Helicopter deployment will continue for a total of three days before the camp is fully established". Look for K1N on "the usual" DX frequencies, listening up, but in some cases, down, for certain parts of the world's band plan. Listen carefully to the instructions of the DXpedition operator. At least one station will be on 20 metres 24 hours/day. 160m and12m will be CW only, and 10m will be SSB only. Other bands will alternate CW and SSB. At least one station will always be on RTTY. The pilots will be N2OO (Chief Pilot), V51B (Africa), JA1ELY (Asia, Zone 25), EY8MM (Central Asia, Zones 17-19, 21-24 and 26), MMONDX (Europe), K2SG (North America), ZL2AL (Oceania), HK1R (South America) and KF5NYQ (Youth Pilot). They will collect reports and suggestions from the various target areas (each pilot's contact information is listed on the DXpedition's website: click on 'Our Team'). The worldwide feedback will be prioritized, summarized and forwarded to the team on Navassa. Pilots will not have access to the logs, so do not ask about busted calls, log entries, etc. Logs will be uploaded several times daily to Club Log. QSL via N2OO, direct or bureau (OQRS on Club Log), and LoTW ("sooner rather than later"). "Some of you have raised a point of concern about two teams possibly activating Bouvet around the same time period", he goes on saying. "I have done my homework on this, and with all data at hand I see no reason to adjust my initial concept. In regard to possible funding for the two efforts, luckily for you, the deserving DXer and the DX Foundations/Clubs, there are mechanisms in place to my of both efforts.

determine the viability and success factors of both efforts. The unique one-man effort over a 3 month time period, will undoubtedly show how this different approach will make more people happy (compared to a multi-operator team, short time period). Have a closer look why. It is in the scope of this project:

- to work as many unique stations as possible: thanks to the 3 month time period, I will be able to work 1 or 2 specific bands exactly for this purpose. The very last interested QRPp station willing to work Bouvet and willing to put the necessary time and effort from his/her side into it, will be able to get in the log;
- 2. to work those stations that need Bouvet on certain bandslots/modes to achieve 9 band clean sweeps;
- 3. to provide SSB, CW and RTTY contacts for those needing certain modes.

For all audiences, I will have plenty of time. It will be the primary reason for me being on Bouvet, making radio contacts, as many as possible. Whether or not there will be two DXpeditions activating Bouvet, all the target audiences (unique/9 banders/modes) will ultimately have a better shot with the 3 month concept. For this approach to be successful, it needs one or two things.

1. Club Log is a great asset to Amateur Radio. However, the Leaderboard function will not be used;

2. I will ask to those who already have Bouvet confirmed on certainbands/modes: only work Bouvet where you need it.

I am confident I can count on the fair play from the deserving DXers to just work Bouvet where they need it. Resulting in being able to work the pileups down to the very last QRP or mobile station and at the same time making the 9 band hams reach their objective.

For those of you who would like to, and are able to contribute to the project upfront, please send an e-mail to bouvet2016[@]telenet.be with the amount you intend to donate.

Again, I do not want/need any money now, there is no PayPal account, it is just your funding intention I need to know at this point in time. The final total on my spreadsheet will tell me whether to go ahead or not. A final thought: 112k out of 250k is not enough to go ahead.



**DXCC RULES CHANGES** • At its 16-17 January Meeting, the ARRL Board of Directors decided to tweak "the DX Century Club (DXCC) rules to clarify and expand their recognition of remotely controlled station technology. It also has added a rule that puts greater ethical responsibility on operators with respect to remotely controlled operation". The following was published on the ARRL's website on 21 January:

The DXCC Rules changes, which affect Section I, subsections 8 and 9, explain and extend how contacts with remotely controlled stations now may be applied toward the DXCC award. As ARRL CEO David Sumner, K1ZZ, explained, the changes are subtle but significant. The modified rules make clear that contacts with legally licensed, land-based, remotely controlled stations count for DXCC, but the control point - the operator's location - of a remotely controlled station no longer has to be land based; the operator can be literally anywhere.

It has always been permitted for a QSO to count for both stations, if either station was operated remotely from a control point within the same DXCC entity," Sumner explained. "Now the location of the operator doesn't matter; the operator could be on the far side of the Moon if he or she could figure out how to remotely control a station on land back on Earth from there." Transmitter location continues to define a station's location, and, for DXCC purposes, all transmitters and receivers must be located within a 500 meter diameter circle, excluding antennas.

Under the old rules, if either station was operated from a control point in another DXCC entity, the contact did not count for DXCC for either station. "This was unenforceable unless someone was transparent about what they were doing," Sumner said.

