6W7/F5NHJ from near Saly, on the Petite Cote of Senegal, from 25 February to 13 March. He operates mainly FT8. QSL via Club Log's OQRS and LoTW.

6W - Elvira, IV3FSG will be active as 6W/IV3FSG from Thies, Senegal from 17 March to 14 April. QSL via Club Log's OQRS, LoTW or via IK3GES. [TNX IK3GES]

6W - Jacques, F6HMJ will be active as 6W7/F6HMJ from Senegal from 19 March to 28 April. He will operate SSB and CW on 80-10 metres. [TNX Les Nouvelles DX]


9M2 - The Malaysian DX and Contest Group will be active on various bands and modes as 9M19TEA from the Cameron Highlands, West Malaysia on 28-30 March. QSL via Club Log's OQRS.

A3 - Masa, JA0RQV will be active as A35JP from Tongatapu (OC-049), Tonga on 16-27 March. In his spare time he will operate CW, SSB and FT8 on 80-6 metres. QSL via Club Log's OQRS, LoTW, or via home call (direct or bureau).

A3 - Grant VK5GR, Oly VK5XDX, Andrew VK5AKH and Steve VK5SFA will be active as A35JT from Tongatapu (OC-049), Tonga from 23 September to 6 October. They will participate in the CQ WW DX RTTY Contest and in



C5 - DH7KU, DK1BT, DL6SAK, DL7DF, DL7UFR and SP3CYY will be active as C5DL from The Gambia on 1-15 April. They will operate CW, SSB and digital modes on 160-10 metres with three stations. QSL via DL7DF, direct or bureau, and LoTW "within 6 months after the DXpedition".

CE0Z - The XR0ZRC DXpedition team to Robinson Crusoe Island, Juan Fernandez (SA-005) [425DXN 1445]



now includes R7AL, RK8A, RL5F, RW9JZ, SP6EQZ and CE1TBN. The first operators might be QRV as early as 9 March, with limited activity until the 14th, when the rest of the team and the main equipment will arrive. Plans are to have four

use special prefixes on 1-30 April: EA stations can sign AM + call area + 70 + suffix (e.g. EA4ZZZ can use AM470ZZZ), EB stations can sign AN + call area + 70 + suffix (e.g. EB4ZZZ can use AN470ZZZ), EC stations can sign AO + call area + 70 + suffix (e.g. EC4ZZZ can use AO470ZZZ).

F - Christian, F5OHH will be active as F5OHH/p from Ile de Groix (EU-048) on 16-23 March. QSL via home call, bureau or direct, and eQSL.

F - Celebrating the 50th anniversary of the ATL Radio Club (F6KBK), special event station TM50KBK will be active on 1-15 April. QSL via F4GTB, LoTW and eQSL.

F - The Charente DX Groupe (www.charentedxgroupe.fr) will be active as TM4G from Ile de Groix (EU-048) on 13-20 April. The team (F4GBD, F5LOW, F5MKN, F5NBQ, F6HKA and ON4ZD) will operate CW, SSB and digital modes on the HF bands. QSL via Club Log's OQRS, or via

FW - Nobby, G0VJG expects to be active as FW/G0VJG from Wallis Island (OC-054) starting on or around 8 May for two weeks, with the possibility of a short side trip to Futuna Island (OC-118). "An important decision to our DXpedition plans has been taken today, which will reflect in extending the initial 3Y0I plans", the team announced on 14 March. "We decided to take more provisions than initially planned. So did we regarding the fuel", because "if weather permits, we plan to stay up to 3-4 weeks at the island itself (excluding sailing and landing time), giving much more chances for ATNOs all over the world". From 425 DX News #1455 (23 March):

The MV "Atlantic Tuna" departed Cape Town around 6 UTC on 19 March, destination Bouvet Island (AN-002). Look for E51DOM/mm to be QRV during the voyage. "If everything goes well", the 3Y0I team says, "we should reach Bouvet around 26 March". Once there, they "will wait as long as necessary for a suitable 'weather window' to proceed with landing on the island. So far, predictions are positive, especially for the end of March". Their camp "will be located some on the glacier at 100 ft next to their landing area in the south-east corner of the island with open view to EU/JA but mountains to the NW (USA) at a distance of 8 kilometers. They will be running 1.3 KW with each of four stations, CW, SSB, FT8 plus one for a CW/FT8 combo". The team "plans to stay at the island at least for 2 weeks, with an option to extend the stay to 3-4 weeks, if weather and other factors permit". "On March 26 the vessel had been approaching a Cyclo-nal storm wandering nearby Bouvet Island", the 3Y0I Press Officer posted to the DXpedition's website. "The captain analyzed the latest weather reports indicating a chance to break through the storm - it hadn't been that strong at that time. Unfortunately, the storm developed and intensified in a matter of an hour. Around 5-6 o'clock GMT, just 70 nautical miles off Bouvet island, the ship has been hit by a series of 11+ meters (36+ ft) tall waves + wind exceeding 83 knots/h (approx. 160 km/h). The fierce oceanic forces swept past the upper deck, taking one of the radars, including VSAT, VHF and HF marine antennas, off the mast and throwing them all overboard. The hit was so hard the vessel tilted as much as 45 degrees". Under such circumstances "the captain of the MV Atlantic Tuna had to take a difficult but responsible decision to take a course back to Cape Town, South Africa".

The 3Y0I DXpedition is not cancelled, though. "Once they reach Cape Town and go through a detailed technical inspection of the vessel", the 3Y0I Team Leader (Dom, 3Z9DX) "will decide when and how the DXpedition will take place again. Repeat: we're definitely talking about rescheduling the expedition to the nearest possible and reliable term, not aborting or suspending our plans". 

CASS AWARD • The annual Cass Awards (<http://www.cassaward.com/>) honour the wisdom and spirit of Cass WA6AUD (SK) and encourage DXpeditions to maximize the number of DXers worked with a Plaque for the single-operator DXpedition that works the most unique callsigns within 2 weeks or less, and a Plaque for the "unlimited" DXpedition that works the most unique callsigns.

Janusz Wegrzyn, SP9FIH has won (for the second year in a row) the 2018 Single-Operator Cass Award "by working 8257 unique stations during his one-man DXpedition to St. Eustatius Island as PJ5/SP9FIH". **Yuris Petersons YL2GM, Kaspars Uztics YL1ZF** and **Girts Budis YL2KL** "worked 18,812 unique stations as 3C0W on Annobon Island, winning the first Unlimited Cass Award and demonstrating an outstanding effort to log as many DXers as possible".

CY0C: SABLE ISLAND 2020 • Permission has been granted for a DXpedition to Sable Island (NA-063) sometime in in autumn 2020. The team for the August 2019 CY9C DXpedition to St. Paul Island (<https://cy9c.com/>) [425DXN 1451] will be the primary makeup of the Sable team. "The permit process took over a year of emailing, phone calls, and furnishing documents. Sable at this point is no longer easily 'permitted' for Ham Radio DXpeditions, as the policies have changed with the change in administration. In fact our permit finally was graciously authorized as a 'one time special use permit'. We believe that it is very probable that permits in the future may be essentially 'nil' for a very long time. Among other policies, visitors to the island are not permitted overnight stays. Thankfully, we have been authorized to stay there for 7-8 days (\$300 per person per day). We are grateful and excited and look forward to meeting the challenge of a sizeable operation as if it were the last one for a very long time".



DXCC YEARBOOK • The 2017 ARRL DXCC Yearbook, which includes the Clinton B. DeSoto Challenge top scorers and the Annual Listing, can be found at <http://www.arrl.org/files/file/DXCC/DXCCYearbook/DXCC%20YEARBOOK%202018.pdf>. The Annual Listing of DXCC membership contains the call signs and credited totals for new awards and endorsements during the calendar year period from 1 January through 31 December 2018. The DXCC Honor Roll includes those who are within 9 entities of the "current" Entity count for Mixed, Phone, CW, and Digital modes. As of 31 December 2018, there were 340 Entities on the DXCC List, and entry level DXCC Honor Roll was achieved at level 331.

