

3DA - Pista, HA5AO [425DXN 1457] will be active as 3DA0AO from eSwatini (Swaziland) between 16 September and 1 October. He will operate mainly CW and FT8 on 80-10 metres, and will participate in the All Africa DX Contest (21-22 September). See

EI - The Galway Radio Experimenters Club (EI4GRC) will be active as EI100ABC for the Alcock & Brown Centenary Festival to be held in Clifden, Co. Galway on 11-16 June. The festival celebrates the 100th anniversary of the first non-stop transatlantic flight made in June 1919 by British aviators John

Alcock and Arthur Brown from St. John's, Newfoundland to Clifden, Ireland. QSL via EI2II.



Soon after the first operation, the permanent lighthouse keeper Karl-Erik, OJOMA also hit the airwaves. A stream of DXpeditions followed. These later DXpeditions kept OJO a dream location for hundreds and hundreds DXpeditioners, allowing them to discover the light and become performers within the admired DXpedition industry.

The Northern California DX Foundation (NCDXF) had helped OJOMA become a household DXer and later a great ham as OHONA, while later-on, the NCDXF and OHDXF assisted the Finnish Light House Society (FLS) to restore the beauty of this remote DX outpost between Aland Islands and Sweden.

The 2019 season will see many veteran DXpeditioners returning to their dreamland to provide OJO QSOs to those who deserve - the Deserving! Their return will enable them to once again experience the camaraderie and friendship

only a true DX location can provide. Adding to the crew will be upcoming OH and SM youngsters! The invited guests of the season are: CO8DM, E21EIC, E20NKB, W5XU, DS4EOI, JH4RHF, JE6HIB, PB2T, DJ9ZB, DL3DXX, DJ4MF, DL5SE, SM0W, SA0LAT and others. They will be hosted by OH3WS, OH3JR, OH2BH, OH2TA, OG2M, OH2PM, OH4EA, OH6FSG, OH6LSR, OH6KV, OH6OK, OH6NJ and the younger vintage of OH2FB, OH1UBO and OH3UAF.



WSJT-X 2.1.0-RC7 • A seventh candidate release ("RC7") of WSJT-X 2.1.0 has been available for download and use by beta testers since 3 June. Links to installation packages for Windows, Linux, and macOS are available on the WSJT-X web page. Please note that the new version of the FT4 protocol in RC7 is not backward-compatible with that in earlier releases. If you wish to use FT4 after 3 June or to take advantage of other recent program corrections or enhancements, you should use WSJT-X 2.1.0-rc7 (and stop using RC5 or RC6). RC7 will be inoperable during the ARRL June VHF QSO Party (8-10 June) or ARRL Field Day (22-23 June), but will be available for beta-testing through 21 July, then it will permanently cease to function. If all goes according to plan, by that time there will be a General Availability (GA) release of WSJT-X 2.1.0.

Following the decision to split the 5 yearly review of the IOTA list into two parts, we announced the first tranche of six new IOTA groups at the RSGB Convention, Milton Keynes on 14 October 2018 (see Management News item of the same date). The plan mentioned at the time was to add the second tranche at Ham Radio Friedrichshafen in June 2019. At the event's IOTA Forum on Saturday, 22 June this took place with the announcement of a further six new groups. The review has now completed its work; the next one is scheduled for 2024.



AS-206 JA0, 1, 2, 7 Honshu's Coastal Islands East, Japan (qualifying islands to be added from Directory for these prefixes)

New 'remote island group'. This island was previously part of OC-066 Tuamotu Archipelago but is separated from the other islands in this large group by at least 154 km. There have been some four previous operations.

Tatakoto will be deleted from OC-066 Tuamotu Archipelago without any change to the latter's group name or co-ordinates.

OC-299 V6 Yap East group, State of Yap, FSM (=Elato, Lamotrek, Olimarao, Pikelot, Satawal, West Fayu)

07°15-08°15N 145°40-147°45E

New 'remote island group'. These islands were previously part of OC-132 East Yap group but are separated from the remaining islands in that group by at least 160.5 km. There has been no known previous amateur radio activity.

These islands will be deleted from OC-132 East Yap group which will now consist of Eauripik, Faraulep, Gaferut, Ifalik and Woleai and be renamed as Yap Centre group. Its new coordinates will be $6^{\circ}35-9^{\circ}20N$ $142^{\circ}55-145^{\circ}40E$.

OC-300 T31 McKean and Nikumaroro Atolls, Phoenix Islands, Central Kiribati, Kiribati (=McKean, Nikumaroro)

02°30-05°00\$ 173°00-174°50W

New 'remote island group'. These islands were previously part of OC-043 Phoenix Islands but are separated from the remaining islands in that group by at least 230 km. There has been no known previous amateur radio activity.

These islands will be deleted from OC-043 Phoenix Islands which will now consist of Birnie, Enderbury, Kanton, Manra, Orona and Rawaki. The latter's new coordinates will be 02°30–05°00S 170°25–173°00W.

SA-101 CE0 Alejandro Selkirk Island, Juan Fernandez Archipelago, Chile (=Alejandro Selkirk) 33°35-33°55S 080°35-081°00W

New 'remote island group'. This island was previously part of SA-005 Juan Fernandez Archipelago but is separated from the remaining islands in that group by some 159 km. There has been no known previous amateur radio activity.

This island will be deleted from SA-005 group which will now consist of Robinson Crusoe and Santa Clara and be renamed as Juan Fernandez Archipelago (Robinson Crusoe Island). Its new coordinates will be 33°30–33°50S 078°40–079°05W.

These new groups have provisional numbers. This means that they will need to be confirmed by an operation taking place after 22 June 2019 that meets the 1000 QSO and other normal validation requirements. Only after confirmation of the group number will credit for past operations be considered.

The addition of these six groups takes the total of groups that have confirmed or provisional IOTA numbers to 1172. Of these 1131 have seen activity, the remaining 41 have not. The number of unnumbered groups remains at 33. A number of these will be withdrawn in due course to keep within the programme cap of 1200 groups set long ago by the Management Team as a firm policy decision.