The Board further adopted a new rule, now Subsection 11 (subsequent rules will be renumbered accordingly), that acknowledges the reality of the technology enabling remote operation, and it puts greater responsibility on individuals when it comes to applying that technology ethically and responsibly.

"Issues concerning remotely controlled operating and DXCC are best dealt with by each individual carefully considering the ethical limits that he/she will accept for his/her DXCC and other operating awards," the new rule states. It adds, in part, "the owner of these achievements needs to be comfortable standing behind his/her award and numbers. Peer attention has always been a part of awards chasing, of course, but in these times with so many awards and so many players, it is more important than even to 'play the game ethically."

Subsection 11 acknowledges that technological advances "add to the difficulty in defining rules for DXCC," but stresses that the intent of the rules is what's important. "It will continue to be up to the operator to decide what types of legal remote control operating he/she will use (if any) to contribute to an operating award," the new rule concludes.

**EP6T** • Club Log's statistics for EP6T show 68,046 QSOs (34199 CW, 28355 SSB and 5492 RTTY) made with 16,780 unique callsigns from 15.05 UTC on 16 January until 03.08 UTC on the 27th. The entire log has been already uploaded to LoTW, and QSL requests are being pre-processed while waiting for the Cards to be printed. **FARALLON ISLANDS** • K6F was active for a very short time on 20 metres SSB from the Farallon Islands (NA-178) on 6 January [425DXN 1235]. "Sorry it was such a short operation", K6EWN says on Facebook (<u>https://www.facebook.com/K6Fislands</u>). "The work we came out to do took more time than expected, thus shortening our play time". QSL via W6TCP.



**INTREPID SPIRIT AWARD** • The Intrepid-DX Group (<u>www.intrepid-dx.com</u>) is pleased to announce the recipient of the 3rd annual Intrepid Spirit Award, made in memory of James McLaughlin, WA2EWE/T6AF (killed in Kabul Afghanistan, on 27 April 2011). This year's award goes to Dmitri Zhikharev, RA9USU to recognize his "outstanding efforts to activate Yemen from 2012 through 2014 as 706T and 702A. Dmitri is largely responsible for fulfilling the need for 70 contacts since 2012. Yemen is a place of much uncertainty and danger. We recognize Dmitri's unselfish acts to activate this challenging and much needed entity". The award will be presented at the International DX Convention, Visalia (CA) on 18 April. [TNX N6PSE]

**IOTA ANNUAL UPDATE** • Updates for the 2015 Honour Roll and other performance tables must be sent on or before 31 January. If postmarked after that date, they will be processed in the normal way but the scores will be held over to the following year's listing. IOTA rules limit inclusion in the listings to those participants who have updated their scores at least once in the preceding five years and have opted to have their scores published. Listing in the 2015 tables will be restricted to those participants who have updated their scores since February 2010. Record-holders who have made IOTA contacts in an IOTA Contest after 2003, can claim credit for them without submitting QSLs, provided that the contact details match, either by manually entering the QSO information on the input form or by uploading a Cabrillo format log. The 2014 IOTA Contest data has now been uploaded to the IOTA database and is available for QSO matching. [TNX G3KMA]

**K1N & DQRM** • Deliberate QRM has been a major hindrance on both ends of the pileups in recent years and is worsening. There is a tab on our website (<u>www.navassadx.com</u>) where you can help us identify QRMing stations. This tab will not be active until the DXpedition comes on the air. By entering the data requested, and if enough data is entered, even with crude or rough beam headings, a 'heat map' can be produced with mathematical analysis of the data. This was covertly tested during the recent FT4TA Tromelin DXpedition and even with limited data input, several deliberate QRMing stations could be identified within a very small area! Again, the more data that is provided the more accurate the 'heat' can be put on offending stations. If we do experience QRM, we have planned tactics to minimize the malicious interference. Hint: listen, listen and listen more for us... we might try to 'wiggle' out of it! We will also try hard to keep our splits narrow as possible to avoid annoying non-DXers who have been known to 'bother' a pileup".

Eight out of ten places are occupied by the same DXCC Entities listed for 2013 and 2012, in four cases with just a slight varition in ranking. Tromelin Island is still listed, because the survey closed on 15 October and FT4TA became active on the 30th. Marion Island was in 8th place and now has moved down to the 19th (thanks to the activities by ZS8C, ZS8Z and ZS8A); Amsterdam and St. Paul was in 4th place and now - not surprisingly, after FT5ZM - is no longer listed among the 100 Most Wanted Entities. ZS8 and FT5Z have been replaced by Kingman Reef and Palmyra & Jarvis, which last year were in 12th and 11th place respectively. 
engraved crystal globe. The latest recipients, announced on 5 January, are:
