

The first helicopter load landed on the island at 18.30 UTC on 7 February; most of the team and 80% of the gear were flown ashore and 3YOX became active in the early UTC morning of 8 February. The rest of the gear and the remaining three team members (NP4IW, K3VN and N4GRN) had to be transferred onto the island a few hours later, but the weather deteriorated and at 23.30 UTC of 9 February they were still on the ship.

The latest information from the team, released at 18.30 UTC of 10 February, is that they now have four stations QRV around the clock, while weather and visibility conditions are still the same.