IOTA DXPEDITIONER OF THE YEAR 2018 • The inaugural Island Radio Expedition Foundation's (IREF) "IOTA DXpeditioner of the Year" Award will be presented at the 34th DX Dinner, to be held on 17 May at the Marriott Hotel in Dayton (tickets can be purchased at <http://swodxaevents.org/>). The DX Dinner is held in conjunction with the Dayton Hamvention and is sponsored by the Southwest Ohio DX Association (SWODXA). The new award from IREF will join the list of awards presented annually at the DX Dinner, including DXpedition of the Year, DXpeditioner of the Year (DXCC) and the presentation of the CQ DX Hall of Fame inductees. 
IOTA HONOUR ROLL • The 2019 Honour Roll and Annual Listings have been posted on the IOTA website <https://iota-world.org/>: click on PERFORMANCE LISTINGS in the dropdown menu under PROGRAMME INFORMATION. They show the position as at 31 January 2019. The Honour Roll lists the stations with a checked score equalling or exceeding 50% of the total of numbered IOTA groups, excluding those with provisional numbers, at the time of preparation. The Annual Listing lists the stations with a checked score

of 100 or more IOTA groups but less than the qualifying threshold for entry into the Honour Roll. IOTA rules limit inclusion in the listings to those participants who have updated their scores at least once in the preceding five years (i.e. since February 2014) and have opted to have their scores published.



NORTH MACEDONIA • After nearly three decades of disagreement on the name of the country called Macedonia (otherwise known as FYROM, the Former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia), the dispute between Greece (SV) and Macedonia (Z3) was settled in June 2018 with an agreement that the country should rename itself "Republic of North Macedonia" (Republika Severna Makedonija). After the agreement was ratified by both sides, it entered into force on 12 February 2019. DXCC wise, only the Entity name has changed. You will find it listed as "North Macedonia" on LoTW, and as "North Macedonia (Republic of)" in the March 2019 edition of the ARRL DXCC List. The DXCC "country code" number remains 502.

PROPORTION OF MODES USED ON THE AIR • "I've been running some reports on activity uploaded in logs up to the end of December last year", Club Log's Michael Wells (G7VJR) posted to his blog on 10 March. "The total number of QSOs uploaded was quite high - more than any previous year - at 41.3 million QSOs. That's 12% higher than 2017 or 2016 (which were nearly identical at 36.8 million QSO each - and 2015 was 39.8 million). I think that fact is more significant given the ongoing decline of this particular solar cycle, and it's possible evidence of extra activity from FT8 and newly-active amateurs who'd run out of steam on CW and SSB,



but are back to try digital modes". As for the operating habits, "in 2017, 8,000 Club Log users had uploaded at least one QSO with FT8. However, in 2018, that number has risen to 14,200. For comparison, 13,900 users uploaded at least one CW contact, and 18,000 at least one phone (mainly SSB) contact. The total number of active users was just under 22,000 across all modes in 2018". QSL E44YL • Please note that the QSL route for CW QSOs made with E44YL in 2016 is via IK2CKR (direct only). CW QSOs made in 2017 go via IK3GES as usual. [TNX IK3GES]

There are 112 Lloyd and Iris logs, along with two other DXpedition logs (FO0XX, Clipperton Island 1986 and 3D2AM, Conway Reef 1990) as well as three Danny Weil logs (VP2VB British Virgin Islands 1957, HC8VB Galapagos 1960 and FO8AN Clipperton 1960). RSGB COMMONWEALTH CONTEST • The 82nd edition of the Commonwealth (BERU) Contest (<https://berucontest.wordpress.com>) will be held on 9-10 March, from 10 UTC to 10 UTC, on 80, 40, 20, 15 and 10 metres CW. Only operators located within the United Kingdom and Crown Dependencies, Commonwealth or British Mandated Territories are eligible to enter.



T31EU • The final logs have been uploaded to Club Log and the OQRS has been enabled, the team reported on 18 March. T31EU made 39,161 QSOs with 11,832 unique callsigns (30.21%) between 17 February and 5 March.

The most productive bands were 40m with 8812 QSOs (22.5%), 20m with 7716 QSOs (19.7%) and 30m with 7221 QSOs
